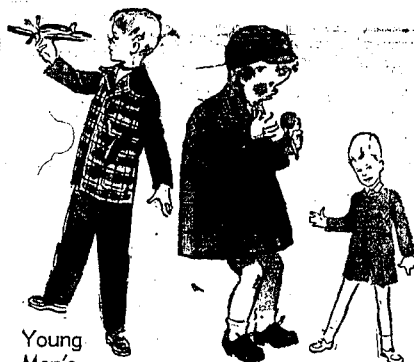

And certainly, the action of students at Lewiston in handing the governor a flag was unadvised, for and really done to poor taste. These trainings to teachers in our democracy should be better balanced. In a note presented at yesterday's session of the lend-lease talks, the Soviet government also took the position that this country does not respect the merchant and naval ships in its accelerated defense program.

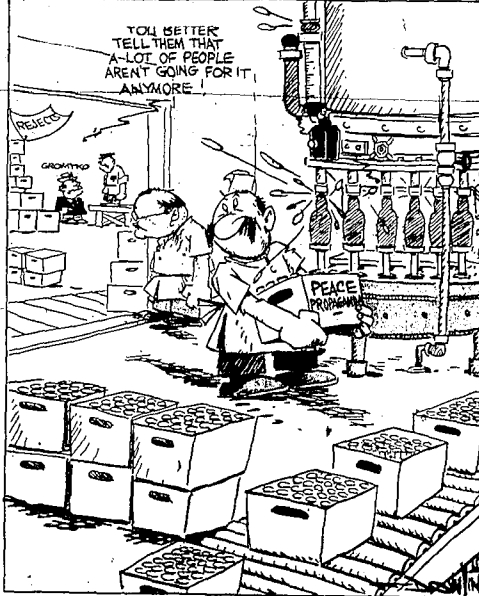
The note said the United States has sold surplus ships to several South American and other countries recently.

Crime Probe Query Power Is Explained

WASHINGTON, March 22.—How much authority do congressional investigators like the Kefauver committee have to demand that a character like Frank Costello tell how much he is worth?

And how much right do witnesses have to refuse to answer such questions? Precedents stretching back through more than 400 years of American and British law give Kefauver committees broad authority to get answers to questions even indirectly pertinent to the matter under investigation. Their powers are far greater than those of courts bound by strict rules of evidence.

Protected by Courts But the courts, on the other hand, protect witnesses against invasion of constitutional rights. The courts have the final say when a witness and a committee get into a conflict that leads to actual prosecution of contempt proceedings. The courts decide in any particular case depend on the peculiar circumstances of that case.

The Kefauver committee lost its only contempt case that so far has gone to trial. A Chicago gambler named Harry Russell refused to answer some 60 questions on grounds of possible self-incrimination—that is, that in effect he was being asked to testify against himself and that his answers might lay him open to prosecution for violation of various laws. A federal judge here ruled that Russell was within his constitutional rights in refusing to answer.

Not Specific In the Costello hearings in New York, the underworld figure and his attorney did not make any specific plea of self-incrimination. They stood on a refusal on unspecified constitutional ground. They did not say whether this refusal to tell his worth was connected with the fact that Costello's income taxes are being investigated by the treasury. A federal law specifies that nothing a person says in a congressional hearing can be used against him elsewhere—except in perjury prosecutions—but the courts have held that this does not bar a refusal based on self-incrimination under certain circumstances.

Hike Forecast On Beer Cost If Tax Upped

BOISE, March 22 (UP)—It's goodbye to the 10-cent brew in Idaho if congress approves the proposed changes in alcoholic beverage taxes. That's the concern in several Boise beer-dispensing establishments.

Idaho already has the heaviest state beer tax of 10 western states. The \$1.10 tax per 31 gallon barrel in addition to the 85 cent barrel tax levied by the government. One bar owner summed it up this way: "Under the new federal levy, the tax would go up 50 per cent, or 112. One bar owner summed it up this way: 'Might as well quit. It should have gone up a long time ago.'

In comparison with Idaho's \$3.10 tax on beer, California and Wyoming impose only a 25 cent per barrel tax. The nearest competitor, Oregon's \$1.30 per barrel levy, Utah has a \$1.10 tax, but imposes a \$1 fee on each beer—the stout stuff that comes out in the spring.

Others Affected Not only the beer drinkers will feel the pinch of the contemplated hike in alcoholic beverage taxes. The levy on distilled spirits will go up \$3.10 per cent, or from \$4 to \$12 a proof gallon. That means that the bottle of bonded stuff which now sells for \$6.50 in Idaho will cost at least \$18.56. The Chateau Scotch whiskey, which sells for \$3.60 a fifth at the present time, will cost about \$7.46.

Russia Girds Workmen for Ike Sabotage

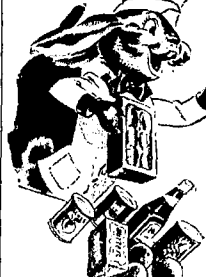

Admissions of Shovel Bandit Swell Record

SPOKANE, March 20 (AP)—The "swell record" of the shovel bandit who stole just for the thrill and police records today.

Since his arrest Saturday night, Dean Stanley Woods, a 36-year-old janitor, has confessed to 244 burglaries committed since last September.

Woods was known as the shovel burglar because he used a borrowed shovel to pry open windows to enter his victims' homes. He would raise the shovel as the alarm rang.

Tossed Away Look
He kept some of his loot, but much of it was tossed away, often near the house where he had stolen it.

Detective Capt. W. H. Cor said Woods often left a trail of jewelry for two blocks after he had entered a home. Once he threw away a \$1000 jade necklace, but kept a pair of mittens.

Frontal Work
"It was a parade with him," said Cor. "He took pride in his work. He studied the police and how they work."

Officers who arrested him said he was by far the best professional burglar ever known in Spokane.

Cor said Woods' home in Idaho had been arrested nine times previously in Idaho and Wyoming on burglary charges.

Solution

BOISE, March 20 (AP)—Voters who want to mark their ballots for candidates in both parties at primary elections will be dignified in future balloting.

John A. Jordan, has signed a bill providing for a perforated ballot to be used in the primary. One side of the ballot will name candidates of one major party, while the other side will be for officers of the second major party. Voters will have their choice of marking one side or the other, then tear the ballot down the perforation and putting the chosen one-half into the ballot box.

Danger Down In New Type Of Penicillin

MALDEN, Mass., March 20 (AP)—A new penicillin has become available for the public.

It has about the same range of activity against germs as that of the old drug. But it causes no allergic reactions, side reactions that have made some "penicillin cures" almost as bad as the disease for which they were taken.

The penicillin used today by American doctors in treating bacterial infections and types of venereal disease is known as penicillin G.

Onion Flavor
The new product is known as penicillin O. The "O" was taken on to the name because the penicillin has a scent of an onion flavor.

The onion flavor results from the use of a new precursor, or agent that stimulates the production of the mold drug in culture. While penicillin has been synthesized, the American drug manufacturers have found it can be made in natural form faster and cheaper than by a synthetic process.

Worked as Team
The scientists worked as a team in developing penicillin O, but have gone many steps further and now have the drug on an "assembly line" basis. It will be somewhat higher in price than penicillin G, until production is stepped up.

It is now estimated that about 20 per cent of those persons who are given the G-type of penicillin have side reactions, allergic reactions such as hives, rash, a breaking out of the skin, in some cases the reaction has been so bad that use of the drug had to be abandoned. The reactions in many cases interfered with the treatment of gonorrhea, and more serious diseases such as syphilis.

Wary

MALDEN, Mass., March 20 (AP)—Ernest A. Minor, 68, apparently has now acquired a bank in a safe place to keep his money.

Ten years ago, about the time the United States entered the war, he withdrew \$500 from a bank and buried it "for safekeeping" near his home. Then he headed for Orlando, Fla.

Minor came back from Florida this week, dug up the money he had buried in three sealed jars and returned it to the bank for safekeeping.
