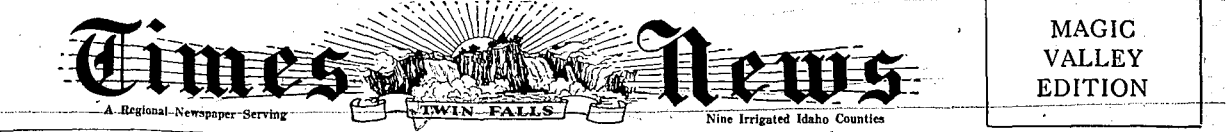

Mum Is Word New Plan on Food Price Control Due for Public Tonight

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—The government was ready today to order a new system of price control on about 100 commodities. After weeks of wrestling with problems involving the effect of price stabilization has completed two retail food orders and one wholesale food order. Issuance was expected later today.

The changeover will give the American public more price stability and some price increases within the next few weeks and Price Director, Michael V. Bond, has predicted the rollback will outbalance the increases.

Markups Controlled
The nation's approximately 500,000 grocery stores will be ordered not to exceed certain "markup" percentages on about 40 categories of food. The stores are expected to cover canned goods, baby foods, coffee, sugar, salt, butter, packaged cereals, cookies and crackers, breakfast cereals, shortenings, flour, flaxseeds, peanut butter, jams and jellies and many others.

They are not expected to cover bread, milk, eggs, fresh fruit, fresh fruits, or fresh vegetables.

At present, the retail and wholesale prices of most foods are at the highest levels charged by the nation since the end of World War II and Jan. 23—except that in the case of most foods, when farm prices rise, the retailer may raise his price to allow for this rise.

The new food orders will "whittle" food prices by 10 to 15 percent on the cost of food items, and will result in lower prices for consumers.

Percentage Factor
A food retailer will use the tables of percentages in whatever regulation applies to him, to determine "markup" percentages will differ according to the size and nature of the retailer's business.

One of the retail orders will cover independent grocers whose annual sales are less than \$1 million and the other will cover chain stores whose annual sales are more than \$1 million.

Kansas City's Noters Again Down Demos

KANSAS CITY, Mo., March 28 (AP)—Kansas City voters rejected a slate of city candidates backed by the United Democratic party factions, including remnants of the old Progressive machine returns showed today.

A slate supported by the citizens association, which swept the Progressive group from power in 1949, returned to the city hall on mass after giving the Democratic candidates a sound thrashing in yesterday's city election.

With 493 of 494 precincts unofficially counted, Mayor William E. Kemp was leading Ben W. Swafford, 67,007, to 55,265.

Hoover Plan Bad for U. S., Welles Avers

NEW YORK, March 28 (AP)—Summer Welles, acting undersecretary of state, says the United States can follow the advice of former President Herbert Hoover only at the risk of courting an inevitable war with Russia.

In such a conflict, Welles adds, the U. S. would have to fight "under far worse conditions than those which now exist."

Reported in Hoop, Welles gave his views in a new book, "Seven Decisions That Shaped History," published yesterday.

The former state department official also is critical of the Truman administration's "record of inefficiency and of vacillation" in the far east.

Defends Decisions
On the other hand, Welles strongly defends the bulk of the late President Roosevelt's World War II decisions in China, Tehran and Yalta. Welles adds that Mr. Roosevelt might have prevented the communist grab for power in China.

Welles appeals for a "truly bipartisan" foreign policy to contain Russia by military and economic force. He says that if such a policy avoids war, then "little by little the iron curtain will melt away."

PUDs Assert Cuts Possible In Light Rate

COVILVILLE, Wash., March 28 (AP)—Public utility districts could possibly charge electricity for eastern Washington and northern Idaho because they have not had a new federal income tax, a spokesman for the PUDs testified yesterday.

W. W. Beck, engineer and utility analyst for three eastern Washington PUDs who wants to raise the rate of the Washington Water Power company said this during a court hearing on the proposed rate.

He said the WWP pays \$1,700,000 in federal taxes last year while the PUDs would have none to pay.

Local Rate Tax But Beck said the state and local taxes other PUDs would pay would be only slightly less than what the WWP now pays.

Beck said that under state law, he would, under state law, be required to pay a percentage of their revenue.

In all their payments would total \$1,000, compared to \$1,000 now paid by WWP, he said.

The PUDs could operate the power facilities without any increase in rates, he said, and a decrease might be possible.

Defense Plan Ignores Line With Canada

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—The United States and Canada have decided to ignore the 3,000-mile border between them in setting up a civilian defense system.

The state departments accepted the terms of a civilian defense pact submitted by Canadian Ambassador Hume Young.

The sweeping nature of the agreement is made clear by its opening sentence: "The United States and Canada will cooperate in the protection of persons and property from the result of enemy attack as if there were no border."

The formal agreement carries over the understanding reached in Ottawa, Feb. 21 at a meeting of the countries' civil defense authorities.

The pact provides a full exchange of information on steps taken, or under consideration in civil defense legislation, organization and regulations; for interchange of material, equipment and personnel; and for reciprocal arrangements with state, provincial and municipal authorities and for cooperation in public information and education.

The pact is an executive agreement, operating at once without action by congress. However, legislation may be required later if operations under it collide with customs, immigration and other laws.

The group will leave for Washington by train at 12:30 p. m. where they will visit President and Mrs. Truman at Blair house.

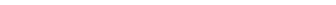

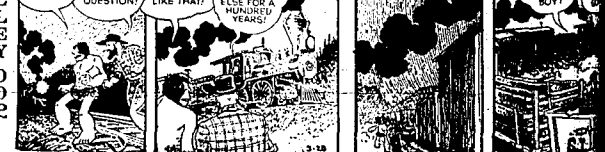

Tax Collector Caught Gravy In Past Year

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—Corporation stockholders had it good to profitable 1930, but the figures now coming to show the tax collector had it even better.

The figures show some of the biggest corporations in the country said in the government under the new rates more in income and excess profits taxes than they paid in 1930 to the stockholders.

Compiled by Paper

The profits-tax tables were worked out by the Wall Street Journal in a compilation of 500 company reports published so far in 1930.

Earnings of the 730 companies in 1930 were 31 per cent greater than in 1929, but the tax hike was even higher, the paper reported, in dollars the earnings compared this way: 1943, \$5,000,000,000; 1930, \$7,500,000,000.

The rubber industry hit the biggest jackpot with a 90 per cent profit hike in 1930 over 1929. Only the drug and tobacco industries showed declines.


