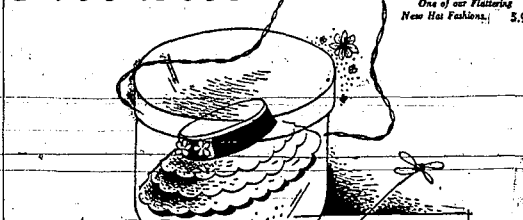

 more donors are available. An estimated 1,500 to 2,000 donors should be on file in order to assure an adequate blood supply at the hospital at all times, he stated.

However, he said that the community blood bank might be the solution to the problem when organization is completed.

Following further discussion of methods of reducing the cost of administering blood without getting the hospital into financial difficulties, the board decided to wait for a report from the audit on its organization progress.

In other business, the board appointed the building and grounds committee to take charge of formal opening ceremonies. For the new hospital, members of community organizations may be called upon to assist in planning the opening which is tentatively set for the first of July. N. V. Sharp is chairman of the committee.

The board voted to take action on statements outstanding prior to 1951 and approved a request that X-ray technicians be allowed one month's vacation instead of two weeks because of the danger from constant exposure to radiation.

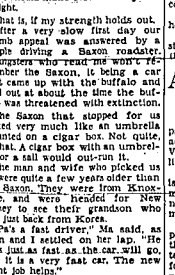

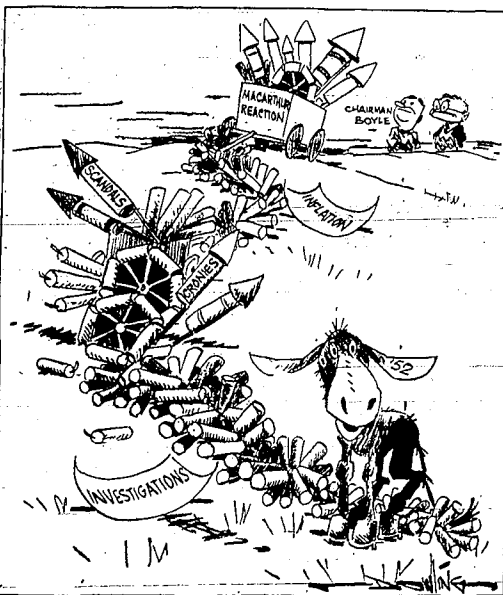

Atom Defense Possible, Top Leader Avers

WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—The nation's civil defense chief, Millard Caldwell, believes there is a good chance of making atomic bombs. He called for a nationwide crusade to make the public aware of it.

Caldwell said such a crusade also should aim at awakening people to the real danger that atomic bombs may fall.

Could Cut Casualties

A well-organized civil defense program, he said, could reduce the casualties at least by half and "keep the cities" and "production" lines in operation.

Caldwell spoke at the opening session of a two-day civil defense conference attended by leaders of some 250 national organizations with a total membership of 50,000,000.

Can't Stop Attack

Caldwell told the delegates that "we cannot stop an atomic bombing if the enemy decides to make the attack."

Daniel K. Edwards, newly appointed assistant secretary of defense, likewise told the conference that no air defense could possibly destroy every enemy before it reached American shores.

Caldwell said too many Americans either are apathetic about bomb dangers or are beset by fear and helplessness.
