NEW WEST, Fla., March 31 (AP)—The United States has doubled the size of its armed forces since the start of the Korean war and its strength now exceeds 2,900,000 men, the Little White House revealed today.

President Truman said "this tremendous gain in our strength"—achieved at an all-time record rate—"has been made necessary by the lawless aggression of communist forces in Korea and by the menace of still further communist attacks against other free nations."

This first public disclosure of America's current armed might was made in an exchange of telegrams between Mr. Truman and Defense Secretary George C. Marshall.

Marshall informed the President that the buildup in the past nine months has proceeded at a rate more than twice as fast as the buildup started in June, 1940, following the fall of France, and more than three months after Pearl Harbor.

Top War II Role  
As of today, he said, U. S. strength exceeds 2,900,000, a figure that was not attained in World War II until the end of the conflict in August, 1945.

Mr. Truman served notice on Russia that the United States will not be a party to any agreement which would curtail its freedom of action in peace with other free nations to establish and maintain world peace.

Protection of Freedom  
"The armed forces we are building," he said in his reply to Marshall, "are for the purpose of which our factories, farms and mines are turning out goods and services."

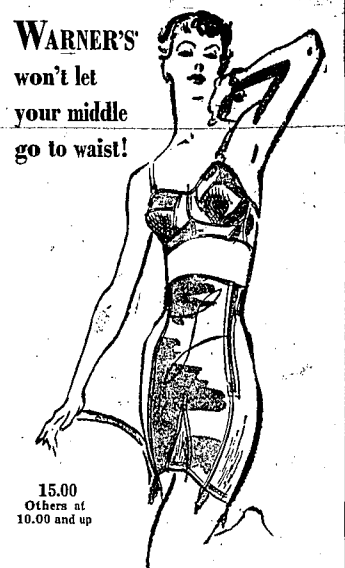

## BRITAIN TRADES WITH REDS

When the United Nations belatedly dubbed Red China an aggressor in Korea, two courses were proposed in the final resolution. One called for continued efforts to attain a peace in the peninsula, the other for possible sanctions against the communists.

Enough time has passed to make it plain the Chinese do not intend to seek a settlement on any reasonable terms. Their price for peace is intolerable; they want us to get out and give them the fruits of aggression.

The chief obstacle has been, and will be, Generalissimo Chiang's animosity to the tattered shreds of empire, the British want to hang onto the lucrative trade they've been doing with red China.

First of all, though they have recognized red China, the fever has not been recognized. The British have been kept unceremoniously colling their heels for about a year.

Secondly, this practical acceptance of red China when translated into trade, spells materials for the Chinese that directly or indirectly support the red war machine in Korea.

The issue is moral, just as the naming of China an aggressor was basically a moral problem. And Britain and many others who wish to do business as usual with a criminal aggressor nation are falling short of their obligations as members of a world community rooted in moral standards.

With this veto of the bill to legalize pari-mutuel betting on horse racing under a county option plan, Gov. Len Jordan has held true to his announced opposition to legalized gambling.

Since the start of his campaign for election, Governor Jordan has been outspoken against unnecessary spending in state government, inefficiency in the state highway department, the gambling interests, and the invasion of Idaho and other irregularities which have been apparent for a number of years.

While the legislature carried out the governor's program almost in its entirety, it's to his credit that he has seen fit to veto the few questionable actions which slipped through the assembly.

In killing pari-mutuel betting, the governor very definitely took the proper action. Now that the nation-wide investigation into racketeering is opening the people's eyes, it becomes all too apparent that the gambling interests have been operating behind the scenes in this attempt to establish pari-mutuel betting not only in Idaho, but throughout the land.

Even in vetoing the so-called 75 per cent school transportation bill, as he warned the legislature he would, the governor has served notice on the education forces of Idaho that the administration of their affairs must "not penalize thrift and efficiency and place a premium on waste and extravagance."

Although the governor has been subjected to bitter criticism as the result of various legislative actions having to do with school matters, time will tell whether or not the state ends up with a better school system as a result, with the people actually getting more real education for their money.

At one time the legislature put it just the other way: "During the heat of it all the school interests had the governor and the state legislature on the hook. Now it's the state board of education."

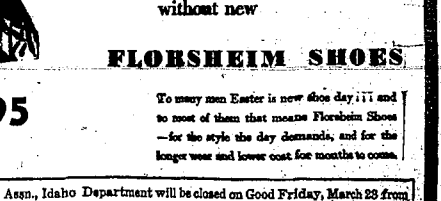

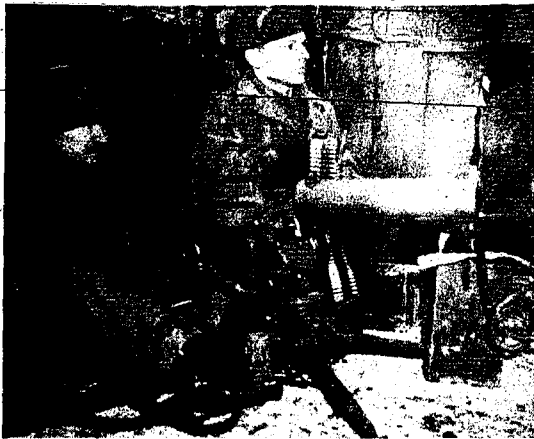

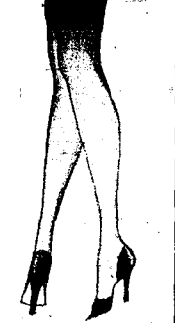

### Basin's Boom For Building Not Slacking

SEATTLE, March 21.—Building permits issued in five of the six Pacific northwest states during February exceeded those of February, 1934. The Construction News Bulletin reports.

Permits in the six states last month totaled nearly \$27,000,000, a 22 per cent increase over the preceding February.

Oregon had the greatest gain—45 per cent. Idaho showed a 33 per cent increase. Washington 21 per cent, Utah 14 per cent and Wyoming 3 per cent.

The only decrease was in Montana where permits last month totaled \$71,220 against \$127,350 a year ago. Idaho's total last month was \$1,311,000, compared with \$1,011,000 the previous February. Utah's was \$2,484,645 compared with \$2,659,712.

Of the top 10 cities, two—Salt Lake City and Ogden—were from Utah and one—Boise—from Idaho. The Salt Lake City permits last month were listed at \$1,623,245, a decrease from the \$1,944,250 of February, 1934.

Ogden's last month total was \$1,154,200, more than three times greater than the \$340,250 of the corresponding period last year. Boise's total of \$293,335 last month was nearly double the \$299,505 in permits granted in February of last year.

Editor Walter A. Averill of the Bulletin said the increase in building permits for the 10th successive month indicated that the western building boom was continuing despite government construction restrictions.
