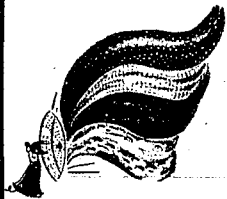

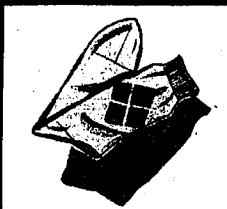

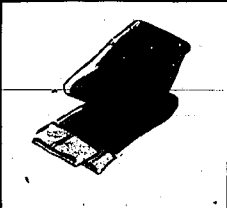

STOP THOSE "RUBBER BURNERS"!

Despite the value-wide campaign to reduce a mounting toll of traffic fatalities, a dangerous condition once more is out of control in Twin Falls, with youthful "rubber burners" on a rampage.

The responsibility lies with the youths themselves, their parents, the law enforcement officials, or a combination of all three. It is a condition which should be stopped immediately, for someone pays with his life for such horseplay.

The "rubber burners" are those youngsters who gang up in cars and parade up and down Main avenue, particularly on Sunday afternoon, honking their horns to the point of driving everyone to distraction, and responding to any impulse short of driving their cars off the high bridge.

Such violations are not at all uncommon in the Twin Falls area, for instance, a carload of youngsters swung around in the middle of the street on Main avenue, bringing their car to a screeching halt in front of a confectionery store. Then it was discovered the wheels were clanging, then horns to the car and road away in a wild take-off, with rubber screeching all the way.

So if this condition is permitted to go on until someone is killed, it will then be the combined fault of the youngsters, their parents, the law enforcement officials that such brazen disregard of the law was tolerated.

Even the youngsters should have better sense than to make themselves public nuisances every Sunday afternoon, to excite nothing about their actions being a real menace to human lives.

Not the least objectionable thing about it all is the danger for insurance companies, burned, horn-tooting, rubber-burning driving, cannot help coming to the conclusion that Twin Falls must be a "cow town."

Utah Guardsmen Claim Record Of 831 Prisoners in Single Day

TOKYO, June 7 (AP)—The Utah national guard unit—2131 armored field artillery battalion—captured 831 Chinese communists and wounded hundreds of others in a single day recently without losing a man. The battalion claims this as a record for a single day's action. The capture of the 831 prisoners took place in the vicinity of the ground units advancing north of Kopyang. At 2 a. m. the Chinese attacked an infantry regiment clearing station and when beaten off moved in on the 2131st A battery. With dawn, a self-propelled gun raked canyon walls for three-quarters of a mile to help a patrol wipe out enemy pockets. As the patrol advanced the reds tried to escape over a ridge but gunfire was poured down them and gradually shot down. This was a reverse procedure for artillery, which normally seeks to keep the enemy away rather than draw him closer. Capt. James Hoop, Cedar City, battery adjutant, and the bold action "broke the backs" of the Chinese and "our boys went right up through them, shooting from the hip. I never saw anything like it." After eight hours most of the firing had died down and the hundreds of Chinese came down the mountainside to surrender. A four-man squad led by Sgt. Wesley A. Chadburn, also Cedar City, brought in 400 in a single mission. Another single soldier brought in 15. The Chinese were well-equipped and most had new clothing. The next day, 66 more were captured, boosting the total of prisoners to 897.

Railroad Loss Seen if Rates Hike Allowed

PORTLAND, June 7 (AP)—Interstate commerce commission officials were told here yesterday that increased freight rates probably would result in railroads losing revenue instead of getting more. T. J. Kelly, executive vice-president of the Northwest Canners association, said in the last four years rail shipment of fruit had declined 45 per cent while water shipment had increased 300 per cent. The shift was due to rising rail freight charges, he said. He opposed the American railroad request for a 15 per cent freight rate increase. Millers and grain dealers added their protest to the proposed rate. Flour milling interests said downward rate adjustments were needed to give western producers a chance to compete for eastern markets. Frank Agnew, Portland, manager of the Pacific Northwest Grain and Grain Products association, said railroads are not cutting rates readily. ICC decision directing rate readjustments on hauling grain. "We ask that no increase be granted now and that the railroads be required to live up to the mandates of the commission," he said.

Anniversary of Marshall Plan Finds It Turning to Arms Aid

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP)—This week marked the fourth anniversary of the Marshall plan to put Europe back on its feet. It did not quite accomplish that but it, instead, to a military aid program. This program will be equally or more expensive and probably last longer. "Things might have turned out a lot worse. Aside from the question whether the United States ultimately will be able to bear the worldwide financial burdens undertaken since World War II and now projected far into the future, the most significant aspect of foreign aid is that it is not commensurate with the needs in western Europe and in the eastern Mediterranean. It is only in Asia that the United States and the west-

ern democracies in general have been losing the war against communism—hot or cold. No one knows what would have happened if Gen. George C. Marshall—then secretary of state—had included Asiatic countries in the plan he outlined June 5, 1947. In a speech at Harvard university, he did not do so and the wisdom or error of that omission now is a matter of hot dispute. The Marshall plan flowed naturally from the failure of earlier efforts to bolster Europe against chaos and communism. A \$5,000,000,000 1947 loan to Great Britain had been disputed with such astonishing speed that the British were almost over the brink of international

bankruptcy before London or Washington knew it. A May, 1947, grant of \$400,000,000 to roll back communism in Greece and Turkey was the next development. It has been a great success. Marshall told his June 1947 audience it had become evident that the cost and scope of efforts to revive western Europe would far exceed any previous estimates. He then proposed in broad terms the aid program that came to bear his name. From certain countries were to be welcome participants. 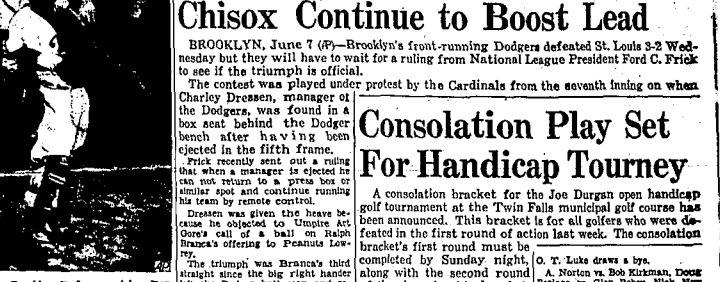

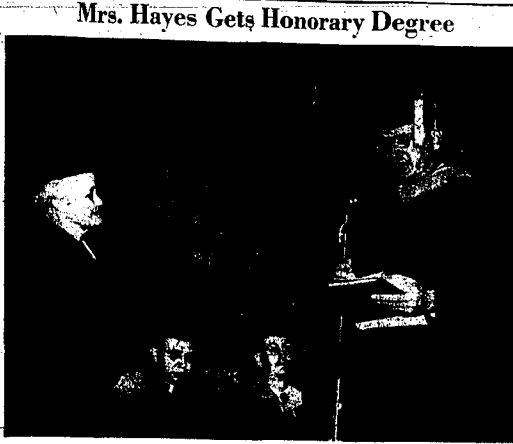

House Okays Bill on Food Aid to India

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP)—A compromise bill to loan India \$190,000,000 for famine relief was passed by the house yesterday and sent to the senate.

Passage was by a roll call vote of 257 to 123.

A senate-house conference committee came to terms on a common measure yesterday. Early senate approval is expected to get food moving to India before the end of the month.

Under the merged house and senate bills, India will be required to purchase all the food—an estimated 200,000,000 tons of wheat and other basic supplies—in the American market.

Terms of the loan will be worked out by the economic cooperation administration (ECA), which will be instructed to try for partial repayment in strategic materials from India.

The compromise bill set aside \$5,000,000 of loan interest to provide medical and scientific help to India.

Controls Foe Gives Solons Fireside Chat

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP)—A Texas hardware dealer who sold the late Harry Truman on the radio delivered a "fireside chat" to congress last night.

Rep. Lucas, Athens, Tex., a member of the Lone Star state legislature for 10 years, bought time on radio station WOL here to lobby against federal curbs on installment plan buying. He said they were no hardship as to millions but are ruinous to poor people and to dealers like himself.

Hearing refused Lucas hit upon this unusual method of giving his views after congress refused to listen to him in person. Normally, congressional committees will hear almost anybody with a story to tell. But in hearing on extending the defense production act, only representatives of national organizations are being heard.

Undaunted, Lucas sent a tape recording of his homespun voice to Washington and asked members of congress by letter, telegram and newspaper ads to tune in for his broadcast.

Business hit Then, in the broadcast, he told them that his business—\$15,000 gross last year—has dropped off by half, he had to fire one helper and he can't supply food but about 40 cash customers on account of the credit requirements.

"It is perfectly legal for us to sell a million here every electric or gas appliance we have available for cash," the Texas said. "It is illegal for us to sell to a good credit risk, regardless of need, without at least a 25 per cent down payment."

Lucas' recommendations: Cut the down payment to 10 per cent, increase the payoff period to 24 months, allow traded-in items to count toward the down payment.

Man, Wife and Child, 3, Fail in 30-Mile Trek to Escape Posse

AMERICAN FALLS, June 7 (AP)—How a man, his wife and their 3-year-old child completed an almost unbelievable trek on foot through southeastern Idaho mountains in an attempt to elude a posse was untried here.

The three were taken into custody at a bus depot in Blackfoot.

Mr. and Mrs. Edna Mull and their child, Arlinda Louise, fled more than 30 miles on foot to escape a posse which was hunting for them for six hours Monday and continued the search over rain-soaked terrain Tuesday.

Mull, arraigned in the Power county courthouse, will face larceny charges and will be bound over to district court. Prosecuting Attorney Gregg Bustin said. He said the Mulls are from Elkhart, Ind.

The red-haired father admitted stealing \$70, which was used as an alarm clock from Mr. and Mrs. Sam Panogue, who live on Bannock creek.

Sobbing, the father clutched his 3-year-old daughter in Sherill Bill Hoehnen's office and was unable to answer questions coherently.

He was near exhaustion from the hike that took the trio from a point near here to Inkom, where they boarded a bus for Montana.

Suspicious, the bus driver notified Pocatello police who radioed ahead to Blackfoot officers. The family was removed from the bus and brought back here.

The child, who had been carried through the hills by the father, appeared in good health after more than a day and a half of exposure and no food or shelter.

The chase began when Mull reportedly was discovered in the Panogue home when Mrs. Panogue returned from milking a litter, surprised, the slender-built man dropped two rifles and fled to a waiting car. Mrs. Panogue told sheriff's men.

At the jail, Mull said he needed the money to feed his child. He told questioners he had been unable to find a job and had pawned his car.
