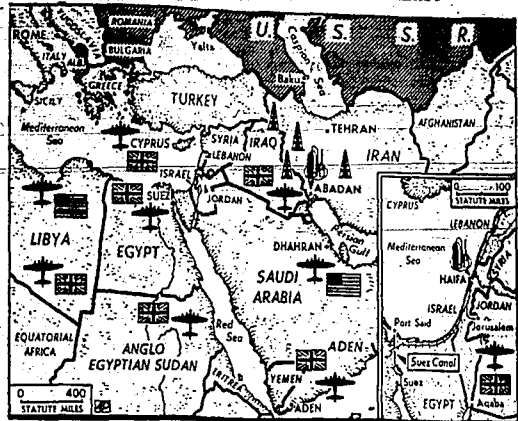

Decline Noted In '51 Profits Of U. S. Steel

NEW YORK, Aug. 1 (AP)—United States Steel corporation, biggest in the industry, has reported net income of \$20,153,716, equal to 11.9 cents a common share, for the second quarter of 1951. This compares with \$20,251,500, or 12.54 a share, in the like period a year ago.

Directors declared a dividend of 75 cents a share on the common stock, the same amount paid in preceding quarters. It is payable Sept. 10, to holders of record Aug. 10.

The income report brought U. S. Steel's net earnings for the first six months of 1951 to \$106,737,497, or \$3.81 a common share, against \$119,097,228, or \$4.03 a share, in the similar 1950 period.

The report noted this decline occurred despite higher production and sales. Provision for federal income taxes amounted to \$180,000,000 in the first half of the year against \$245,500,000 in the same months of 1950.
