At 25, she is the oldest to wear the crown and makes the record height of Miss America of 1945, Rose Meyer, five-foot, 107-lb. Colan Hutchins is the first blond to win the title in 13 years.

### State Police Will Check Weights of Trucks in Region

The Idaho state police will set up mobile checking stations in Blaine Valley next week for the purpose of checking violations of weight limitations on trucks. State Police Lieut. Clark Hand announced Saturday.

The checking stations will be set up on both highways and country roads. Lieutenant Hand points out that 18,000 pounds is the weight limit on any one axle regardless of how many pounds the truck may be licensed for.

Hand points out there is no point in purchasing a license for more than a truck can legally carry on each axle. He points out that it is almost always impossible to carry 18,000 pounds on the front axle of a two axle truck.

On the rear axle of a two axle truck, the maximum weight allowed is seven feet apart on the rear of trucks, the maximum weight allowed is 12,000 pounds on that set of axles.
