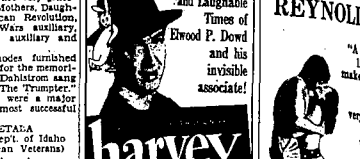

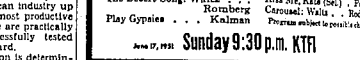

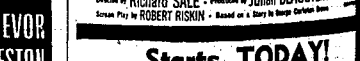

### Chamber's Tourist Hostess Helps With DAV Tour, but Starts Work on Monday

Laurette Chaney, Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce tourist hostess, started her duties a little early by assisting with the Disabled American Veterans scenic tour Friday afternoon. Her regular duties start Monday.

The DAV convention tour took delegates by bus to Magic Valley Memorial hospital, a trout farm, the sugar factory, Sunset Memorial park where they enjoyed the chimneys, Jaycees park, Shoshone falls and the Perrine Memorial bridge.

Convention tours are not a part of Miss Chaney's regular duties in greeting tourists, giving them Twin Falls area folders, maps and literature and promoting Magic Valley's scenic and other attractions. Special arrangements must be made in advance for the scenic tour service.

Miss Chaney works a double shift of six and one-half hours daily—8 to 10 a.m., 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., and 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. The special folders and a Shoshone folder are arranged so she will be able to greet as many tourists as possible, in cafes, on the street and at scenic points.

It is at such scenic points as Shoshone falls and the Perrine Memorial bridge that some of her most important promotional work will be done. The Chamber of Commerce provides her with a camera with which she will take pictures of tourists against scenic backgrounds.

"These pictures will be sent to the tourists' hometown newspapers accompanied by a news release describing the scenic attractions. The release also will include information promoting this section and its many attractions in varied fields—both for vacationing and permanent residence."

On the street and in business establishments where tourists congregate Miss Chaney will furnish two folders which emphasize the 212-foot height of the falls. She also will provide Idaho road maps upon request. The folders were prepared as part of the chamber's tourist and convention service.

"The two special folders are 'Name Mr. Tourist!' and 'Greetings From the Chamber of Commerce.' The first describes area attractions in pictures and words and the second gives condensed information plus a map showing how to drive to the various attractions.

If the tourists desire additional maps or other printed information, Miss Chaney will refer them to the Chamber of Commerce. For those seeking information about various tourist services she will suggest a wide choice of business places offering them.

In cases where she can't greet

tourists personally, Miss Chaney will leave the folders and either under the windshield wiper of the tourist's car, still accomplishing her mission of promoting good will and advertising Magic Valley.

Periodically she will deliver supplies of folders and other advertising to cars, motor hotels, anywhere they are likely to find their way into tourist hands. Goal of the Chamber of Commerce project is to make certain every tourist has a warm western welcome to Twin Falls.

Miss Chaney says she found the DAV convention tour enjoyable and looking forward to her summer job of meeting hundreds of people from hundreds of places. She's frank in admitting she'll know more about her job after she has had a week's experience in it.

# Life in MAGIC VALLEY

A broken arm might be a catastrophe to some people. But to Mrs. Fannie Smith, RUPERT, it is not much more than a nuisance. Mrs. Smith says the mishap is minor compared to some of her early day experiences in this state.

Mrs. Smith was born in Virginia. Her parents died when she was a small child and she was taken to Missouri by her grandmother, Mrs. Ben Wright. They lived in Missouri for two years and then moved to Kellon, Utah, by emigrant train. Later they moved to MARSH VALLEY (now ALBION), arriving there on April 20, 1860.

Marsh valley was a log settlement when she arrived. In 1865 she was married to Andrew Smith and the couple moved to Monticello's ferry four miles east of Rupert.

In addition to raising the cattle the young couple plied mixed along the Snake river. Mrs. Smith later filed on a tract near Smith's Springs. Here, Mrs. Smith recalls, she spent several lonely years with her children as her only companions. Her husband was away most of the time with the cattle. When she needed a grub stake she'd go to Diamond bar a mile away and mine until she had enough to feed the family a little longer.

In 1920, just as the family was ready to "move up" on the homestead, the government condemned the farm in order to build Middlefork dam. In 1904 the family struck a great market in MINIDOKA. The Smiths were the "jumping off" place for settlers. While there were many good people there, Mrs. Smith says the town's 15 saloons attracted some pretty rough characters.

Rupert came into being in 1903 and the Smiths moved to the new town to start another meat market. At the same time they filed on a farm where the Everett addition to Rupert now is located. The farm home was located where School Spool. Don Deane now lives.

Since the death of her husband 12 years ago Mrs. Smith has been living in Rupert, spending much of her time in her flower garden and working on her button collection.

"I couldn't say it was a good-drower or a good-dresser but it sure was a gully-washer!" That's the way Elms Far describes the way the hills west of ROYALTON last Tuesday. ## AS YOUR MINISTER SEES IT

By HERMAN C. RICE  
(Pastor, First Baptist Church)



Some weeks ago I used a quotation from Dr. Herbert Geisler, brilliant young theologian who came to this country from Germany when Hitler was rising to power. He has since been in the center of an intense storm among our Baptist people of America until today he is president of one of our eastern seminaries.

In this quotation he told of an experience in Germany, in which he was speaking to a Christian youth group along with a young communist. He quoted the communist as saying at that time, "The lines are drawn between you and us, between your faith and our faith, between your movement and ours. The fight is on. The victory for the next 100, perhaps the next 1,000 years will belong to those who will have the deeper commitment, the fiercer loyalty, the greater readiness to sacrifice."

Strong words are those—deeper commitment, fiercer loyalty, greater readiness to sacrifice. Nothing has happened on the local or the international scene to weaken the opinion expressed by the representative of the group which is still causing the world so much trouble.

There are commitments, loyalties and sacrifices going on all the time, but the vital question is to what and to whom are we committed and loyal and for what and

Lack of keen discernment often results in divided loyalty. We are on top. "We are the greatest country in the world." "The struggle has been won." Therefore the resultant weakening of the sense of need for commitment, loyalty and sacrifice.

It has been well said year ago that the issue is clearly drawn between Christ and chaos. Time only proves the wisdom of that declaration. Therefore the appeal of this little contribution today is for a greater commitment to the God who is in Christ reconciling the world to himself. Let us give him our fiercest loyalty and be willing to make sacrifices for him.

Which is to say that we are willing to make the "calculated risk" implied in giving ourselves without reserve to His way of life, believe-

ing implicitly that only in following in His way can we hope to make secure the world of tomorrow. This means that we must have faith in Him. That is not enough, we must have faith in our faith, and in everything on it. It means believing that the Kingdom of this world shall become the Kingdom of our Lord and Christ. It means that we believe and work toward the end that the rule of God shall cover the earth as the waters cover the sea. It means that the will of God cannot be thwarted by evil men.

But it also means that if the will of God is done on earth as it is in heaven, thereby making secure the world of tomorrow for men of good will, such men will need to make an all-out commitment to the doing of His will and stand behind their commitment with fierce loyalty and sacrifice.

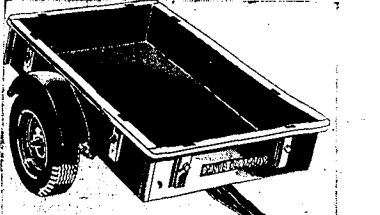

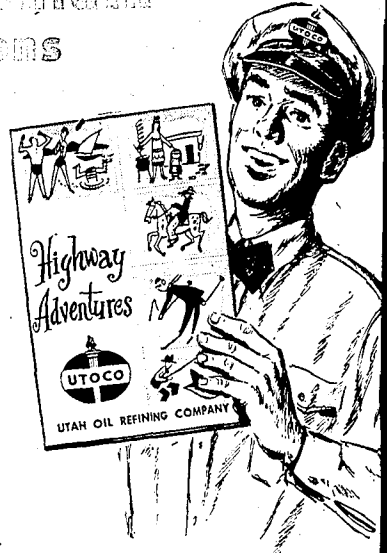
