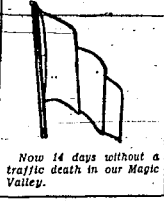

**WASHINGTON**—A partial explanation for his sharp, congressional cuts in the administration's multi-billion dollar budget appropriation is being offered by a bipartisan attempt to prevent the White House from spending rearmament money for the fiscal year 1953.

(From Page One) pect too much too soon. It will not give a complete kill the first year, but will rid the land of many wireworms. In the second season the land will be free enough of the insects for minimum damage to beans and potatoes.

The new chemical has the advantage of not deteriorating. He is going into his seventh year without a diminution of experimental plots at Walla Walla and says a similar situation exists there.

then digging again. Cost of the DDT application is about \$9 per acre. He recommends ethylene dibromide fumigation followed by DDT because DDT remains potent and will catch many young worms. These two chemicals replace the carbon disulfide and crude naphthalene formerly recommended for wireworm control.

Lane also suggests applying DDT when the land will be free when you go back to cash crops," he says. He says it's not a good idea to plant potatoes one to two years after applying DDT.

He reports flooding is going out of use as a wireworm control measure but cultural methods still are widely used. He suggests rotation of three or four years of alfalfa followed by two or three years of cash crops. He says this is particularly effective on an eight-year basis. Wireworms are found in all irrigated lands of the Pacific northwest, according to the entomologist. They have a three-year cycle with a brood each year.

The adult is the click or snap beetle. The eggs are laid in the spring and are hatching along about now or a little later. The worm becomes a beetle along about July and August, with the beetles laying underground until the following April.

The wireworms affect potatoes more than beans but feed on everything but alfalfa. In exceptional cases they become so numerous that even alfalfa can't be started in the field ground. They grow fastest on grain, beans and clover. After they chew through bean seeds they bore into the stem. They feed underground all summer, boring holes in potatoes sometimes to the extent an entire crop is lost. They scour up onions, carrots, sugar beets and love corn and all truck crops. Lane has been in Magic Valley the past several days checking results of control measures. He reports he finds those who treated their lands according to instructions are satisfied with the results they are getting.
