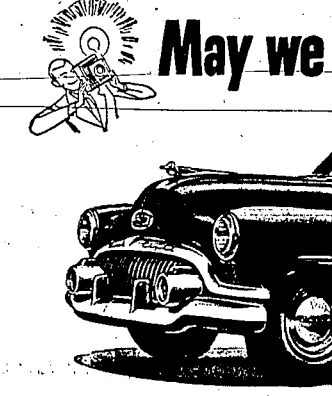

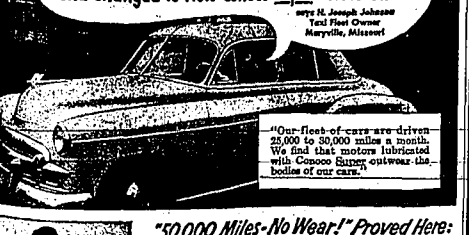

Tray Conveyor Saves Time at New Hospital

Trays Moved by Automatic Dumbwaiter to 5 Floors of New Hospital Structure

There is no danger of the trays slipping or of food spilling as they slide down the grooves into which the trays fit snugly. The machine will stop if the trays do not fit correctly as they enter the shaft. After that, there is no problem.

The speed of the conveyor is regulated by the speed in which tray girls can remove the trays and place them on carts at the delivery windows. When a cart is filled on a particular floor, the tray girl informs the kitchen over the inter-communications system and the photo-electric beam on another floor is turned on. Only one floor is served at a time.

If an emergency arises, or if for any reason a tray girl wishes to stop the operation after she removes a tray, she touches the inside lodge at the receiving window on her floor. That stops it.

The conveyor moves to the ceiling of the fifth floor. It returns from the fifth floor carrying empty trays and dirty dishes on the re-
