Jerome Landmark Is Moved to Make Room for New Hospital

JEROME, March 20—The shepherd estate, widely known throughout Magic Valley landscaping, is no more. The grounds have become a building site, as workmen on bulldozers remove trees and shrubs and other workmen prepare to move the house from its foundation to a new location on seventh avenue west to make way for the new Jerome Memorial hospital.

The home was built in 1921 by the late R. E. Shepherd, a man who did much in the development of the northside tract. Shepherd came to Idaho in 1913 from Billings, Mont., as manager of the North Side Land and Water company. He first lived at Minner, but in 1916 he moved to Jerome and took up quarters in the North Side Inn. That same year his wife and daughters moved from Billings to join him at the inn, where they lived for several years. From the inn the Shepherds moved to what they called the "Chicken Coop," which was part of a lumber yard that stood where the Jerome county courthouse now stands.

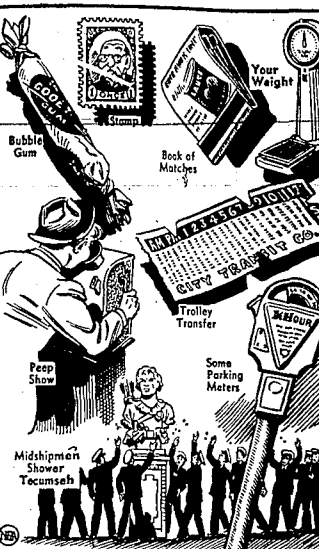

The present claim of the education ministry had been cleared out of funds and overlaid with political appointees and that other government department treasures were bare.

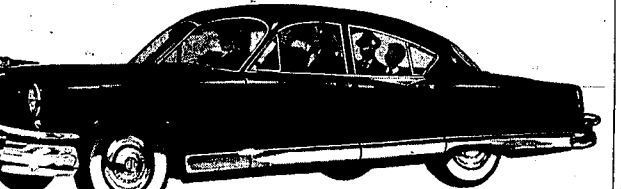

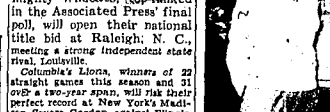

Literary relations in North America are on the upgrade and Ducks Unlimited, the wildlife conservation organization, is taking rightful credit for a good portion of the success of the association.

We have a substantial organizational set-up for Ducks Unlimited, but the groups activities in the Gem state do amount to a drop in the bucket as compared to other states. However, most all of this slack is taken up through the work of organized sportsmen clubs affiliated with the Idaho Wildlife Federation.

In our books Ducks Unlimited ranks right at the top of sportsmen's organizations. It was formed back in 1925 when droughts and draining wetlands in the agricultural provinces of Canada had reduced the North American waterfowl population to a point where Government officials were powerless to do anything about it. Hence nesting and breeding grounds were located in Canada. U. S. tax monies could not be spent for work on foreign soils, so sportsmen terminated not to lose their fall shooting, handed thought and tossed in their own money.

According to the records, wildlife sanctuaries in Canada are far more populated and economically staggered by the depression, didn't have much money to spend on conservation. Today, 16 years later, Canada is dotted with many new lakes and thousands upon thousands of acres and goes on being seen winging their way south in the winter. The waterfowl population has increased again, although it has not reached former high levels.

During the years of its growth, Ducks Unlimited has collected approximately \$8,000,000 from American sportsmen and has invested more than \$2,500,000 in the reclamation of nesting and breeding grounds. It has built 307 huge projects in Canada. Some of these cover thousands of acres and consist of many dams, spillways and ditches.

Many of the nation's best known sportsmen, who are sportsmen's nation without pay and delay their own expenses, judge ducks and expenditures of the group.

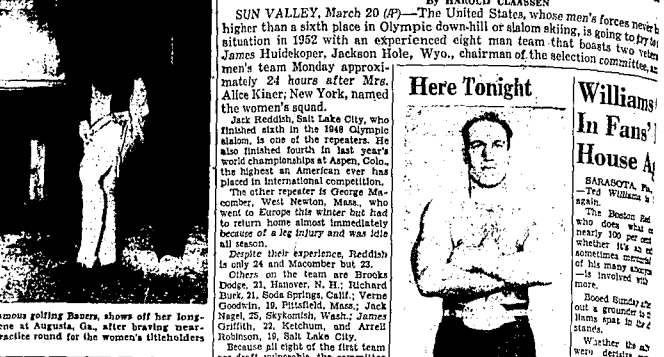

PARIS, March 20 (AP)—The French cabinet decided today at a 12 noon emergency meeting in 12 hours to order striking railroad, electricity and gas workers back to work. The cabinet authorized the ministers of transport and of commerce and industry to take "all necessary measures" to end the nation's most serious labor crisis in more than two years.

The ministers were told to keep Paris suburban trains and electricity and gas services functioning, even requisitioning workers, if necessary. Workers disobeying the order to work will be liable to heavy fines and prison terms.

An estimated 50,000 workers were on strike, subways, railroads, buses and electricity and gas service in Paris and its suburbs were crippled. The strike movement threatened to spread throughout France.

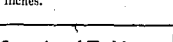

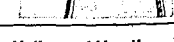
