Farm District to Elect Supervisors

SHOSHONE, Aug. 31—Three supervisors for the Wood River soil conservation district will be elected Dec. 4.

The three supervisors whose terms expire on Jan. 1, 1962, are Walter Reichart, Dietrich, Earl McWilliams, North Shoshone, and Clarence Brunner, Marley-Burham area.

For the purpose of obtaining nominating petitions the district has been divided into five supersector areas. TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—The incredible Paul Douglas, one of the few liberal wood-punchers, has asked the several hundred legitimate and registered lobbyists in the capital to give him suggestions and authority to create a "whirligig" commission to liberalize the ethical standards of federal officials.

"I don't want to see an I-don't-know-it-but-I'm-a-lobbyist remarked one of the nation's highest-paid special political representatives. He was the first to receive a letter from the Washington senator from Illinois. The man who is asked on the eve of his execution by the warden whether or not he would like a rare roast beef for his last supper.

The request, however, is a legitimate one. It is around results, its heart and sincerity. It recognizes official morality cannot be improved unless the Adams and Evers among the unofficial tempters cooperate. In this country, it is more likely to be taken from potential sinners against the code than from the official writers of their cloakroom and cocktail party.

VAUGHAN GETS A MEDAL

Award of the latest medal to the White House's senior military aide, Maj.-Gen. Harry W. Vaughan, has started some interesting speculation in Washington.

Vaughan's highest decoration is the Order of Juan Pablo Duarte, awarded him by the Dominican republic.

Reason for the raised eyebrows over this move is that the Dominican government has for some time been trying to get a contract for military arms for the U. S. government, or for the military assistance program, to help re-arm other foreign governments. So far, the Dominicans haven't been having any luck.

In this kind of business, of course, it is never considered a disadvantage to have an influential friend around the White House or the Pentagon. Nothing has been hung on General Vaughan in this respect, mind you. He is thus far clean as a hound's tooth on this Dominican matter.

But even as an innocent victim, by allowing himself to be decorated, he has contributed to the system of personal favor-giving which many foreign governments and their diplomats feel they have to follow to get what they want.

In the case of the Dominican arm factory, it has tried the usual front-door business approach and the hiring of an American agent. Official name of the concern which runs the Dominican arm factory is "Inc." According to papers filed with the U. S. department of justice under the foreign agents' registration act, Armeria is a branch of the Washington fronting U. S. firm.

Armeria retained the U. S. American agent organization known as Clark-Tuckerman, with offices in New York. Head of this organization is Edwin N. Clark, a retired U. S. army reserve brigadier general. Clark-Tuckerman's records show that he calls for services as technical adviser and for assistance in getting U. S. war contracts. Fees to be paid are 8 per cent of all money received from contracts.

This, raised the usual five-percenters' take for Pentagon influence peddling. But so far, Clark-Tuckerman has obtained no contract for Armeria.

The Dominican government has been simultaneously carrying on a heavy publicity campaign in the United States. There have been full page ads in eastern newspapers, talking up the industrial potentialities of the Dominican Republic. It is pictured as a land full of opportunity for American investment capital.

Still another campaign has been waged to have the Dominican raise quota raised for import into the United States.

The crowning event of all this build-up no doubt came when Dominican Ambassador Luis Thomen pinned a medal on General Vaughan's military aide.

So once more—the eyes of the public—are on the White House general with the "deep freezer" background.

NECESSARY—In general, the lobbyist maintains their presence and work at Washington are necessary to protect both the congress and the American people from the overwhelming power and pressure of the executive branch of the government. Though it seems like a bold and strong argument, it is not.

With a budget of \$50,000,000,000, a publicity organization costing at least \$100,000,000, a year and presidential election campaign spending every day in the year, the executive branch enjoys a tremendous advantage over every other interest in the country, according to the data of the vast United States, they maintain, can prevent an administration from "padding the wallet" over the congress, the courts and the people.

Clinging chapter and verse, including the reports of the Kefauver and Pulbright committees, the lobbyist says, congressmen and their constituents are lower than those of members of congress, their political friends and the so-called "fifth estate."

"There is no need for a new code or commission of ethics for government officials," wrote the smartest and most eloquent in his letter to Senator McClellan. "All they need to do is to legislate the 10-commands and the bill of rights in their inspiration."

PROPAGANDA—Under White House inspiration, New York and some other states have tried to open up on him for his unexplained prison release last year. "Lobbying" has been the name given to contract any anti-administration articles on Acheson's far eastern policy he may write for the New York Times.

Several government departments—state, treasury, justice and defense—are preparing the anti-Dewey campaign of the last year. The anti-Dewey campaign demands that Rome crack down on "Lucky" as the key figure in the worldwide dope racket.

Over the world, the lobbyist is responsible for the influx of crime-producing drugs into the United States. The FBI would destroy the Albany committee. The Albany committee is responsible because of any service he may have contributed during World War II.

President Truman's top aides—Acheson, Sawyer, McGrath and Marshall—will try to suggest that Governor Dewey failed to explain the Luciano spinster before the Executive committee because he has something to hide.

INTRIGUE—This concerted attempt to discredit the New York governor is directly with 1952 presidential politics. It is a political maneuver as a flank attack on Gen. Eisenhower's candidacy for the Republican nomination for President.

Governor Dewey was the first prominent Republican to declare for "Lucky" and to give the people some dissent among Empire state Republicans. He hopes to block the Eisenhower candidacy with New York's so-called Democrats. His best hope of winning to his friends, is to be either secretary of state or attorney general in an Eisenhower Cabinet.

Thus, in hitting at Dewey, Mr. Truman will be striking at Eisenhower. The intrigue supports the general belief that the President fears his European commander and would prefer Senator Taft or Governor Warren as a 1952 opponent.

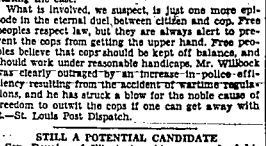

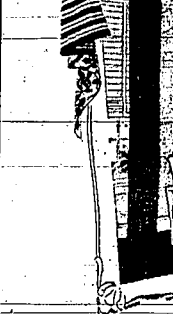

EL PASO, Calif., Aug. 11 (AP)—A navy rocket-powered airplane has set a new altitude record by climbing to what aviation experts unofficially believe was 75,754 feet (more than 14,500 miles) in 11 minutes at 1,800 miles an hour.

The superjet flight in the new rocket plane was made Aug. 10 from Edwards air force base. The exact altitude reached by the rocket jet pilot, Bill Bridgeman, was not disclosed.

Marvin Miller, Los Angeles Times aviation editor, estimated the altitude of the rocket plane to be a planned altitude. Bridgeman leveled off the Skyrocket to obtain high performance data that may have been used in the research which through space at speeds faster than 1,800 miles per hour.

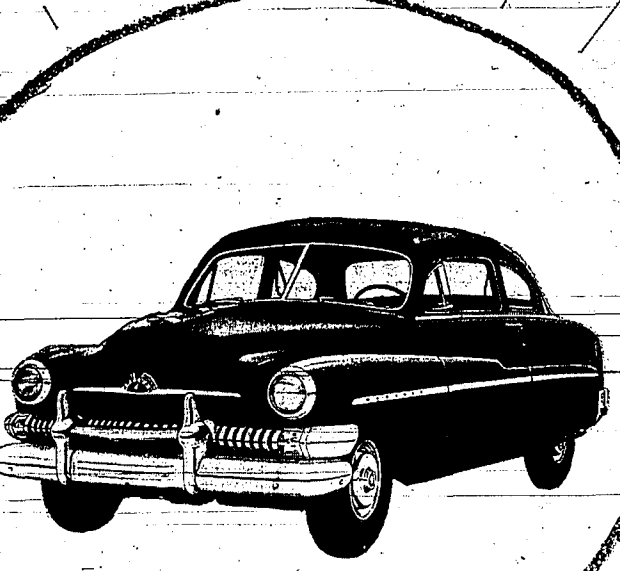
