### 30 Producers Of Grass Seed Hold Meetings

JEROME, March 16—Thirty grass seed producers from Jerome county met at the county courthouse Tuesday afternoon to discuss the various management practices required for grass seed production. The discussion was led by Donald Douglas, manager of the Aberdeen grass nursery. Douglas was assisted by Harry Cowman, farm superintendent. The seed is being raised under the north Idaho district seed production program. Foundation seed has been obtained from the soil conservation service nursery at Aberdeen and is furnished to farmers free of charge. Most of the seed will be planted last spring, although some was planted last September. This will be the first seed year.

Douglas said that to get a good yield seed plots have to be fertilized with nitrogen fertilizer annually. In addition to fertilizer needs, the plots should be kept free of weeds, he said. Douglas encouraged irrigating the grass plots immediately after seed harvest, noting that this will encourage regrowth that could be used profitably as pasture. For harvesting the seed, the nursery is recommending the use of a binder and stationary separator. If the binder is equipped with catch pans and canvas, enough seed will
