WASHINGTON, July 23 (AP)—Federal tax collections totaled a record amounting \$30,268,482,228.50 in fiscal 1951, which ended June 30, the internal revenue bureau announced today. That was a solid 10 per cent gain over the previous record high of \$43,800,337,570.99 in wartime fiscal 1945; 23 per cent above the \$28,937,131,768 collected in fiscal 1950.

It was 18 times more than the government collected only 17 years ago, in 1934—\$2,660,803.82. Individual income tax collections reached an unprecedented \$20,297,400,999.91 in 1951, running 23 per cent above the previous record of \$20,997,780,599 set in fiscal 1948. In fiscal 1950, personal income tax collections totaled \$18,574,717,433.

Corporation income and profits taxes jumped to \$14,358,670,813.48 from \$10,844,191,106 last year, but fell short of the \$18,977,212,222 peak reached in fiscal 1949.

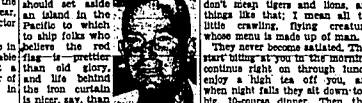
Biggest contributor among the states and territories has been New York which sent \$2,183,910,042 into the federal treasury in fiscal 1951, as compared with \$1,215,466,538 the year before.

Smallest contributor was Nevada, which has the lowest federal rates of any state in the union. Nevada sales tax collections totaled \$2,483,029.36 last year. The year before, Nevada collections totaled \$2,483,029.36.

ROME, July 23 (AP)—The state department of highways hopes to open bids by Aug. 10 on a new road between Blackfoot and the storm emergency construction project.

F. R. De Atley, Lewiston, was awarded a \$32,030 contract for constructing a crushed gravel surface on 14.8 miles of the Lewis and Clark highway between Kootenai and Lowell.

U. S. 24 Route

The board will open bids again Aug. 10 on a project to construct a plant with bituminous surface on seven miles of U. S. 30 between McCammon and Lava Hot Springs in Blaine county. A low bid of \$141,879 submitted by Farnson and Pile Construction company, Brigham City, Utah, was rejected as being 10.27 per cent above the engineer's estimate of \$127,568.

Bids for stockpiling gravel adjacent to U. S. 10 near Caldwell also were rejected. Low bid of \$20,250 was submitted by D. A. Sullivan, Parkwater, Wash. Engineer's estimate was \$15,000.
