Carl Rudeen, JEROME farmer, has used a spine affliction to good advantage.

Five years ago Rudeen was forced to give up active work on his farm and resort to crutches as a means of locomotion. He has been a resident of the Jerome area for 14 years. Prior to that he was a wheat farmer near AMERICAN FALLS.

But physical inactivity didn't mean Rudeen was going to have to stop working. There were a number of things about farming that bothered him but he never seemed to have time to do anything about them. One of the problems about which he had pondered at odd times was the loss of time and waste caused by breaking twine when hay is being baled.

As a result of his studies Rudeen has perfected a twin knoter for hay balers which eliminates breakage. Normally, the hay baler ties the bales with a tight twine. Rudeen explains it is the pressure on the twine that causes it to break. Rudeen's twine knoter ties the twine while it is loose.

The new knoter was put into operation last summer for the first time and tests indicated it would work as Rudeen had said it would. He has applied for a patent on his idea and this summer plans to demonstrate the twine knoter to representatives of firms making hay balers. Rudeen's knoter can be attached to any existing baler.

If all hay baling in the country had the attachment, Rudeen estimates, the savings in twine alone for one year would amount to several hundred thousand dollars.





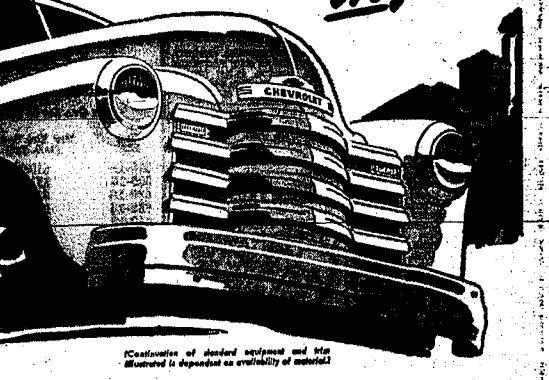

ney, even though only a small percentage of the original crowd stayed to watch them down.

The youths and adults who purchased the entertainment shuttled the calves down a temporary unloading chute built against the plane. Swiger remarked, "I see now that this is the way to ship them."

It is the company's first attempt to ship cattle by air although it is nothing unusual for the Flying Tiger line. Swiger quoted the price of 130 to 140 pound purebred calves at \$20 per head plus about \$15 per head shipping charge.

The interior of the C-46 had a red-canvas appearance for operation "Moo"; as the airline termed it. An enormous canvas had covered the floor of the plane and parts of the sides to protect the airplane from waste materials.

False flooring was installed to give the calves solid footing and the cabin was divided into four sections to bunch the calves into groups. Sawdust and straw on the floor completed the canvas atmosphere.

Actual flying time was eight hours with the other four hours of the journey being consumed by stops at Omaha, Denver and Salt Lake City.

For the many persons who wondered how so many calves could be carried in a single airplane, the explanation is that the size of the plane in the air fleet varies. The plane had a good load, according to Swiger and Flight Capt. D. E. Sanders, but there was enough room for the calves to lie down.

A steady stream of cars arrived at the airport from 7:30 p.m. until after 8:30 p.m. Friday to witness the calves arrive. The crowd was estimated to be mostly as high as 10,000.

It said it was as large a crowd as ever appeared at the airport. An accurate estimate was impossible since most cars left as soon as it was learned the arrival time would be much later.

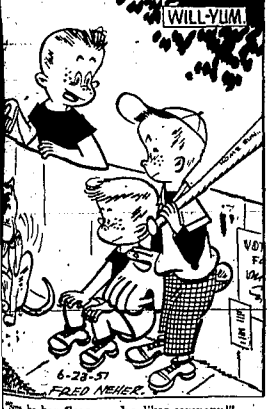

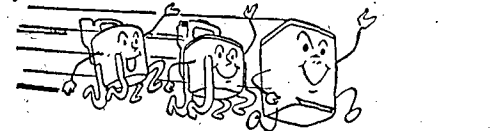
