Crime Prober Is Blasted by Florida Chief

GATLINBURG, Tenn., Oct. 4 (AP).—Gov. Fuller Warren, Florida, has announced that Edwin Keafer, of Tenn., as a "madly ambitious political shyster," but Republican Gov. Val Peterson, Nebraska, called the Tennessee a "grand American."

Warren's outburst came in the final session of the 43rd annual governors' conference at the state officials were discussing problems of organized gambling and crime.

Warren did not call Keafer by name, but he left no doubt he was hitting at the Tennessee shyster, known as "that ambition-crased cotermin" and that "slyster politician who is running down my neck and I believe, fully for the vice presidency of the United States."

Governors of States Mixed On '32 Views

GATLINBURG, Tenn., Oct. 4 (AP).—The nation's governors were united on many state problems but split into four distinct political factions as they went home today from their annual conference.

With Republican Gov. Val Peterson, Nebraska, elected conference chairman, the governors demonstrated that both parties are divided in advance of the presidential campaign.

Peterson, elected in a non-partisan atmosphere in which Democrats and Republicans are alternated as chairmen, is a member of a Republican party faction campaigning to obtain the GOP presidential nomination for Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Representing the other wing of the Republicans, Utah Gov. J. Bracken Lee endorsed yesterday's presidential session with demands that the governors lay aside a scheduled discussion of law enforcement and turn to what he called the "real issues" of deficit spending, high taxes and threats of communism.

In the political activity, Republican governors were identified themselves in the party's so-called international camp rallied to the Eisenhower campaign under the leadership of Gov. Thomas S. Dewey, New York.

Those who seemed determined to put the emphasis in next year's presidential drive on domestic issues and who don't go along with many of the major phases of the Truman administration's foreign policy gravitated to the camp of Sen. Robert A. Taft, Ohio, along with Lee.

The Democrats also were divided into two camps.

One faction, represented by such governors as Michigan's G. Mennen Williams, is backing President Truman for another term. The other faction, headed by Gov. James F. Byrnes, South Carolina, made it plain he intends to leave no stone unturned in his effort to prevent Mr. Truman's nomination and to defeat him at the polls in November, 1936, if he runs again.

Catholic Church in Jerome to Be Dedicated on Sunday

St. Jerome's Catholic church in Jerome will be dedicated at services beginning at 10 a.m. Sunday. The church is open to the public for general inspection from 1 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. Sunday. (Staff engraving)

The Catholic church in Jerome dates back to 1809 when the north side tract was first beginning to be settled. Mass was celebrated that year in the homes of Catholics by the Rev. Father Eugene Boggers, Shoshone. The original group of parishioners was made up of seven Catholic families and three single men. Of that group Mr. and Mrs. D. A. L'Hercion and Maurice V. Wolfe still reside in Jerome.

The first church, a small frame building seating 40 persons, was built in 1911. This first building was enlarged a number of times and in 1920 it was made large enough to seat 100 persons. The Rev. Father Francis LaBelle was the first resident priest and Bishop D. M. Gorman established Jerome as a parish in 1922 and named it St. Jerome.

The present parish house was started in 1927. Bishop Zewand recently appointed the present pastor, the Rev. Father Schermsman, who arrived from Wallace, Nov. 10, 1934. St. Jerome's parish had two Sunday masses for the first time on May 1, 1935, when Gooding was removed as a mission. With the parish growing it became necessary starting Feb. 22, 1948 to have three masses each Sunday. At present Jerome has 25 Catholic families.

The church is English tudor in architecture, is brick veneered and has cast stone trim. It will seat 350 people. Distinctive about the church are two large sculleries with a passageway, a soundproof mother's room and 12 aluminized fluorescent lighting fixtures in baskers bronze to match the ceiling coat for wood work. All the sanitary appointments are of white oak. The church, completely furnished, cost approximately \$45,000.

The entire church is furnished

with stained glass windows of imported and domestic antique glass. The "choir" windows are for subject the "Infant Jesus of Nazareth." The 16 main windows contain full length pictorial subjects. All but six of the 31 windows are donated. The swinging bell came from France, weighs 710 pounds and has a diameter at the base of two feet and eight inches. It was blessed Oct. 1, 1951, and is a gift of A. W. Greiving.

Outstanding is the marble altar which came from St. Albans, Boise, through the courtesy of Sister Alma Dolores. The pure white Italian marble is laid with Grecian skyros, tinted in delicate purple and blue. The altar stands about 15 feet, has a screen-foot and six-inch table and weighs about five tons.

The 40 pews are made of northern Wisconsin gray pine with a divided center support, have hat holders and sponge rubber kneelers. Completely installed they cost approximately \$8,000.

The stations of the cross are of modern type with raised figures 1 1/2 inches high, finished in two-tone bronze with a red background. Installed they cost \$400 and are a gift of the parish children.

The members of the building committee—for the church include: Charles Weidlich, Chairman; D. A. L'Hercion, Charles J. Marshall, N. F. Trappan, Ralph H. Dunn, Mrs. Aloys Hot and Mrs. Irene S. Smith.

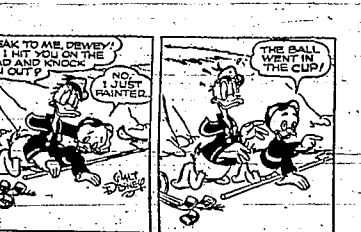

Receding Plan Best
Receding offers the best solution found to date. Halogeton does not flourish when it has to fight other vegetation. Created wheat grass and yellow sweet clover have crowded it out in experimental plots.
Cattle have shown created wheat and clover can be planted in with the halogeton, and sheep don't get sick if they eat a little halogeton along with other forage. However, livestock has to be kept off the receding areas long enough to give the grass a start.
Spraying the weed with chemicals has met with some success but the extension service still is experimenting with various formulas to see which does the best job.

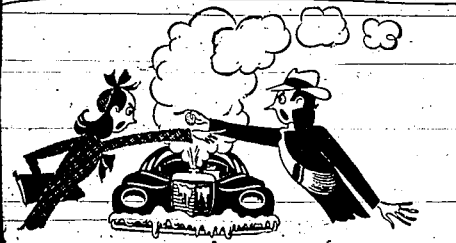

Britain Gives Top Priority For Air Arm

WASHINGTON, Oct. 4 (AP)—The first time in its history, Britain is giving air power higher priority than any other branch of the military. This is a new way of measuring London's grave concern over the extension of defense problems raised by Britain's geographic position. From Russia's western bases to the Mediterranean, the British are approaching what at present would permit them to intercept any enemy planes that arrive over Europe and almost without warning, according to Royal Air Force officials.

The RAF is determined to mount the most modern air defense and offense possible—assuming that time does not run out before the new weapons are in hand. They include super-sonic fighters, interceptors, ground-to-air guided missiles and 60-mile an hour atomic bombers.

Before the present \$1,100,000,000 three-year re-armament program is completed, the RAF will be getting a bigger share of defense expenditures than either the army or navy. The plan started in April, "Eisenhower's Act". The RAF, which the British government calls "Eisenhower's ace in the hole"—and the U. S. air force agrees that.

In the event of war, the first goal must be to knock out Russia's strategic air force by hitting its home bases, installations and factories.

Allied tactical air power in western Europe must be built up to match Russia's numerically.

Plan for Fast Action of U. N. Is Given OK

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 4.—A broad scheme of quick collective action by all nations against aggression has been given U. N. committee approval. By the vote of 31 to 1, the committee on the plan of the U. N. committee on collective measures, in brief calls for:

1. Use of regional defense forces, such as the North Atlantic pact forces, for defense against aggression if asked by the U. N.
2. Creation of an executive military authority made up of a state or states which would direct the military forces against the aggressor.
3. Political measures, such as appeals to the parties to negotiate their dispute, severance of relations with an offending state or the suspension or expulsion from the U. N.
4. Complete cooperation by U. N. bodies on economic and financial matters against an aggressor.
5. All countries, whether U. N. members or not, shall cooperate to the aid of an attacked state.

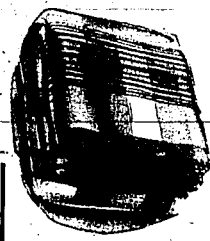

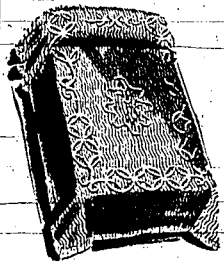
