Peters said company officials realize how difficult it is to keep small children away from the canal, but he said he would request the cooperation of parents in being especially cautious. He said he has especially cautioned his own children to stay out of the canal.

Aside from the danger of drowning, Peters said, great loss would result to crops if water had to be turned out of the canal system to find bodies of drowning victims.

He said he feels a campaign against the annual loss of life through drowning is as important as the campaign against drunken and reckless drivers and other highway hazards.

Divorce Is Asked By T. F. Woman

Wanda White filed suit for divorce in district court Friday against Llewellyn White. She charges he kept her previous bodily injury and mental suffering.

The Twin Falls couple was married here May 24, 1948 and has a 10-month-old daughter.

Mrs. White asks custody of their daughter, \$75 per month to support the child, \$150 for alimony and support of herself, \$125 suit money and \$50 for Ray age, her attorney.

Also, the plaintiff asks that community property, which she estimates to be worth \$7,825, be awarded her and that her husband be enjoined from disposing of it pending the outcome of the action.

Residents Are Cautioned on Weed Growth

They include Nampa Asphalt and Paving company, Nampa, \$21,736 for seal coating on 10.2 miles of the Mountain Home air base road and 14.4 miles of U. S. 30 from Mountain Home to Clark in Blaine county. Engineer's estimate is \$31,725. The other project was in Benewah county.
