**PAUL**, May 26—Ten Paul high school seniors received diplomas at commencement exercises Thursday evening in the school gymnasium.

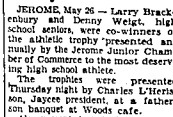

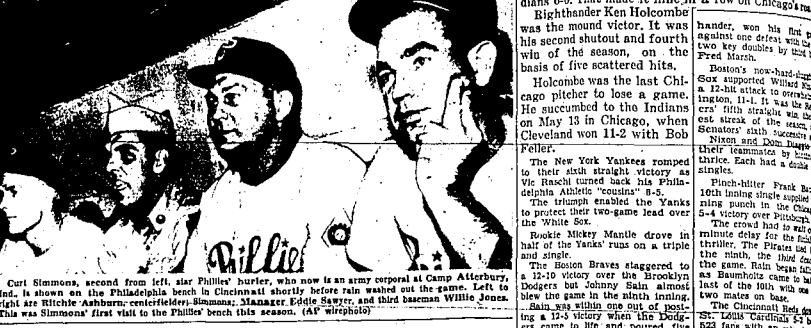

Earlier Judge Love issued a writ of habeas corpus to bring Allen out of custody to determine the justification of his detention.

Allen seeks damages against the defendant for humiliation to himself and his family and for injury to his good name and reputation. He is represented by Rayburn and Rayburn and Harry P.oney. M. J. Allen's attorneys are J. H. Blandford and James J. Bradford.

tion for a duplicate was sent to Boise.

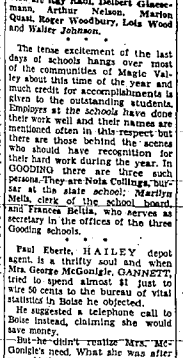
Now Mrs. McGonigle doesn't worry in the world. No worries, that is, other than that the certificate will arrive in Minnesota in time for the wedding.

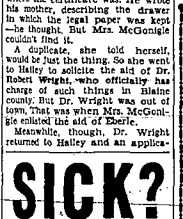

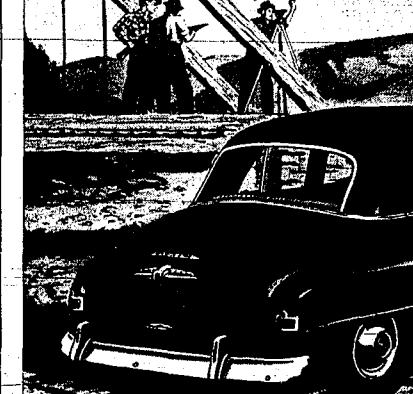

Two-Edged Weapon, Alaskan Airbases, Could Be Turned Against This Nation

WASHINGTON, May 20 (Special) - American airbases in Alaska are a two-edged sword that could be turned against us to put the entire continent easy come, easy gone.

Despite the fact that military men have been conscious of the U. S. West spot in the north, Defense X. L. Bartlett of Alaska complains there is no real sense of urgency in this situation.

"It would almost be better to destroy unprotected air fields than to leave them for use by invaders," Bartlett said.

### Starry North Cross Praised By Stargazer

Often we hear of the keen anticipation of those taking their initial ocean voyage south of the United States to obtain their first glimpse of the famed constellation of stars, the southern cross.

But many of these eager travelers do not realize we have in our own skies a fine starry cross much larger than the one in the far southern heavens.

The northern cross is in view during the early evening hours about two-thirds of the year. Those willing to make pre-dawn observations will find this sky figure any night of the year. In the winter months it can be seen to set in the northwest in the evening, then rises eight hours later in the morning of the same day.

**Magnitudes Similar**

As to comparison of brightness, or magnitude, of stars in the two crosses, the southern cross contains one star of the first magnitude, two second and one-third. Our northern cross contains one first magnitude star, one second, and three third. (First magnitude stars are the brightest.)

Anyone with moderately good eyes and a slight interest in the starry skies can locate the northern cross easily on the next clear night by devoting only a few minutes of time to search. It forms a large figure. Here are the directions:

Observe at 9 p. m.

Around 4 P. M. look toward the northeast. Two bright stars will be seen. The brighter and higher of these two is Vega. We are not here concerned with it. Trace lower and farther north to the other one, Deneb. Bright Deneb is at the head of the northern cross, a stellar figure lying on its side with the foot extending toward the right.

Now look for vertical line of three stars of almost equal brightness a little to the right of Deneb. These form the cross arm of the cross. The greater length can be traced horizontally by starting from Deneb, going through the middle star of the cross arm, and farther to the right until two more stars are encountered.

Not Impressive Now

The northern cross is not so impressive now, when lying flat in the northeast, as it is in the late fall and winter when it rises in the early evening it is almost upright in the sky and most impressive.

The northern cross is the principal asterism in the complete constellation Cygnus, the swan. Deneb is the tail of the swan; the cross arm its wings; and the foot of the cross, its neck. This group is located in a rich part of the Milky way, which can be seen well later in the night. Someone has written, "The swan is flying along the Milky way."

### As Your Minister Sees It

"Verily, verily, I say unto you: Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." (John 3:3)

I think there is no chapter in all the Bible so familiar to us as the third chapter of John. It may be because we find in it the marvelous expression of God's love in the 16th verse. Luther once said it was the Gospel in a nutshell. Another distinguished preacher has declared that if you take away from him all of the Old Testament and all the New Testament and leave him only this text: "For God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life," he would know enough of the heart of God, and he would know enough of the plan of Salvation, to be saved.

Yet to my mind, there is no chapter in all the Bible so difficult of explanation: It is in this chapter we have the thought of regeneration presented, and if I should say unto you, "Give me a definition of regeneration," that would give many of my readers could give a definition that I consider to be satisfactory or plain to the man or woman who is seeking Jesus Christ.

On the other hand, if you should say, "Give me an illustration of regeneration," I could do it easily. I could tell you the story of the man who came into one of our services bound with sin and who, for months, has been free. This is the result of regeneration. I could tell you the story of the woman, who once was hopeless and helpless, and who now is giving her testimony to the marvelous saving and keeping power of Jesus Christ. I would ask you to listen to her friends, who say that she is a changed woman, changed in her expression, in her manner of speech, so changed that she has become a new creature. That is regeneration.

You will notice that this text has a marginal reference, which says, "Verily, verily, I say unto you except a man be born from above." So when you say you have received to save your sin, that is not enough. When you tell me that you have received never again to go in the way of iniquity, that is not enough, even if you keep the revelation. It can be a new creature, and overcome the power of old sin, and new temptation, he must be born from above, and that means to have implanted in his nature a new force from above. It is to have within the life of God. That is regeneration.

We read in Matthew 23:12, "Except your righteousness exceed the righteousness of the Scribes and Pharisees ye shall in no case enter into the Kingdom of heaven." So there is a very little hope for the one who puts away the Savior, either to see God or to know Him. Indeed, there is no hope, and there is no open door. No man would dare say that by his own efforts he could reach a standard of righteousness an infinite God. Then how are you going to be saved?

I know how you may be saved, and I tell it to the man, who up to this moment, has had no hope. And to the woman who is in despair. I tell it to the rich and the poor. I convey the message to the outcast and the respectable. Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved." For by faith, we are united

to Christ, and His righteousness is imputed to us. It is by the world, our nation, our country, and the people are to be saved. It will be because of our faith in Christ.
