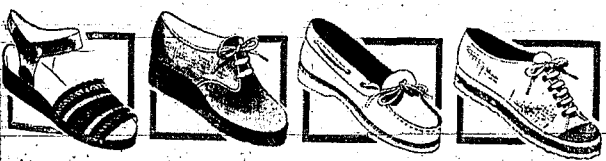

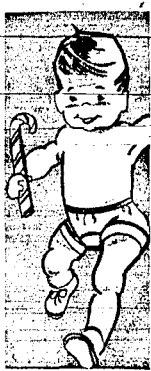

# Jerome Man Is Freed on Arson Count

LONG BEACH, Calif., April 17 (AP)—An Idaho transient who says he "let it go first," was freed today on charges of arson in connection with a \$150,000 hotel fire here Saturday.

However, Darrell Edwin Johnson, 33, who says he from Jerome, Idaho, is in custody on a vagrancy charge. Officers who said Johnson apparently occupied the room directly under the one where the blaze started, arrested him yesterday at a cafe near the hotel.

Chief L. V. Foster said the cause of the fire has not been determined and no evidence of arson has been found. Officers said there was no indication Johnson had anything to do with the fire.

Johnson helped fight the flames and said he is looking for work as a fireman.

The hotel fire raged more than a score of hours, injured two persons and damaged 15 business establishments.

# Open Pit Mining Begun by Cave-in

SILVER CITY, Utah, April 17 (AP)—Crews at the Dragon consolidated mine will switch to open pit mining of clay as the result of a cave-in Sunday.

The upper portion of the mine was broken under thousands of tons of dirt when a mountain side sagged and broke loose to engulf the mine.

A 15-man Sunday shift broke to work for lunch at about 11 a.m. before the cave-in. The main shaft and haulage levels were damaged.

Officials said the mine, which is owned by the International Harvester Co., will be resumed to full-scale operations within a few days.

# 3,000 to Be Laid Off by K-F Plant

DETROIT, April 17 (AP)—Kaiser-Frazer corporation today announced it will lay off 25 per cent of its hourly-rated workers tomorrow because of a shortage of parts.

The company said cutbacks in steel and other materials caused the shortage of radiators and springs. The layoffs will affect 3,000 workers on the production line, which will be discontinued.

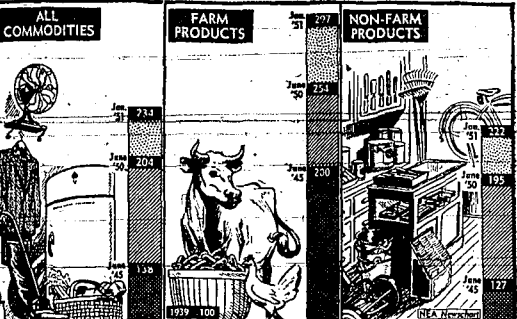

The Washington-rumored freeze of farm parity ratios at mid-January levels would peg the prices of farm products at relatively high levels, compared to those of non-farm products. Taking all 1939 prices at 100, farm products—which got a big jump on other commodities in World War II—had risen to 227 when the government's January wage-price freeze went into effect. Non-farm products stood at 122 then, while all commodities combined were at 201. From pre-war to price freeze, wholesale farm prices rose about 17 per cent, while all commodities rose 15 per cent.
