Delegates Ignoring Warnings of Soviet, Support Pact Plan

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 6 (AP)—Ignoring Russia's warnings of a new war in the far east, a swelling procession of delegates marched before the San Francisco conference today and declared their intention to sign the Japanese peace treaty... Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko made his quickly-defeated attempt to break the conference and derail the treaty. El Salvador's ambassador to Washington, Hector David Castro, took the rostrum to praise the pact and announce his country would sign... It was followed quickly by Ambassador Wilfrido Munibos, Magentier, Norway; Jacques M. Leger, Haitian minister of foreign affairs; Ambassador Mohammed Kamil Bey Abdul Rahim, Egypt's envoy to the United States; Crown Prince Norodom Ranariddh of Cambodia and J. J. Jarewardene, finance minister of Ceylon... They all either stated or made clear their intentions to sign the pact. Some had reservations. Wheat Cassia Is it by Smut

Sept. 6—Although smut is a major pest of wheat in this county, it is not as common as it was some years ago, according to Glenn L. Bodilly, agricultural extension agent.

His recommendation for wheat is to grow resistant varieties to clean and treat all seed. Treating the seed with a fungicide is the best method of reducing smut. Jim's at It Again; This Time He's Trying to Make It Rain

JEROME, Sept. 6—Jim Sanberg, 17-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. L. W. Sanberg, is at it again.

This time he's trying to help increase the rainfall in the American Falls area. Jim is one of three fellows who's always finding odd jobs to do and when he isn't working at that he's busy tending flies, since he's quite a fisherman. But he also sells flies to make money for experiments.

He also raises rabbits and keeps the neighborhood supplied which also fills his purse.

This summer, though, he's had a different kind of a job. He's been operating a silver iodide nuclear generator that is supposed to help increase precipitation during a storm.

Jim has been helping O. Rex Yeaman and Gordon Dixon, both of whom are professors at Richs college, Rexburg? They have been working on a scientific experiment to increase rainfall and have contracts with farmers in the American Falls area. They placed 11 generators between Rogerson and Mackay and have operators at each station.

Jim works by the hour, that is from the time he receives a telephone call to run the generator.

Korean War's Biggest Fight Believed Due

It's possible the biggest, battle of the Korean war will break out within the next 10 days. Both sides are muscled up for it, and the rival generals are waiting for the rival precedents and pressures to make up their minds.

The tempo of the fighting has been stepped up during the last few days, but so far it has not taken on the aspects of an all-out battle. The Communists have been pushing their communists in an attempt to keep them off balance and slow down their big build-up.

Stalling Obvious

Communist stalling on the truce talks has been obvious for the last two weeks. Equally obvious are two reasons:

1. They want to see how the Japanese peace treaty conference comes out at San Francisco.
2. They need time to build up their air force and to restructure the U. N. so no longer will have such overwhelming superiority.

Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway is ready either to resume talking or resume fighting. The decision on what happens will be made in Moscow and Peking, and it is a decision that cannot be postponed much longer.

At Crossroads

Stalin and Mao Tse-tung, the Chinese communist leader, are at the point where they are going to have to bow out of Korea with whatever grace they can summon or risk everything on a big throw of the dice.

There is no longer is any doubt that Stalin has reached into the pockets of the European satellites of Russia to reinforce the Red armies in Korea. That does not mean Russia, Czechoslovakia and Poland, and other Communist troops are getting ready to storm the U. N. lines. But it does mean that the Red armies in Korea have been sent from communist factories to Korea.

Most of them probably are East Germans, Czechs and Poles. Their role is to work behind the scenes—to man the anti-aircraft guns and keep the Red planes in condition to fly. The ground fighting still will be done by the Chinese and North Koreans.

LONDON, Sept. 9 (AP)—A British astrophysicist said today man some day may rocket to Mars on a beam of electricity.

Dr. J. S. Shephard, one of this country's leading physicists, said the strange space craft could operate between an artificial moon of the earth and one of the tiny Martian moons.

Shephard, a research expert at the main British government atom laboratory in Harwell, also is technical director of the British interplanetary society.

He described his ion-rocket in a paper prepared for the 12-nation second international congress of astronautics—space navigation—now in progress here.

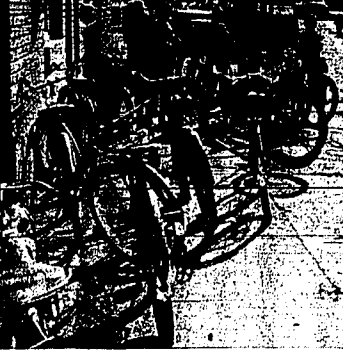

Bicycle Licensing Deadline Passed; Many Need Tags

Press Committee Seeks Ouster of Soviet Reporters

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8 (AP)—The standing committee of the congressional press galleries turned over to the justice and state departments today charges that the Russian news agency Tass is propaganda and intelligence agency of the Soviet government.

The committee of five correspondents voted unanimously to refuse privileges of the galleries to new employees of Tass until the charges made by the American Society of Newspaper Editors (ASNE) are investigated.

ASNE called on the committee to expel Tass men from the galleries, to throw all Tass reporters out because they are "agents of a foreign government, not newspaper correspondents."

Sen. Herbert O'Connor, D., Md., asked congress to expel Tass men from the galleries and to crack down on reporters from other communist countries in relation to the jailing of William N. Ostia, Associated Press reporter, on trumped up spy charges in Czechoslovakia.

Care for Your License Plates, Folks; Only Tabs Slated in '52

BOISE, Sept. 8 (AP)—Metal tabs covering the '51 on your present Idaho automobile license will be used during 1952, Wayne Summers, new law enforcement commissioner, announced today.

New truck plates will be issued, with the county designations being dropped. The 1952 truck licenses will be white letters on a maroon background—the same as this year.

Production on the tabs and the 1952 truck plates is expected to start about Sept. 15 at the penitentiary's factory, Warden L. E. Clapp said.

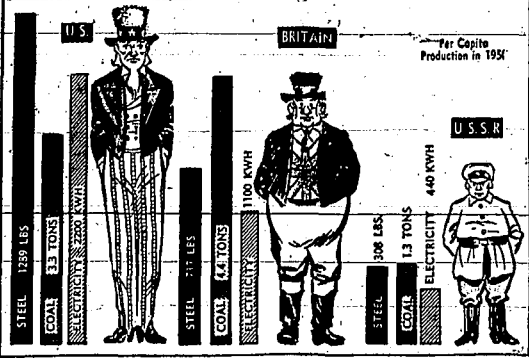

Survey Finds Superstitions Are Replaced

CHICAGO, Sept. 6—A lot of old superstitions and mabelisms are dying out, a psychologist says. But new ones keep cropping up, and the A-bomb probably will spawn a lot more.

Many superstitions or misconceptions current in 1925 apparently are becoming extinct, Dr. Eugene Levitt, Columbia university, told the American Psychological association. These include:

Children are born with instinctive knowledge of good or evil.

Certain lines in a person's hand foretell his future.

Stare at a person's back, and you can make him turn around.

Women are inferior to men in intelligence, but they're purer and better by nature.

A square jaw is a sign of will-power, and a high forehead means you're bright.

You can get any mental or physical disease just by thinking of it.

The person who doesn't look you in the eye is probably dishonest.

Compared with the same questionnaire given to 218 college students in 1925.

Far smaller numbers still thought the statements were true, he said.
