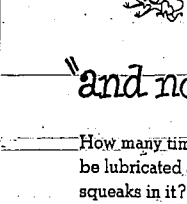

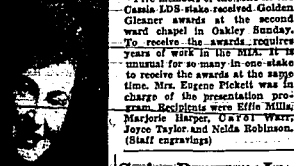

Only two children were registered in the class before the first deadline, not enough to warrant a class. 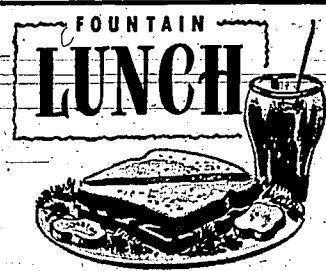
