### New Aid for Cancer Case Is Explained

CHICAGO, March 27 (AP)—Twenty patients who have been marked for death today have shown marked improvement after treatment with a new type of cancer-fighting drug called "M-2" and part of Monday's "two breaks" near Minnesota.

A guarded but optimistic disclosure of the tests was given by Dr. C. Ivy, cancer authority and a vice president of the University of Illinois. He reported to a group of cancer specialists.

Twenty-two patients were selected for treatment with Krebsolin. One patient had leukemia and did not respond to the treatment. Another patient failed to report for further treatment after her first injection. Eight of the group have died, but life apparently was prolonged in some of these cases. The others lived one to 12 months after their first injection. All of the patients given Krebsolin were either in the terminal (hopeless) cases or had cancer which could not be treated successfully by surgery or X-rays, he said.

Improvement noted

In addition to reduction in size of tumors and metastasis, or secondary growths spread from the first tumor, patients noted a decrease in pain, improvement of appetite, and improvement in a general health condition. It is an important step in that direction. It merits a thorough clinical study and evaluation.

### Six Residents of Heyburn Stay in Mud Over Night

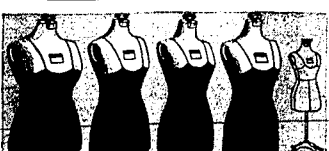

The party returned to Heyburn Monday afternoon. All were tired and hungry but none the worse for their experience.

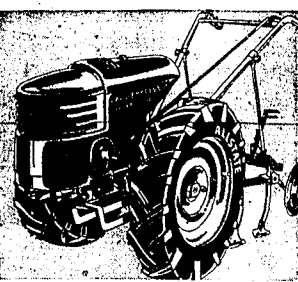

### Woman Accepts \$875,000 in Cash In Huge Estate

DENVER, March 27 (AP)—Mrs. A. P. Dickey accepted \$875,000 in cash today in the \$1,275,000 estate of her husband, George H. Dickey, late millionaire oilman. She had supported herself recently by working as a waitress while fighting a court battle for a share of his estate.

Dorothy Dickey, daughter of Walsh awarded her \$1,275,000 last autumn as her share of Dickey's estate. That was exactly the amount the \$2,500,000 value put on the estate. Attorney for Dickey's estate appealed the district court decision to the state supreme court.

But yesterday the attorneys said they would withdraw their appeal if Mrs. Dickey would accept \$875,000 in cash.

She agreed, and relinquished all claim to the estate.

Mrs. Dickey has married her former husband's chauffeur, William E. Dickey.

### Details of Red Spy Training Read at Trial

ZBORNEJ, Yugoslavia, March 27 (AP)—Details of spy training of a network of Soviet-directed spy agents were portrayed by the prosecution at the treason trial of persons accused of being spies for Hungary.

The details emerged during the reading of a 12,000-word indictment and a seven-hour examination of Rado Marjanovic, a pilot-sized former captain who pleaded guilty to espionage. The country entered the service of Hungarian intelligence.

4 Others Charged

He went on trial before a military tribunal with four others.

The trial in the bleak courtroom was the first time since the war that a member of the army had been brought before an open court for public prosecution.

The prosecution asserted the trial would demonstrate to the public the large scale organization of Soviet-directed spy schools in eastern European countries.

War II Hero

Marjanovic, twice wounded in World War I, was decorated with the Order of the Star, decorated, told in a dull unemotional voice how he was recruited and trained after being freed from a Budapest prison.

The trial was given the heat of good and was required to get into good physical shape for his spy activities.

He had been in 1948 for activity in support of the Communist revolution denouncing Tito, and went to Moscow. He was arrested by the police last November as a spy. He faces a possible death sentence.

### Iran Holding Nine More of Rebel Group

**TEHRAN, Iran, March 27 (AP)—**Nine more members of a Canadian Molester sect were under arrest today as police claimed to have foiled a plot to assassinate the military governor of this uneasy middle east capital.

Arrests were announced last night a few hours after martial law was clamped on sections of the British-occupied oil fields of southern Iran in the face of mounting strikes.

Arrests were made in the area of the strongly nationalist Petayan Islam, the terrorist group that claimed responsibility for the slaying of Premier Ali Razmara March 7, 1951.

Police said they plotted the death of Gen. Abdul Hossain Heikal, appointed military governor and police chief in Tehran when martial law was proclaimed in the capital last week.

A high official said the plot was uncovered Thursday night when Heikal's adjutant nabbed two men armed with revolvers during a visit to the military governor's home. Heikal was not at home at the time.

The official said the confessed plot and led authorities to the group's hideout, where seven others were arrested.

A list of 40 Iranians, including ministers in Razmara's cabinet and high officials, was found in the hideout, this source said.

**Seek Oil Control**

Fedayan Islam has been clamoring for nationalization of Iran's oil industry, including the holdings of the British-controlled Anglo-Iranian Oil company.

Nationalization has been voted by the Iranian parliament but has not yet gone into effect. Razmara had opposed the move.

Spreading strikes by oil workers seeking higher pay brought repressive government action against the law to seven places in the southern oil fields.

### Production of Newest Tanks Begins Today

**WASHINGTON, March 27 (AP)—**The first new tanks to be designed for the army since World War II was to begin rolling off the production line today—three months ahead of contract schedule.

Called the Walker Bulldog, after Gen. Walton H. Walker, who was killed in Korea, it is classed as "light." It weighs 23 tons and has a new high muzzle velocity 76 millimeter gun. It has a speed of 40 miles an hour.

The army said it is being produced by the Cadillac division of the General Motors corporation in an armoured tank plant at Cleveland, O. The contract set July 1 as the target date for first production.

In the preparation stage, to be produced by the Chrysler corporation. Military leaders say this tank, which carries a T-41 and the Patton medium tank will comprise a family of American tanks which will be unbeatable.

The Patton, now performing service in Korea, is a 47½ ton vehicle, with a 90 millimeter gun.

### Work Started On Project at 'Atomic Plant'

RICHLAND, March 27 (AP)—Construction of a \$4,500,000 reactor laboratory, consisting of seven key buildings, is under way at the Ford atomic work. General Electric officials announced today.

Work is expected to be completed by the end of 1937.

Contracts have been awarded for construction of two of the seven buildings. One contract for over \$1,000,000 has been let to the Standard Construction company, Seattle, for construction of the health instrument control and development building.

Other buildings to be constructed are the radioisotope laboratory, the pit technology, library and files, and laboratory supply.

Many of the present labs are temporary frame structures built in 1934 and 1935.

SA FRANCISCO, March 27 (AP)—Billy Cook, ailen and embezzler, today began serving a 200-year term for the murder of five children in a family of five.

Cook, 22, arrived yesterday from Oklahoma City, where he was sentenced last week for murdering the Carl Mosser family, a wood, Ill.

He was brought out in a double-drummer guarded by three officers. During the two-day trip he was chained like an animal. He wore handcuffs, leg irons and a collar around the seat about his middle, like an airplane safety belt.

### 'Miss Idaho' Gets \$500 Scholarship

BOISE, March 27 (AP)—A \$500 scholarship at the College of Idaho was offered today for the young lady chosen as "Miss Idaho" of 1935.

The scholarship was donated by Mrs. and Mrs. J. R. Binquet as the top award to be presented to the "Miss Idaho" who will be chosen at the state finals in Boise June 27-29.

Announcement of the scholarship was made by General Chairman Hob Strawn, who also revealed that five service clubs and schools already have accepted a contest franchise and are planning local contests to pick representatives who will compete at the state finals. These are Idaho State college, Postville, Boise, Caldwell, Nampa and Rex. Strawn said the deadline for accepting franchises is April 15.

John Trainor, Knotty Pine motel, will enclose the space between two existing cabins in the motel unit at 1833 Kimberly road. Estimated cost is \$1,000.

### Highway Project Bid Openings Set

BOISE, March 27 (AP)—Highway projects in Boundary and Bonneville counties will be opened to bidding by contractors April 13 by the Idaho Highway department.

The work includes constructing the roadbed and surfacing 3,665 miles of Idaho Falls-Atlanta road in Bonneville county, and stockpiling gravel near Copeland and Moyie Springs in Boundary county.

The department awarded a \$13,400 contract to the E. J. Stanley and E. J. Stanley Construction company, Boise, for constructing the road and surfacing the Latta cutoff in Gem county.

### Full Use of Boise Base Not Planned

BOISE, March 27 (AP)—Sen. Herman Welker, R., Ida., last night informed city officials that the Gown field will not be reactivated except "in event of a real shooting war."

Although the air force recently said the base would be reactivated on a temporary basis, it did not give any dates for possible reactivation.

The Idaho 100th national flight squadron, going into federal service April 1, is scheduled to continue training at this field.

### Mobile Homes Pose Problem In Arco Area

BLACKFOOT, March 27 (AP)—The problem of the state's new mobile population, aggravated by Idaho's atomic plant, came before a meeting of city and county officials here yesterday.

Southeastern Idaho county assessors and commissioners tried hard to devise a universal tax on the rapidly expanding trailer camps throughout this region.

The number of wheeled homes has increased recently in the area, particularly around the atomic reactor testing station at Arco.

Some officials expressed unfavorable opinion that it may take legislative action to put the trailers on tax rolls. The biennial state legislature adjourned earlier this month.

The trailer occupants pay only token sums for camp permits, delinquencies complained.

Pocastello was cited as an example. There trailer owners are required to obtain only a \$1 annual permit. The state vehicle license is \$2 for the first 1,000 pounds, \$1 up to 1,500 pounds and \$10 over that weight.

The number of wheeled homes as stationary, owners are not required to pay the state fee, the assessors were told.

### Expansion Urged For Operation of Idaho Gun Plant

POCASTELLO, March 27 (AP)—Expanded operations at the Pocastello naval ordnance plant were urged today by M. C. Wilson, recording secretary of Lodge 1720, International Association of Machinists.

Wilson noted that the plant was closed in 1920 and work formerly done here transferred to other plants at great expense to the government.

"Another plant is now under construction in Michigan which will be used for the manufacture of small guns," he added, "while here in Pocastello we already have the machines and buildings for doing this type of work."

"This would appear to be a gross waste of the taxpayers' money as well as a duplication of defense materials and effort."

### Moves to Deport Costello Pressed

WASHINGTON, March 27 (AP)—The senate crime committee prodded the immigration service today to take more steps toward stripping Frank Costello of his citizenship.

Chairman Bates—McKaufer, D., Tenn., urged a "more active interest" in the case, and acting Immigration Commissioner A. R. Mackey promised more intensive study.

McKaufer set a Thursday deadline for submission of a report on Costello's citizenship status. Mackey also promised a report on Carlos Marcello, New Orleans gang leader.
