WASHINGTON, June 14 (AP)—Louis Johnson said today he would long "couldn't go along with the Russian policy of bleeding us dry in Korea forever." But in testimony at senate hearings, the former secretary of defense declined to endorse the proposals for Gen. Douglas MacArthur for hitting directly at red China in an effort to end the war. He pleaded in part that he had been out of the government since last Sept. 18 and lacked information.

The senate panel inquiring into MacArthur's dismissal sought Johnson's views on Korean strategy after first getting into details of how the Chinese got into Korea.

Johnson said he believed the decision would have been the same even if Russia and red China had been seen from the forces straddling South Korea.

Specifically on MacArthur's strategy, Johnson said he would support the proposal to tighten the economic blockade against China.

U. S. Steel Capacity Now Far Above Top Mark for War II

By C. M. WHITE
(Special Republic Staff)

CLEVELAND (AP)—America's steel industry is again called upon to produce the steel needed to equip the nation's armed forces. The industry's production of steel in 1944 was 47 million tons, a record for the industry.

Three thousand war planes. Five hundred bombers. One thousand anti-aircraft guns. Five thousand tanks. Half a million trucks. One million motorcycles. Three thousand jeeps. And, among "indirect military" items would be 1,000 freight cars, 2,000 cargo ships, 200 tankers, 12,000 automobiles, 2,000 houses, 20,000 refrigerators and 20,000 stores.

There would still remain enough steel to make 100 million more tons of steel. The production of American steel companies is available 300,000 tons of steel.

How does American steel production compare with that of Soviet Russia?

Three tons of steel are poured in the United States to one ton in Russia and in the countries she controls. Add to this the steel-making capacity of all the non-communist countries, and the ratio is five tons of non-communist steel to one ton of communist steel.

But our steel industry since the war has been producing at all-time speed to satisfy the pent-up demand for automobiles, washing machines, refrigerators, bicycles and thousands of other consumer items. In the same years, the Russian steel industry has been pouring its production into tanks and guns.

It would be extremely dangerous for the people of this country to let themselves be lulled into an attitude of unpreparedness simply because they know that we can produce these huge quantities of steel. We might have very little time to prepare after attack begins.

A reduction in civilian goods certainly is being made. The steel industry has cut down the orders of regular customers to meet the demands of defense production and to comply with government allocation programs. The industry has agreed cheerfully to give priority to all defense orders.

We will have to make sacrifices in our standard of living in the uncertain days ahead and we will not be sacrificing some of the funda-

but the armed forces are preparing to draft many more men in their most productive years. The rest of us, therefore, must produce more in order to live through.

We must all work harder to prove that the individual American way of life can produce not only a high living standard but a military machine superior to any in the world. We must show that these things can be done with a minimum of controls and a maximum of voluntary cooperation.

If we can do this, we can prove to some nations—whose friendship or admiration we cannot buy with Marshall plan dollars—that our experiment is worth following.

Consentation will fall wherever free people see that freedom spells opportunity, higher living standards and greater security from the ordinary hazards of life.

Only Few Varieties of Fruit Expected to Top 1950 Prices

WASHINGTON, June 14 (Special)—The department of agriculture took another look at last month's prediction of higher fruit prices for the 1951 season and announced today that only a few varieties will top 1950 levels.

"Prices for some 1951-crop delicious fruits, such as apricots and sweet cherries, which will reach the market in volume in July, may average higher prices as a result of smaller production and stronger demand," the bureau of agricultural economics reported.

Grower prices for 1950-crop apples are expected to be about the same in June as in May and will continue considerably under those of the same months of 1950 because of abnormally heavy stocks.

June may not average quite as high as 1950 prices."

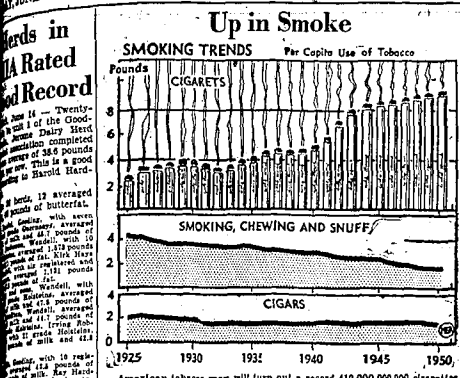

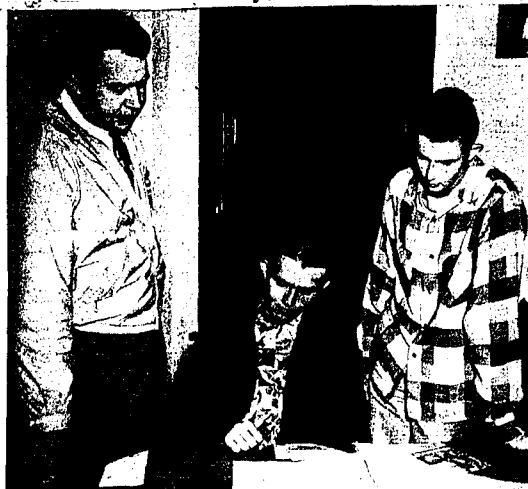

Two Boy Scouts from Burley are going through the final stages of getting passports and vaccinations and making other preparations for a two-month trip to attend the seventh world Scout jamboree, scheduled this year at Bad Ischl, Austria.

The youths are Adonis Nielson, Jr., 16, and George McCongal, Jr., 16. Nielson is a member of Snorro post 13, sponsored by the fifth ward of the LDS church at Burley, and McCongal is a member of post 30, sponsored by the Burley Methodist church.
