Europe to Get 400,000 GPs

WASHINGTON, July 28 (AP)—Secretary of Defense Marshall says today that when he estimated there would be 400,000 GPs in Europe next year, he meant supply and supporting troops as well as combat units.

Marshall used the 400,000 figure in testimony yesterday to the Senate Appropriations committee. Questions arose since the figure was about twice as high as previous estimates, some of them from Marshall himself.

The meeting—19th sprinkling—began after one hour and 50 minutes. It was the longest unbroken session thus far in the negotiations.

There were no indications of any progress on the hard bargaining for a buffer zone.

Tons of Mud Left in Valley After Floods

ROY, July 28—Walls of water roaring out of canyons after an afternoon deluge Friday left tons of mud and debris on farmlands and buildings in this area today.

The flash flood struck around 8 p. m. Friday after violent thunderstorms dumped "buckets of water" and pepped hail on the area. Violent winds followed. Damage is expected to "show" over 75 per cent of the wheat crop is believed lost. No casualties were reported.



Specialist Inspects Gooding Potatoes

GOODING, July 22—Robert Peckay, state potato specialist, was in Gooding county this week observing progress of potato growth. Early dying was noted in some fields, particularly those having the longest row crop history and the lowest fertility. This disease will be found in certain seed as well as other types. Other seed borne diseases noted were mosaic and leaf roll, both spread by aphids. Ring rot, one of the worst potato diseases, was noted in some small amounts. There is no tolerance for this disease in certified seed. Ring rot spreads by any method where a portion of an infected tuber may be carried. With an infection of two or three per acre there could be considerable loss not only in production but in storage and shipment. Peckay reports that studies point to an advantage in fall plowing for potatoes. This information should lead to the practice of plowing under the third crop of hay in the fall rather than plowing under the first crop in the spring.
