Envoys Case Given Third Man's Theme
LONDON, June 22—An American envoy case was conducted today in Britain's mystery of the two missing diplomats.

The London Daily Express said Guy Burgess, one of the two missing British foreign office men, broke a date with an unidentified American medical student living in England, and went off to France.

The newspaper hinted that blackmail by communists was involved in the mystery.

Burgess had been under suspicion by the foreign office for membership in the Communist Party, said Donald Maclean, another foreign office employee. The two had been drinking companions.

Responsible Office
Maclean was head of the American department at the foreign office, a highly responsible position. The two were tracked to France. There the trail went cold. Some suspicion was raised that the two fled from the iron curtain for unexplained motives.

The Express story quoted a man who had been Burgess' roommate for 14 years as saying Burgess met the American medical student on the Queen Mary on his way back to London, after having been recalled from Moscow in May 21, but that at 8:30 p. m. that day, the diplomat received a telephone call which appeared to distress Burgess.

"I hold the view, and it is based on fairly substantial evidence, that Maclean was dissatisfied by something rather sinister in Paris—some kind of blackmail and wanted help," the roommate said.

"I should say that the people with whom Maclean had got involved were possibly from the other side of the iron curtain."

Reds Attempt To Sway Top Court Justice

WASHINGTON, June 22—Supreme Court Justice Jackson reports that communists use the "spoils" kind of tactics in their efforts to influence the court.

He told a senate subcommittee "they're the only organized group that tries to make a campaign against the judiciary that I know of."

But Jackson said the attempt is completely unavailing. And, to prove his point, he dug out of a big envelope what he called "this morning's crop of telegrams."

Refer to Meeting

He said they all referred to a meeting he was to hold later in the day in his chambers. The purpose of the meeting: "to hear a plea of 11 top Communist party leaders."

The supreme court recently affirmed the communists' convictions of conspiracy to advocate force or overthrow of the government. They are petitioning for another hearing.

Later Jackson took the petition under advisement. On his decision will depend whether the 11 go to jail at the end of the month.

All Identified

Jackson said the telegrams arrived at 2 o'clock. They carried his identical wording, urging bail for the communists.

"It is the stupidest kind of tactics," Jackson said. "If I am as dumb as these telegrams make me out to be, I ought not to be on the bench."

But, he said, it is typical of what happens every time a communist case is before the court.

Jackson said that, apart from these communist tactics, the U. S. Supreme Court has traditionally been free from the outside pressures brought against government executives by members of congress.

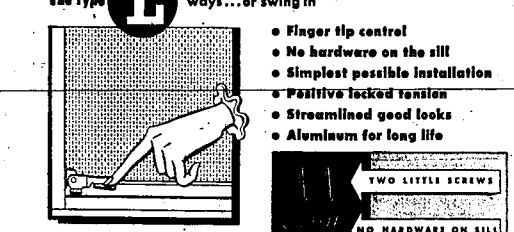
