

Part of Red Line Concession Seen By U. N. Source

ADVANCE HEADQUARTERS, Korea, (Friday) — The weather deadlock on where to draw the 38th parallel, the reds have been waiting for a buffer zone centered on the parallel.

What Nam meant by "deep" was not explained, but the North Korean radio at Pyongyang declared the allies were demanding a "300-mile" concession, approximately halfway between the 38th and 35th parallels.

Red Claims "A lot of malarky." The allies have made no such north-reaching demand. The line they want is where the troops are now, 10 miles or more south of what the reds say is being demanded.

Whether this reasoning was correct or not, it will look like a communist victory. Negotiations will try again today at a meeting scheduled for 11 a. m. (4 p. m. Thursday, MST).

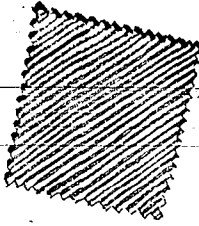

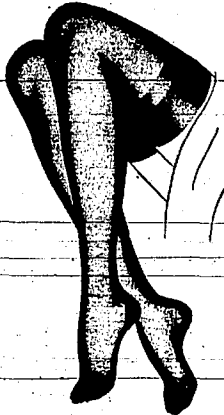

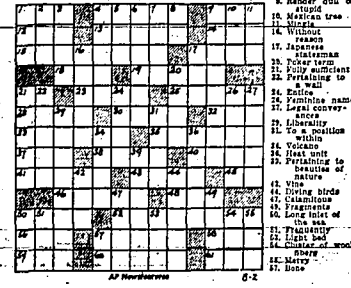

HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 2 (AP)—American-style democracy has raised the merry dickens in the Japanese home, pretty Michiko Suda says, Japan's leading lyric soprano, ballerina.

"The ancient, traditional and honorable supremacy of the Japanese male has been swept into the discard by the introduction of women's suffrage."

"With the result Japan is now full of hempered husbands," Miss Suda said.

"The freedom and democracy you introduce is very good," she said. "And much needed. But the Japanese woman misunderstands about what is the freedom."

"Oh what hurrying home after work there is now compared to before the war," she said. "Japanese husbands now very anxious to please."

"The Japanese teen-age misses misinterprets the freedom even more than their elders."

"They no longer listen to mother and father."

"Japanese high school girls, she said, are taught at school about the new freedom."

"And then they see moving pictures and watch G.I.'s and they think freedom means slacking off and having fun all the time."

"Before the war, it seems, Japanese law prohibited young girls from leaving home unaccompanied. A Japanese had to reach 21 before she got rid of the chaperone."

"Now they start going out at 15 and 16—just like the G.I.'s tell about the girls back home. They go to night clubs and bars."

"They stay out until 2 and 3 o'clock in the morning."

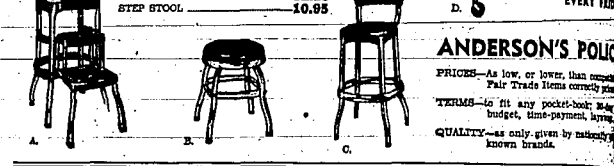
