Idaho Potato King Attends Texas Parley

Joe P. Marshall, Idaho potato king, is back from a flying trip to Dallas where the four-day convention of the Texas Citrus and Vegetable Growers and Shippers was held.

It gave him an opportunity to indulge in one of his favorite pastimes, being "Uncle Joe" to a bunch of youngsters. To Marshall fell the honor of presenting 2,000 pounds of Idaho potatoes to the Dallas-Variety Club's Boys' Ranch, a Texas version of Boys' state.

The four tons of potatoes, grown on one of Marshall's farms near Castleford, were exhibited at the growers and shippers convention by the Idaho advertising commission. Also exhibited were 200 pounds of Idaho onions.

Marshall said Idaho had the only potato exhibit at the convention and "walked off with everything." A feature story on Marshall in a Dallas newspaper drew much comment and many visitors.

The exhibit was 40 feet long, topped with an indirectly lit sign which proclaimed "Those who know Idaho," and featured a five-pound Idaho baker in a fence of smaller potatoes.

Because Texas is one of Idaho's best potato customers, Marshall explained, the Idaho advertising commission has scheduled newspaper advertising in major Texas cities for the shipping season now starting.

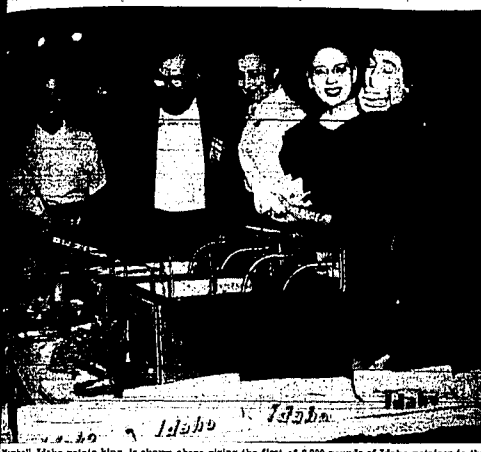

By winning over other members in their respective FFA chapters, seven boys competed with Anderson in the area contest having a prize of an expense-paid trip to the national FFA convention which starts Monday in Kansas City.

They are Donald Brehm, Jerome; who placed second; Jerry Lowe, Kimberly; third; Tom McClain, Gratiot; Arthur DeVries, Filer; David Irwin, Heyburn; Robert Ragsdale, Gooding; and Arley Ahland, Buhl. They will receive prizes for winning their chapter contests.

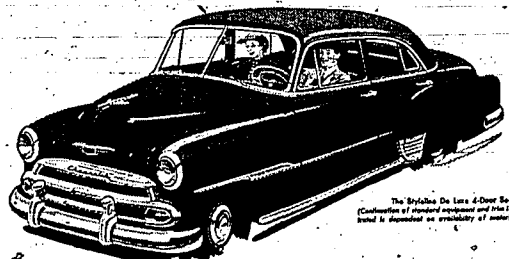

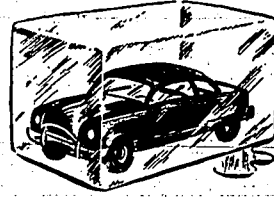

County Agent Tour Held on Range Burns

County Agent Warren Datch and several other county agents from Magic Valley were taken on a tour of burned-off rangelands and enclosed lands today.

The purpose of the tour was to study lands where reseedling is under way as part of the range improvement program.

Datch recommends that cattle and sheep be kept off the land for a year or two after burning. In this way, the grass will be able to compete on an equal basis with the sagebrush.

He is unable to determine the results of the brushmound and bettering demonstration held in the Hollister-Amsterdam area last summer.

For the first year or so after the area is burned, wind and other erosion means the grass does not grow and growing is slow, Datch points out.

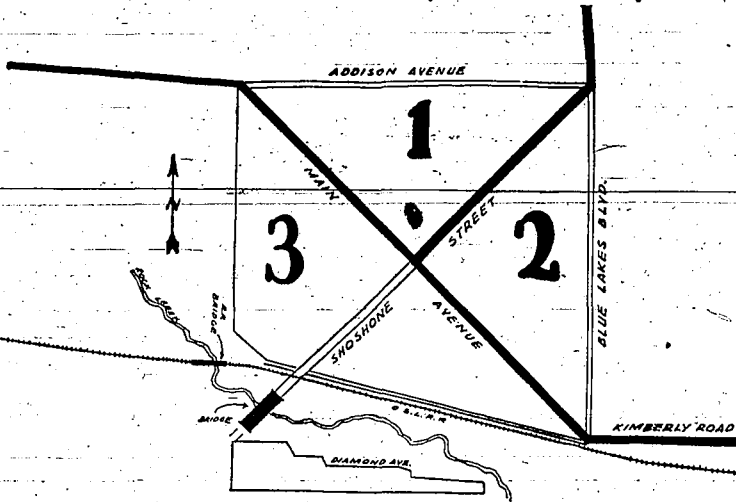

Concern for the welfare of children gets lost in this shuffle of selfish desire. Clarity there is need for re-awakened love of home, for more marriage and family counseling service, and for more sensible laws to safeguard the institution of marriage.

"Finally, the community itself is in danger. Dope peddling, gambling, poor sportsmanship, a general loosening of moral and spiritual values—all these have shocked the American people in recent months. Their presence in our communities is a constant menace and contradiction to the development of healthy personalities and indications that there is need for the united strength of all responsible people.

"Now, therefore, I, Mrs. John E. Hayes, president of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers, mindful of the citizen child and his destiny in a free world, designate the month of October as membership enrollment month. I appeal to every parent and teacher to volunteer for this proclamation.
