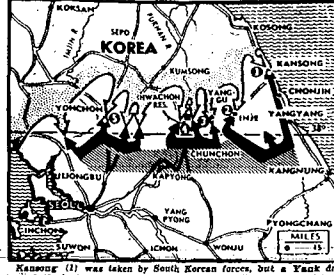

**Dulles Urges Pressures to Hammer Russ**

TUCSON, Ariz., May 31 (AP)—John Foster Dulles declared last night Russia's capacity to carry on half-war industry can be quickly destroyed by suitably applied pressures.

The Republican foreign policy adviser, without going into details about such pressures, called on the free nations to stand in terms of their strength and our opponent's weakness.

Looks Formidable

Dulles said "always look most formidable" when they are held in an address at commencement exercises at University of Arizona.

Dulles is one of Secretary of State Acheson's advisers. He is now assigned to completing a Japanese peace treaty this summer in the face of communist opposition. Next weekend he goes to London for talks with British officials.

He said that the Soviet union is pulling about one-third of the world's economic capacity into the strategy of waging what Leon Trotsky called "war without peace."

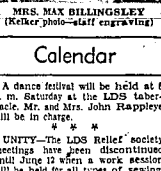

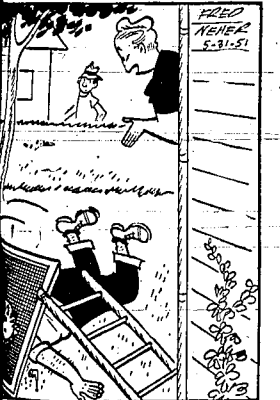

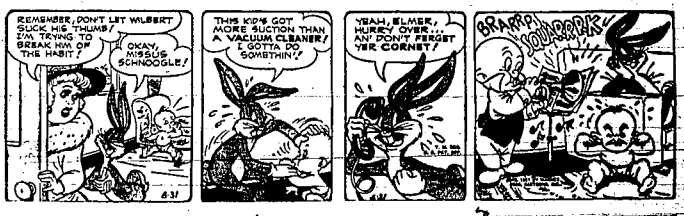

**Deadline Date For PUD Sale Appeal Passes**

**SPOKANE, May 21**—Three eastern Washington public utilities districts let their deadline for appeal to the supreme court pass without action on a court decision preventing them from buying the Washington Water Power company.

Clarence O. Dill, attorney for the Bend Oreille PUD, said the group had decided not to appeal the permanent injunction issued against them March 29 by Judge J. B. Morrison.

Dill refused to say whether the three PUDs would continue their efforts to purchase the Spokane utility from the American Power and Light company, which holds all WWP common stock.

The injunction upheld a contention that the sale would be unconstitutional because about 26 per cent of WWP property is in Idaho. Meanwhile, the Chronicle reported rumors that the PUDs have been negotiating with representatives of Idaho firms for the possible sale of WWP property in that state. Such action might clear the way for PUD purchase of Washington state properties.
