## Started to End Nation's Monopoly in Field of Atomics

WASHINGTON, June 8 (AP)—The United States is starting to end its monopoly in the field of atomic energy, according to a report by the Atomic Energy Commission today. The report says that the commission is planning to open up the field to private industry by allowing foreign companies to build and operate nuclear power plants in the United States. This move is seen as a major step toward ending the government's long-standing monopoly in the field of atomic energy.

## Meat Curbs to Stick, Disalle Tells Solons

WASHINGTON, June 8 (AP)—Price Director Disalle told congress today that failure to control beef prices would wreck the ceilings on all foods and force the abandonment of the entire stabilization program. Disalle said there should be no exception for beef and cattle in legislation extending price control powers. Marshall told war correspondents, any peace moves would have to come from the Chinese. He is seeking more United Nations troops to support the allied drive.

**Lull in Work Follows Auto Wage Boosts**

DETROIT, June 8.—More than 450,000 of the auto industry's 1,000,000 workmen got assurances today they will get some wage increase. But most of them also got word they'll be laid off from three days to a week soon.

The Ford Motor company advised its 113,000 hourly rated employees they will get the same 4-cent boost. They will get the same 4-cent boost for "producing" the wage stabilization board approved for the 355,000 General Motors workers Wednesday night. Packard quickly followed suit for its 60,000.

General Motors announced its 4-cent, wage-booster complement with a notice that it will shut down its plants throughout the country from July 28 through Aug. 6.

The Studebaker corporation announced at South Bend, Ind., it would shut down its passenger car assembly line today and will not resume operations until Wednesday. The layoff will affect 14,000.

GM said government restrictions on metals and other materials would cause its shutdown. Studebaker said cause is the shortage of body stampings as forcing its holiday. Ford announced recently 10,000 workers will be furloughed by fall because of a materials shortage.



### School District's Five New Fire Escapes Being Finished

Painters are putting the final touches on five new fire escapes built on three schools in class A independent school district 411. The contract was let Sept. 23, 1950, but difficulty in obtaining structural steel delayed the project.

A law passed by the legislature in 1949 requires such metal fireproof outside fire escapes on public buildings more than two stories in height. However the law makes no recognition of whether or not the public buildings already have fireproof construction.

The school district project cost taxpayers \$12,500 for the contract let to Reynolds and Walker, Inc., Paradise and Holmes G. Lamb. The project includes two fire escapes each at the Bickel and junior-senior high school buildings and one at the Lincoln school.

Doors leading to the fire escapes are opened from the inside by pushing against panic bars. The fire escape doors have no knobs on the outside.

Panic bars now are standard equipment on all exterior doors throughout the school district. Supt. A. W. Morgan said equipping the doors with panic bars cost about \$8,000 for materials and labor.

It took eight months for the hardware to arrive and another nine months for installation. Installation was delayed in some cases by the necessity of completely rebuilding weatherbeater, warped and shrank doors.

Some of the doors, including a few on the Washington school newer school additions, had to be replaced. In all, 19 new doors were needed before the panic bar installation could be completed.

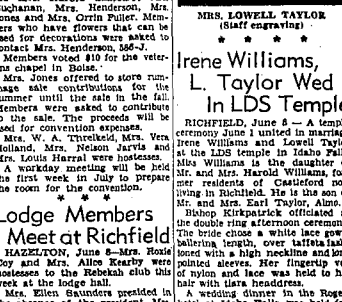

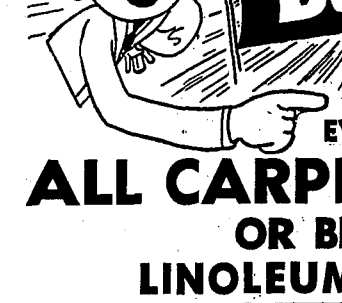
