U. S. Still Has More Ways of Czech Action

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3 (AP)—Officials dealing with U. S. Czech relations said today the United States still has cards to play against communist Czechoslovakia even after two sharp economic moves yesterday.

The top actions are expected to wipe out most of the sales of Czechoslovak goods in this country. That has amounted recently to \$2,500,000 a month, despite ever-worsening political relations between the two countries.

Tariff Concessions End
 The first move was by President Truman. He announced that, beginning Nov. 1, tariff concessions to Czechoslovakia under the terms of a multilateral trade pact would be suspended.

Shortly thereafter the state and treasury departments got off an economic double-play applying to between 75 and 90 per cent of Czech exports to the U. S.

Certificates Required
 The treasury announced that shipments arriving from Czechoslovakia without required certificates signed by the U. S. consulate in Prague would be assessed a penalty equal to their full value. And the state department said handily its consuls in Prague are too busy to issue such documents without indefinite delay.
