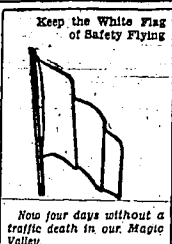

The automatic toaster will produce 300 slices of toast per hour, and the toast will fall into a special Toast-master warmer where it will be kept warm until it is served. There is a deep fat fryer and a special oven for barbecues and roasts.
The kitchen has four Hotpoint electric stoves and several hot plates, each of which has a bakins oven. There are two sinks for washing utensils and plenty of space for utensils not in use or waiting to be washed.
There are two 30 quart mixers, two soup blenders, a 20 gallon capacity case and a tilting type Xetile with 70 gallons capacity. There are three compartment steamers, a food chopper with a capacity of five pounds of fresh meat, a meat grinder which can handle 10 pounds per minute, a steam chef which handles seven and one-half bushels of "vegetables" and "other" food choppers.
Baking equipment includes three ovens which can bake 40 pounds of bread each. The hospital will bake its own pies and cakes and may bake some of its own bread. There are racks for storing bread, a baker's table and a bread rizer.
In the center of the kitchen, over the stove, is a rangehood. It is equipped with a suction fan which removes odors and smoke from within the kitchen and carries them directly to the roof and out of the building.
Other equipment includes a vegetable peeler which can trim 20 pounds of vegetables in between one and three minutes.
How does the order list of Magic Valley Memorial hospital compare with that of the average household? Well, Miss Noble points out that about 46 pounds of meat were used for each meal at the old hospital and more will be used at the new hospital when more patients take advantage of its tremendous facilities.
for storage of garbage before it is taken outside.
The kitchen is completely departmentalized, with meat, vegetable bakery and salad departments having their own sections and handy facilities. The hospital will not employ a special baker, as Miss Noble is pleased with the baking done by her regular night cook.
Other equipment includes a 15-gallon ice cream box, two coffee urns which hold six gallons of coffee, storage cabinets and washing facilities.
After dirty dishes leave the conveyor belt, glasses are rinsed and washed separately. Dishes are moved to a special table where leftover food is removed into a special garbage bucket. An electric steamer sterilizes and washes the dishes. They are placed on racks until needed.
On one side of the conveyor belt are three stainless steel meat pans on the hot steam table. There are sections for warm rolls and bread.

Equipment, Arrangement Excellent for Magic Valley Memorial Hospital Kitchen
A kitchen four times as large as that in the old hospital will serve your new Magic Valley Memorial hospital. Containing equipment costing \$39,000, it will be in charge of both Noble, chief dietitian, who will supervise about 20 employees. Contrary to popular belief, Miss Noble does not expect to need a staff much larger than that of the old hospital. This is possible because of the elimination of personnel to carry the trays to different floors. Much of this work will be eliminated by the dumbwater-conveyor arrangement.
At first, 20 holdover employees are expected to operate the kitchen. They will include three cooks, one substitute night-cook—one woman in the cafeteria, dining room and dietitian's office, a salad woman, two dishwashers, two persons in the special diet kitchen, three floor girls and five roving substitutes.
Miss Noble was chief dietitian at the old hospital for three years. She is a graduate of Kansas State college, Manhattan, Kan. She will work in the special dietitian's kitchen where special diets will be prepared. She also has a private office in the kitchen.
The first thing you will notice about the kitchen will be the small dressing rooms and lockers for all personnel.
The kitchen has a variety of ice boxes. A 30 cubic foot capacity box will be used for salad preparations and a similar box is available for special diets. There is a 60 cubic foot capacity refrigerator for fruit service. The 30-foot boxes have two doors and the 60-foot box has three.
Other refrigerators include a garbage-refrigerator and walk-in-refrigerators for deep freeze, dairy refrigeration, vegetables and meats. In connection with the garbage refrigerator, separate from the kitchen proper, is a garbage can sterilizer where steam is used on empty garbage cans.

Farmer to Get Higher Income From Potatoes

WASHINGTON, July 19 (Special)—Farmers' income from potatoes will be higher this summer than last, the department of agriculture forecast today.

The agency's latest report on crop prospects noted:

"Prices received by farmers for potatoes in July and August are expected to average above the very low prices received a year earlier. Intended acreage is down considerably from last year. Indicated early commercial production for summer harvest in states, for which estimates are made is down more than 6,000,000 bushels, or more than one-fourth, from last year's production.

"Also in contrast to last year, the summer crop this year will be coming to a market not already flooded with late spring potatoes. The crop in the early commercial states for late spring harvest this year is about one-third smaller than a year earlier. As usual, additional supplies not included in the early commercial estimates will be marketed from other states in July and August."

U. S. Forecast Indicates Idaho Spud Crop One-Fifth Below 1950 Plantings

The Idaho potato crop will be about one-fifth less than last year and about one per cent less than the 10-year average from 1940 to 1949, if the July 19 forecast of the forecast was correct.

The forecast was released this week by the United States department of agriculture through County Agent C. W. Duff.

Duff said he has not checked the fields in Twin Falls county yet, but points out "statistically it looks good for our growers." The federal government is not subsidizing potatoes this year. The surplus crop last year required dumping of a large quantity of potatoes.

Over the United States as a whole, acreage is down but yield prospects are termed "generally excellent" by the report. This year's prospective crop of 348,000 bushels is smaller than the production for any year since 1911. Last year's national crop was 420,000, and the government purchased nearly 100,000,000 bushels.

Growers reduced plantings 18 per cent this year, according to the report. The estimated harvest acreage of 1,809,000 acres is the smallest since 1911. The 1950 figure was 2,147,000. All states except Alabama, Delaware and parts of New York have reduced acreage, with the sharpest reduction in the central part of the country, California, year.

Oddities Cited In U. S. Effort To Aid Spain

By J. M. ROBERTS, JR.
AP News Analyst

Connected with the U. S. effort to include Spain in the European defense program are several interesting political coincidences.

France and Britain have drawn a line in the sand. On the record, they have nothing to do with Franco's fascist regime, but if the United States wants to bring another ally into camp, they will not resist actively. Britain says she still cannot condone, however, the way Franco came to power, his ruthlessness in his rise to power and his oppression of civil liberties.

Different in China

Occasionally Britain's conscience seems less sensitive about the Mao Tse-tung regime in Peking, which came to power in the same way and uses ever more terror in a China where British commercial interests are very important.

Reports that Franco is about to adopt some reforms to make his regime more acceptable to his western democracies, however, suggest military cooperation might have the eventful history of the Spanish people some good and making Spain less objectionable.

Explained

The United States, of course, cannot let Europe think she might, in case of war, abandon front-line positions of Germany in favor of a doubtful Spain pending a buildup for a war of liberation. Europe needs no more enemy occupation, and her whole cooperation in defense depends heavily upon creation of positions to diminish that threat.

The United States also needs to maintain the line that resumption of the western world is for the defense of free nations against enslavement.

The United States likewise cannot abandon the position that she is not organizing her own bloc to oppose Russia, but rather is cooperating in collective security for the free world. She can never ally herself with anyone, but she cannot afford to seem to be organizing a bloc separate, non-committed, United Nations.

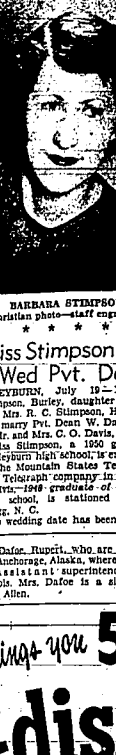

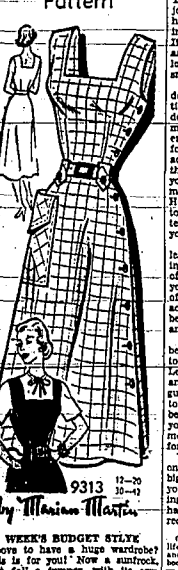

Left to Jaw Puts Champ Down for Great Ring Upset

PITTSBURGH, July 19 (AP)—Jersey Joe Walcott, incredible 37-year-old Camden, N. J., pappy guy, climaxed an amazing career to riches again Wednesday night by knocking out Ezzard Charles in five seconds of the seventh round to win the world heavyweight championship.

He is the oldest man ever to win the title. "A smashing left hook that landed flush on Charles' jaw dropped the 29-year-old Clinton Negro to his face with a stunning shock Charles tried to pull himself up and was just about to make it at the count of nine when he tumbled on his back into a neutral corner.

Walcott was a 24-1 underdog making his fifth fight for the crown. He almost won for Joe Louis in 1937. The amazing Walcott scored one of the most stunning upsets in recent history—a shocking as Ray Robinson's recent defeat by Ezzard Charles.

Walcott's payoff—punch brought a swarm of fans pouring into the ring. It was several minutes before the police could clear the invading horde.

This dazzling surprise before a whooping crowd that jammed the arena, left knocked out a Joe Louis-Charles match, tentatively scheduled for June 2 of 1949.

Walcott's however, was protected by a return match contract. He probably will meet Walcott again in the 10th round match, and the Brown Bomber will have to wait another year.

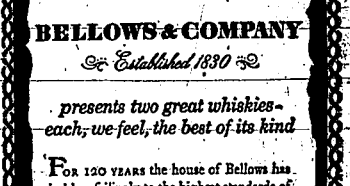

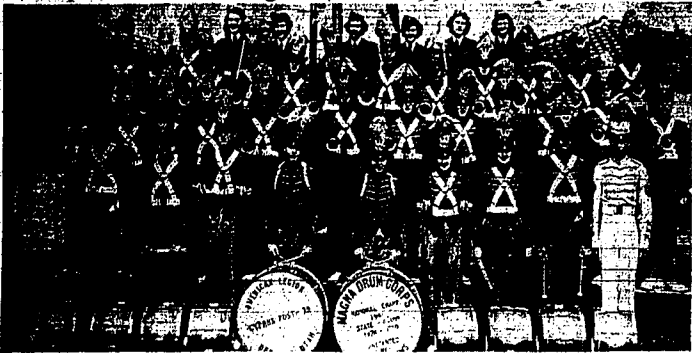

Test Nears for Rainmaking in Western Area

DENVER, July 19 (AP)—This is a critical year for weather modification activities—generally referred to as rainmaking.

The test is whether worthwhile results will come from cloud seeding weather modification attempts on a vast scale. The west is a giant proving ground.

The target terrain covers from 300,000,000 acres upward.

Projects in 17 western states add up to over 13 per cent of the nation's area. The overall figure may be 30,000,000 acres by the end of the summer.

This is the first big year for the weather modification industry. The judges of how well the weather modifiers succeed will be the farmers, ranchers and others backing individual projects with at least \$500,000.

New Mexico favored. One commercial rainmaker, Dr. Irving P. Krick, Denver, estimates his own contracts alone include 300,000,000 acres. His Weather Resources Development corporation contracts cover all New Mexico.

Even if the far-flung rainmaking efforts are generally successful, there won't be any miracles. Weather modifiers don't get rain where it isn't supposed to.

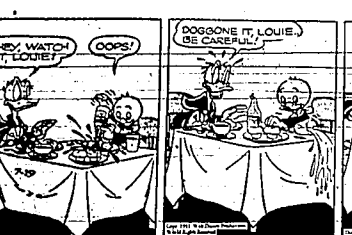

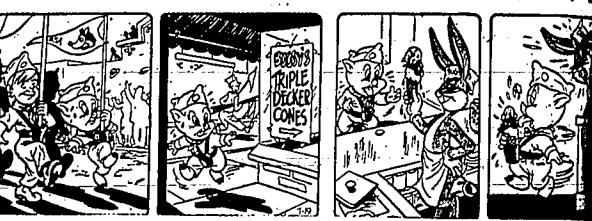

Miles of Pipe Used to Carry Water Through New Hospital

Almost synonymous with hospitals is cleanliness, and the task of keeping a hospital supple and clean requires an abundance of water. Water is used for scrubbing, surgery, central sterilization, fire protection, cooking and drinking.

In the new Magic Valley Memorial hospital these needs are satisfied by miles of copper pipe carrying water to every corner of the building. Supplied by a city water main at Martin street, water is piped to the main stop valves in the boiler room by 210 feet of six-inch pipe.

From the main valves pipelines of two-, three- and four-inch diameters take water the length of the building to the basement ceilings. Ninety smaller diameter lines carry water to the floors above the basement. Lines are again reduced in size where they attach to fixtures.

Water is supplied to 68 toilets, 112 wash basins, three bathtubs and 28 shower baths. There are 112 surgical scrub-up sinks and one sink for mixing plaster of paris.

Clear drink on the water supply include autoclave for sterilization, mechanical laundry equipment, automatic dish washers, five flushing hot sinks and 10 scullion outlets.

Hot water pipes are covered by three-fourths of an inch of asbestos. Hot water circulating "traps" return hot water the instant a tap is opened. These lines carry hot water back into the bottom of the heating tanks. Main hot water pipes connect at the top of the tank, thus hot water is never given a chance to cool by remaining in one section of a pipe.

Two tanks, 42 inches in diameter and 144 inches long, have a combined capacity of 1720 gallons of water. Steam-heating units in each tank are capable of heating more water than is carried in the tanks at any one time.

At the top of each riser line are spaces or "cushions." These serve to eliminate the "thumping" sound common when many household taps are opened.

Should any line break (which is highly improbable), control valves, accessible-through-wall-panels, may be turned off without interrupting the normal flow in other lines.

All water system installation was done by six plumbers.
