Cloud Seeding Is OK'd to Increase Flow of Columbia

Portland, Ore., Sept. 25 (AP)—The Bonneville power administration turned to minimizing today to help out in the Pacific northwest's power shortage. It announced a contract for cloud seeding in the upper reaches of the Columbia system. The seeding, Administrator Paul J. Raver said, will start immediately and if the results are up to the promise, the average Columbia river flow will be increased by 1,200 cubic feet per second during October, November and December.

The Columbia, falling steadily, had a flow into the reservoir at Grand Coulee dam today of about 58,000 cubic feet per second. That is 1,900 cubic feet per second less than yesterday, and the forecast is for a flow of 57,000 cubic feet at Grand Coulee by Thursday. That figure will equal the lowest average September reading since records were started in 1912.

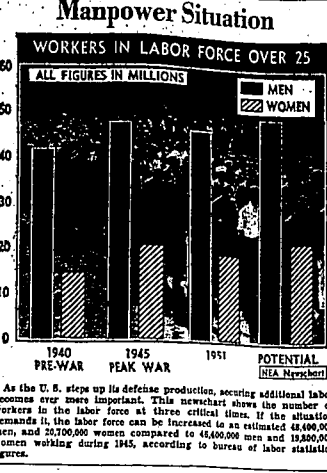

"The chunks are made of ordinary uranium, not refined to the point where it could be used in a bomb," said McMahon, chairman of the Senate House Atomic Energy Committee.

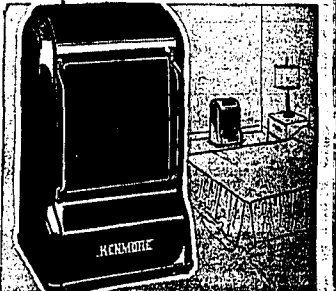
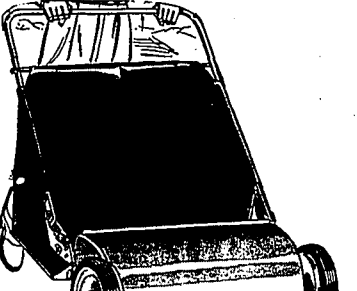
