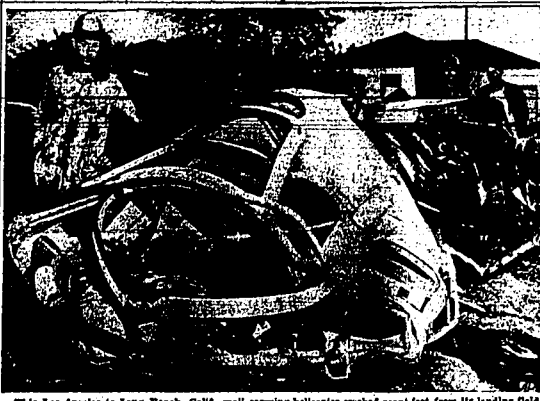

Oxygen Setup Is Feature of Hospital Here

To groups visiting the Magic Valley Memorial hospital while still in the construction stages one feature, more than "nearly any other," was singled out for comment.

Visitors noted in each patient room, delivery room and operating room, small pipes extending from the wall about bed level. These were the outlets for the centralized oxygen supply.

By merely opening a valve oxygen will flow into the room, or as in practical use, into oxygen tents. With the new system heavy oxygen tanks, previously hauled from outside to where needed, are eliminated.

The central supply for these outlets is located in a separate room in the rear northwest corner of the hospital. Its only entrance is from an outside single door. Ten oxygen tanks are hooked together by a manifold. Full tanks may be added and empty ones removed without interrupting the normal flow.

Copper lines carry the oxygen. A main line running the length of the building has riser lines traveling to each floor. Like water lines, control valves accessible through wall panels can halt the flow in case of break or leakage.

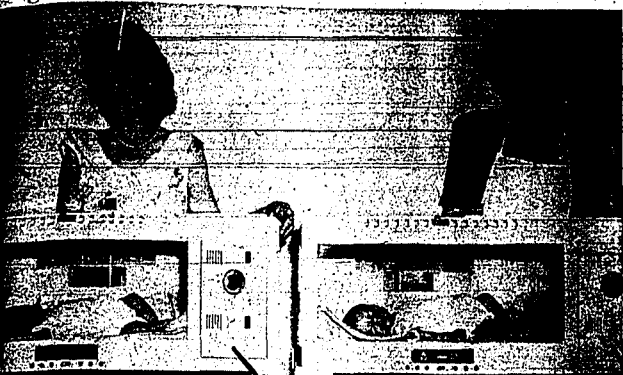

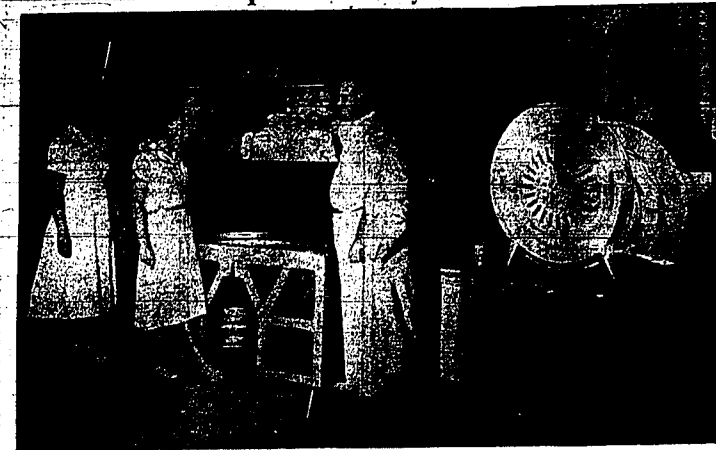

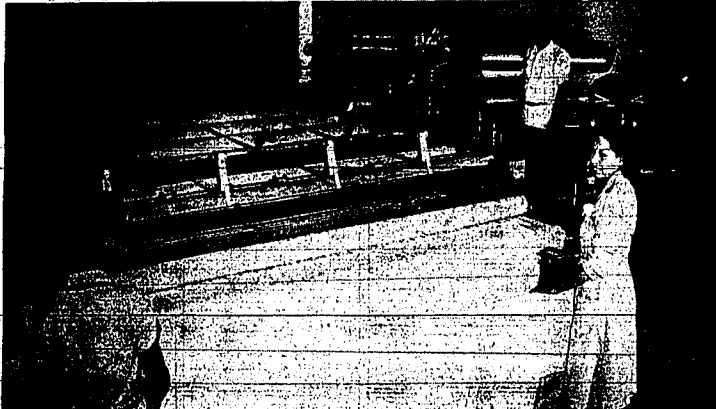

New Hospital's Laundry Large Enough To Service Town of 2,000 Population

A laundry large enough to serve a town of about 2,000 people will provide your new Magic Valley Memorial hospital with clean linen a daily basis. Laundry equipment cost \$28,000 installed.

The laundry has American Laundry company equipment installed under the supervision of a company representative, with the assistance of employees of Delwater Bros., Inc., Twin Falls.

Equipment includes large and small washing machines, large and small extractor, starch tank, large container, two hot air dryers, large tending machine, two complete sets of unit presses, ironing board and steam iron.

The large washing machine will hold between 300 and 500 pounds of laundry. It will handle a day's linen change without too much difficulty.

From the large washing machine, the laundry clothes automatically enter the large extractor. An overhead crane picks up the container and drops the laundry into the starch boiler.

Moisture is removed in the large extractor, and the linen is ready for ironing. For laundry which does not need to be ironed, two hot air dryers complete the drying process.
