By DOUGLAS LARSEN—The freshman senator who has won for himself in three years more comes as a surprise to those familiar with his career.

And there's no such thing as being drafted for the job. It's a critical Republican campaign.

In the midst of this feud with the President—Douglas still goes along with an earlier statement of party loyalty: "Support one's party in all procedural matters everywhere. But when the chips are down in the senate, a senator should vote his profound individual convictions on substantive matters regardless of who is with or against him."

As Douglas has not a man in these United States who wouldn't be President if he could.

But he was an avowed and outspoken liberal, and everyone eagerly wanted to see what his record would be on the senate that seemed dedicated to keeping cozy with a right-wing trend in the country.

Although he had strong labor backing, he refused to go along with labor's blatant demands for all-out repeal of the Taft-Hartley law. He said there was some good in it. Then he astonished the senate by making a speech expressing some sympathy for the southern members' side of the President's civil rights program.

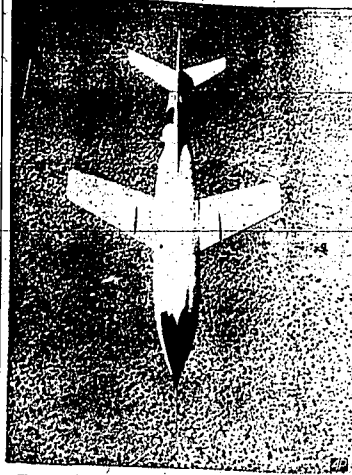

Experiment in Polio Vaccine Usage Started

PROVO, Utah, Sept. 3 (AP)—The experiment to prevent poliomyelitis parasite in human beings by vaccination with gamma globulin will begin here tomorrow, the National Foundation for Infant Paralysis announced that Dr. W. H. Murray, on leave from the University of Pittsburgh, will direct the experiment.

The experiment will be conducted on a group of 3 to 5 children in the city of Provo. It will be conducted actively from Sept. 5. The foundation says the purpose is to try out the usefulness of gamma globulin. A blood fraction, known as gamma globulin, is one of the 12,000 children in this group in Utah county.

New Mexico's Uranium Find Termed Rich

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Sept. 3 (AP)—Reports that uranium deposits recently reported on the Laguna Indian reservation are "rich and extensive" have been bolstered here as the Indians, interested in the atom-rich deposits.

The Laguna strike, which greatly extends the original "harvest mountain" find near Grants, N. M., was first reported in April when Roy Slayback, a Laguna Indian, lugged a piece of rock into a Grants newspaper office.

The conferences here featured the Laguna tribe officials, representatives of the Anasconda Copper company, the Santa Fe railroad, and the Indian service.

The Indian officials have now set a full tribal council meeting for this week to be followed by another session with the firms Friday.

Big Strike Been
Indian Service Director Eric Hagerberg has given indications that the deposits may be "huge." A member of the Laguna tribal council, John Sarracine, was quoted as saying the strike "looks like it will be big."

Meanwhile atomic energy officials who inspected the area last week were not saying anything.

Forest Closure Lifted by Jordan

BOISE, Sept. 3 (AP)—Gov. Leland B. Jordan has lifted the closure orders on certain areas of the Clearwater National Forest in the Clearwater district in northern Idaho.

The areas had been closed since July 7 because of the extensive forest fire danger.

At the same time, T. B. Murray, director of the fish and game department, responded to fishing streams in the closed areas.

Lifting of the two closure orders leaves the prior Lake timber protective district the only closed area in the state. Assistant State Game warden Steve Harnett said.

Craig explained that since under the new law voters cannot vote for trustee other than the one that is to represent the voter's own trustee district, only voters in districts two and three may vote in this election, and those voters may vote only for the trustee from their own district.

Trustee district two is composed of sections 10, 20, 21 and 22 lying directly north of Center street and trustee district three is composed of sections 27, 28, 29 and 30 lying just south of Center street.

Johnston Explains Need for Controls; They're Not Cure-All, but Help Some

WASHINGTON (AP)—For the past several months, the nation has heard an extended and often heated debate about price and wage controls.

In the course of this debate one theme has been to speedily. That is, "controls are going to hurt me and benefit somebody else."

All groups who have been affected by the farmer has said if we have effective price controls, including retroactive ones, we can expect to fare in coming months when inflationary pressures will be real rather than hypothetical.

Let's take the case of the farmer. The 1941 farm income averaged \$2,070,000,000 per month. This rose into 1950 dollars, the monthly farm income was \$2,880,000,000. In 1949, farm income was \$2,332,000,000, or 11.2 percent of the 1950 dollar equivalent of \$2,670,000,000. In January, 1951, although farm income was \$2,139,000,000, this represented only \$2,575,000,000 in terms of 1950 dollars.

In other words the farmer suffers along with the rest of the people when inflation strikes the buying power of the dollar. Although his money income may go up, his real income goes down.

Let's look at the public generally. In 1944, our per capita income was \$1,092, but this represented \$1,770 in terms of 1950 dollars. In 1950, per capita income was \$1,350. For the first quarter of this year, per capita income was \$1,401 but in terms of 1950 dollars, this represented only \$1,131.

On the basis of 1950 dollar values the average American is \$20 behind his 1944 income and \$116 behind his last year's income. That's the price we already have paid to inflation.

How about the wage earner? The average weekly earnings of production workers in 1943 was \$41.14. Translated into 1950 dollars this was \$59.52. In 1950, average weekly earnings were \$59.22. In the first quarter of this year, weekly earnings were \$64.85 but in terms of 1950 dollars they were only \$59.22—only 91 cents higher than in 1950 and actually 38 cents lower than in 1943.

Although in many some segments of the economy may appear to be getting ahead under inflation, when we translate dollars into buying power they all run behind over the long run.

increased arms production, the inflationary pressures on the economy will be vastly greater than anything we have seen to date.

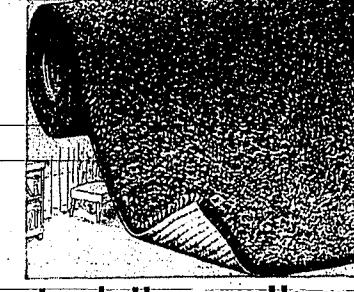
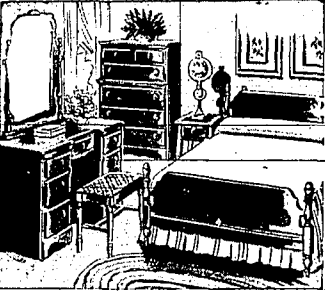

Russians Impose Tax Blockade on West Berlin Food
BERLIN, Sept. 3 (AP)—The Russian zone has dealt West Berlin's food supply a blow in what amounted to blockade by taxing the amount of food to be transported to the city. The committee has imposed a road maintenance tax on all West German and West Berlin trucks crossing the Soviet frontier. 100 miles west of this isolated city. School Compact Bill Given Senate
WASHINGTON, Sept. 3 (AP)—A resolution authorizing an interstate compact among western states relating to higher education is before the senate.
The states are Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah and Washington.
Under the resolution, any five or more of the states would be authorized to join in financing and providing joint educational facilities in the fields of technical, professional and graduate training.
It was introduced by five senators who said some of the states do not have schools of medicine, dental schools, or engineering colleges.
The senators said the principles of their resolution were approved by representatives of the western states at their annual conference at Salt Lake City in 1940.
