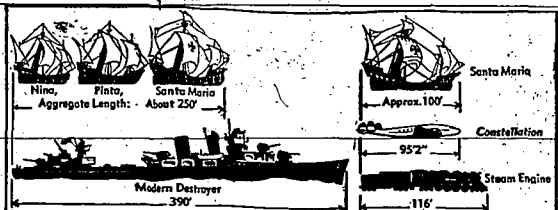

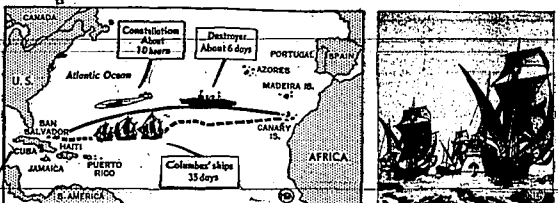

### Profit System Again Coming Up for Check

NEW YORK, Oct. 12 (AP)—The profit system which the American economy still is based—will be up for check-taking again soon. And many corporations' earnings statements probably won't look so good as they did three months ago.

Profits, however, taxes and controls on business will be apparent in another week, as companies begin reporting on their profits in the July, August and September quarterly reports.

The reports will reach flood stage by the end of the month. And the nation can then see whether taxes and controls have—as many in business charge—cut back corporate profits.

The reports will be incentive to invest and produce is getting sickly.

The president's council of economic advisers isn't waiting for the reports to come out. It's making its own estimates. It has the knowledge that taxes are going up on every cent a corporation made and that the price of raw materials, prices and mark-ups really started to bite this summer.

The council says that in the third quarter dropped both before and after taxes, although more money, and the total of wages and salaries went up this summer at an annual rate of \$1,700,000,000 to hit \$17,500,000,000.

Also, the total production and services produced in the country hit a new high—an annual rate of \$25,000,000,000.

Corporate profits—before taxes, dropped at a \$2,000,000,000 rate in the first three months of 1950. This summer, the council figures, corporate profits were at an annual rate of \$21,500,000,000, a 40 percent drop from the April, May and June quarter.

Where the increase in feeding will be in the midwestern corn belt, which fed supplies are said to be ample.

In the western states, only California is expected to feed more lambs than last year.

### Funds Appeal For President Is Boomerang

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (AP).—President Truman's friends seeking to finance a memorial to him appeal to an effort to get Republican campaign orators.

In language so simple even a child could understand, the President's friends told the astonishing story of federal corporation taxes since 1929.

Stockholders in prosperous corporations saw about \$10 of each earned \$100 for the year in 1929 for taxes. The stockholders share of the \$100 was 18.75—the letter informed prospective contributors.

**Situation Reversed**  
Mr. Truman's friends estimated further that under the tax bill shortly to be passed by congress, this share will be almost the reverse in 1934 from what it was in 1929.

Corporations in the high excess profit rates will pay in 1934 about \$80 of each \$100 earned to the government in taxes. Stockholders will receive or keep about \$10. This share for even the most favorably situated corporations tax-wise will be about 50-50 between stockholders and tax collector.

**Effectively Blatant**  
The high tax issue upon which Republicans plan to base much of their 1932 election campaign rarely has been more effectively stated than in the letter soliciting contributions to the "Harry S. Truman Memorial Library."

This memorial is planned for Mr. Truman's former home in Grandview, Mo. Publicly now attending in the manner in which funds were solicited has set the memorial project back more than somewhat.

Mr. Truman was quick to detect the political poison in the memorial appeal. He disavowed and repudiated it the instant the letter was published.

**REA Survey Ranks Idaho High on List**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (Special)—Idaho ranks first among the Rocky mountain states with 94.8 per cent of its 40,284 farms equipped with central station electricity, a rural electrification administration survey revealed today.

Michigan led the nation with a 97.6 figure and only three other states topped Idaho: Iowa, California and Indiana.

Utah's 91.4 percentage was second in the Rocky mountain region followed by Arizona, 87.4; Colorado, 78.1; Wyoming, 78.3; Nevada, 61.5, and New Mexico, 50.8. The last two were the lowest in the country.

Ranking was based on the 1950 census figure of 5,500,000 farms in the nation. The REA calculated that as of June 30 of this year, 84 per cent had electricity.

The annual REA estimate is required by law to be used in allocating electrification loans to the various states.

According to the survey, the number of electrified farms in Idaho increased from 37,491 or 93.0 per cent at the time of the census to 38,190 or 94.8 by last June 30.
