

Argentina Revolt Crushed Quickly, Radio Says

BUENOS AIRES, Sept. 23 (AP)—The state radio broadcast and civil war broke out in Argentina to be crushed swiftly, with its leaders in flight or arrested.

After the reported flight or capture of the leader, Gen. Peron appeared on the balcony of the presidential palace. A multitude of workers, ordered to assemble by the government-controlled labor confederation, had gathered.

Argentina dishonored the uniform of the fatherland," Peron told the crowd. "The most of our leaders and officials are near this uniform with honor."

Peron declared there were many honorable soldiers who knew their duty was to Argentina. The revolution was the work of an insignificant minority but the great majority of the army forces supported the government.

"To the scaffold!" yelled many in the crowd. Peron said officers responsible for the law, which would be inoperative, would be executed.

Peron said the state radio would broadcast the names of military men joining the revolt. He said the big army at Palomar was the main force.

Union spokesmen here said the vote was being cast last night and early today at local meetings in the southwest.

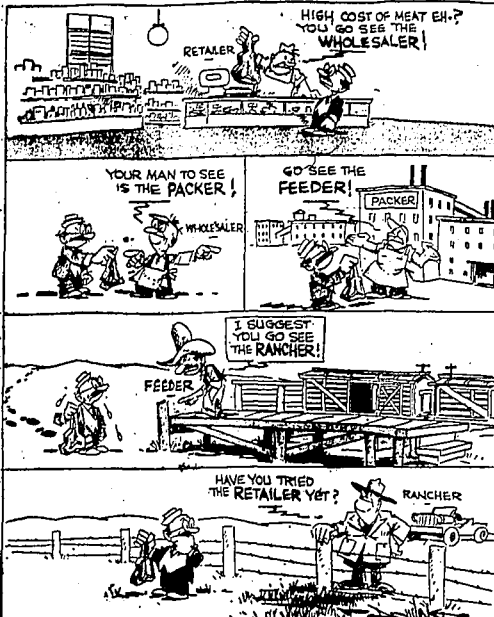

### Central U. S. Is Shivering In Cold Wave

Escape Killed Frost  
Chicago weather forecasters said it appeared that the cold belt would escape killing frost. The coldest temperature recorded at midnight was 31—just freezing—at Spencer, Mo.

The cold mass invaded the United States from Canada. It was creeping in eastward about 25 miles an hour and was expected to rout the comparatively balmy temperatures along the Atlantic seaboard.

Except for parts of Washington and Oregon, clear skies covered most of the nation. Some snow fell in upper Michigan.

Lower Than Normal  
The cold front in the cold front had brought temperatures lower than normal throughout the Pacific Coast. In San Francisco, where temperatures were in the 20's the normal low for this time of year is 48.

Violent winds which preceded the cold front and caused 12 deaths in California, Idaho, Nevada and Utah roared northward, the weather bureau said. They were reported here at James Bay, Canada.

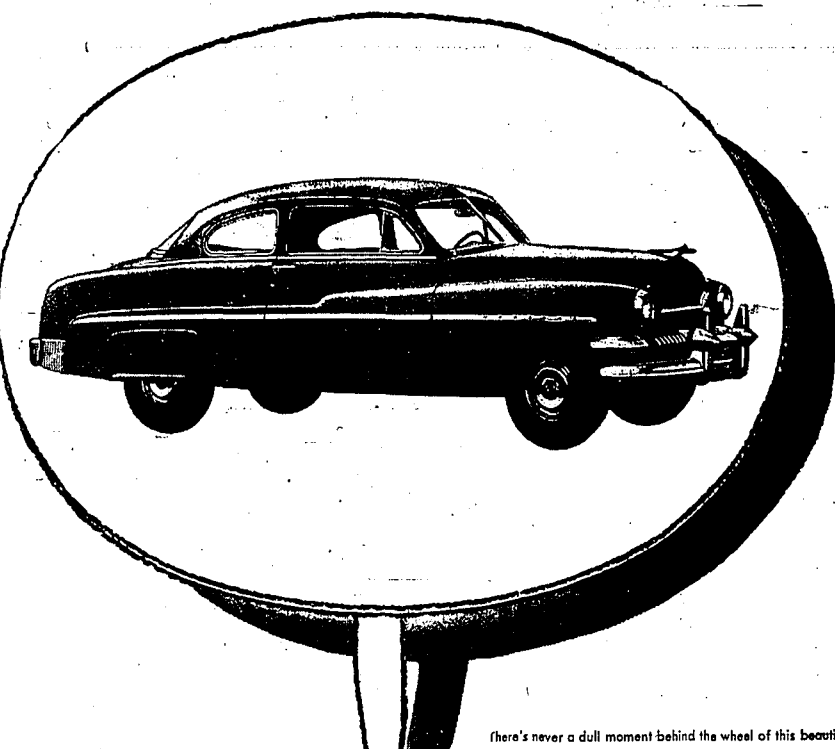

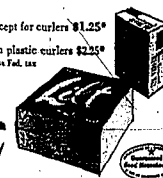
