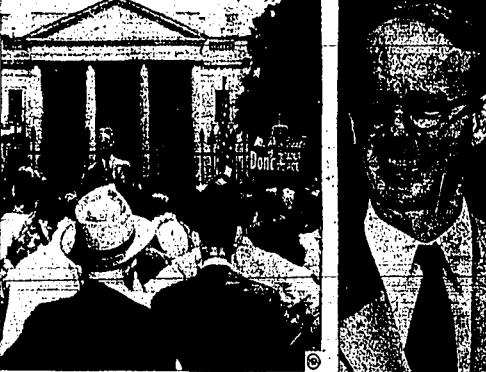


Smashes Crops; Farmers Adding up Heavy Storm Losses

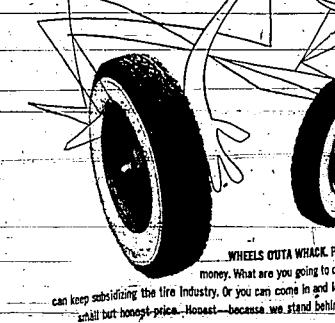

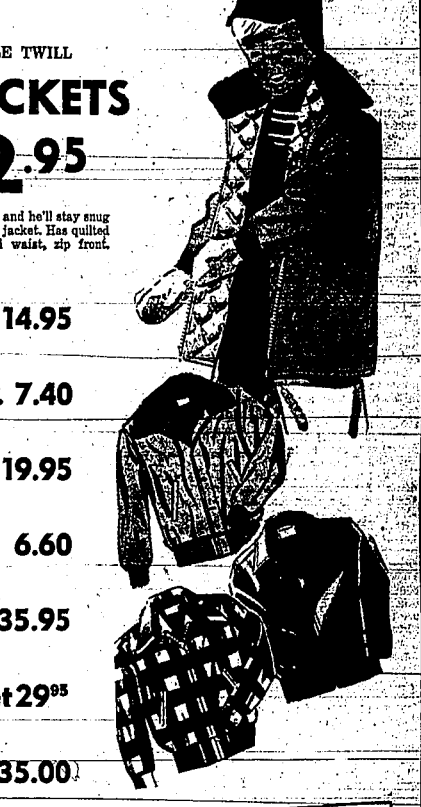

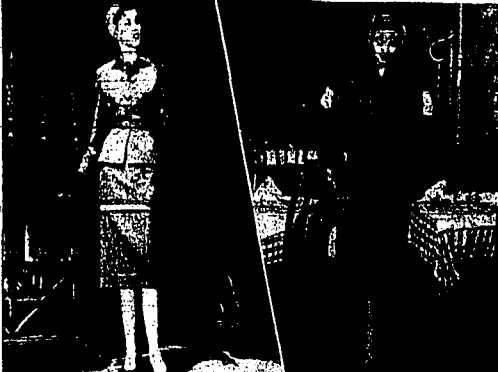

Blaik May Leave in Wake of Army Scandal

WEST POINT, N.Y., Aug. 6 (AP)—The question of whether Col. Earl (Red) Blaik will resign as Army's head football coach was tossed about in sports circles today as the result of the order dismissing 30 cadets—many of them his top gridiron stars—for cheating in examinations.

The Army steadfastly has refused to name names. But well founded reports said 40 or more football players were among the 30 involved in the scandal that rocked the United States military academy.

Two of the players who figured prominently in Blaik's plans for another great Army team have said their parents said they were not connected with the violation of the academy's honor code.

If reports are true, Blaik's varsity squad has been tipped, caustic. Graduation last spring looked 10-0 on the team that rolled through 20 straight victories before losing to Navy 14-3 last fall. And now the dismissal order, taking players that figured to sign with the Black Knights (the feared power of the gridiron).
