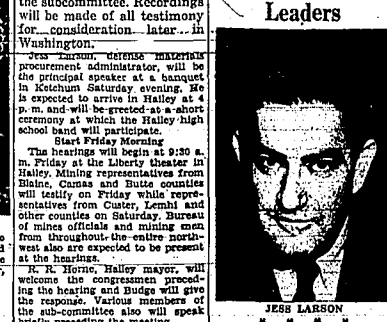

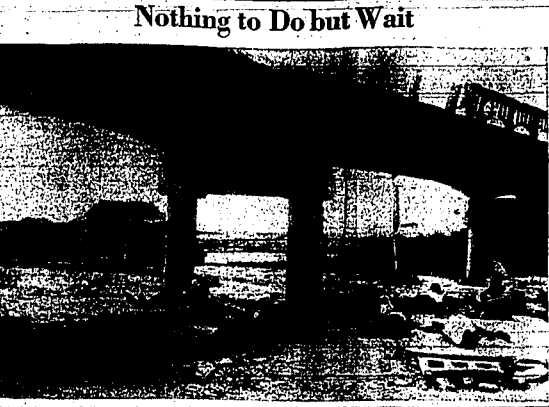

**Korean Vets Are Advised of Help**

With about 100 Magic Valley veterans of Korean fighting discharged from the armed forces within the past 90 days, a review of veterans administration benefits for them was given Thursday by Arnold Helweg, VA contact representative here.

These include certain benefits which used to be reserved only for war veterans. Helweg explained even though the fighting in Korea has not been recognized officially as a state of war, Korean veterans are eligible to many benefits on the same basis as veterans of World War II and other wars.

Veterans who saw service after June 27, 1950, and who can satisfy certain other requirements, are eligible for vocational rehabilitation, hospitalization, outpatient medical care, service-connected compensation, pensions and insurance. Their dependents also may be eligible for death pensions and burial benefits.

Full information and assistance on the VA benefits is available at the local VA office.

**Atomic Blast Effects to Be Noted in Test**

LAS VEGAS, Nev., Oct. 18 (AP)—The first atomic experiments at the Nevada test site not only will provide the initial test of troops under fire, but probably will include a study of blast effects on various types of construction.

The reports came last night that many different types of buildings, ranging from one to several stories, and bridges and viaducts have been constructed on part of Yucca flat, where extensive desert rock is piled.

The reports came from Las Vegas workers who rushed to complete most of the construction today. In one location, it was reported, there is a block of construction with no two buildings alike—and most of them with plumbing. ### Truman Says View on Red Pact Is Same

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—President Truman said today he stands by his previous statement that agreements with Russia, are not worth the paper they are written on.

The President declined to discuss the exchange of views between U. S. Ambassador Alan G. Kirk and Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Vishinskiy.

He said he had not read Vishinskiy's statement to the effect that Russian-American relations could not be in worse shape.

Reminded of prior statements that Russian agreements are worthless, Mr. Truman said he stood by those statements.

Mr. Truman originally made the statement in an off-the-cuff remark Sept. 17 while dedicating new display cases for the original copies of the constitution and the declaration of independence.

At a library of congress ceremonies, the President had departed from his prepared text to say that a Russian agreement "isn't worth the paper it's written on... it's just a scrap of paper."

Vishinskiy referred to that remark in a recent exchange with Kirk. The Soviet foreign minister said it is only barely possible to imagine that these (U. S.-Russian) relations can worsen even more after President Truman stated to the whole world that agreements with the Soviet union are not worth the paper on which they are written.

### Pictures Wasted On Produce Bag, U. S. Study Notes

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (Special)—You're wasting money putting pictures or printing on cellophane bags of spinach, the agriculture department said today.

A pre-packaging plant working with the USDA production and marketing administration found that patrons of six Baltimore markets preferred the plain package when they had a choice.

The plant estimated it could save \$20,000 to \$25,000 a year by eliminating costs.

Combined sales of pre-packaged spinach and frozen spinach exceeded sales of bulk fresh spinach, with the prepackaged product selling at about twice the price, the report said. The same was true of kale, it added.

### Rush to Food Ends Mutiny Of Prisoners

MOONSVILLE, W. Va., Oct. 18 (AP)—A rush for food ended the mutiny of 1,200 cold and hungry convicts at West Virginia state prison.

They had killed all night in the big two-acre exercise yard, howling abuse and profanity.

Warden Carl A. Streen told them on a loudspeaker:

"If you men care to go to your cells, the doors are open. When you get in, we'll arrange to feed you. We can't feed you where you are."

"No, no, no," yelled some of those who led the revolt.

They rushed for the cell blocks with the rank and file, however, but they were identified.

No one was hurt. One shattered window light was the only damage.

Warden Streen blamed "a few chink malcontents—no more than 25 at the most." He said trouble has been brewing for weeks. Three prisoners on a grievance committee complained that a prison cook was dirty and the clothing too scanty.

The rioters had been locked out of their cell houses all night. Tuesday and the temperature got down to 47. Their demands were soaking wet from the fog that drifted in.

### No Excuse!

Contrary to reports elsewhere, children cannot be excused from school to work in potato fields. That's the warning from Leslie Jackson, an attendance officer for the Twin Falls county board of education.

He points out state provides any child 7 to 16 years old must attend school every day school is in session, unless excused because of illness or death in his immediate family or unless excused by a physician because of physical disability.

Any child in this age group, who is working instead of attending school, is in direct violation of state law, Jackson warns. Harsh work—permissible after-school hours and on days school is not in session, he said, as well as in those districts where school boards have granted a harvest vacation.

### Bill to Reduce Mail Package Sizes Okayed

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—Congress has passed a bill cutting the size and weight limits on some parcel post packages.

Both the senate and the house approved a compromise measure, sending it to President Truman.

The bill limits parcels handed by first-class postoffices, in larger cities to not more than 40 pounds in weight, and 72 inches combined length and girth.

Present size and weight limits—70 pounds and 108 inches—are unchanged for parcels mailed to or from smaller postoffices.

Also exempted from the new limits are parcels mailed to or from army or navy postoffices, to or from postoffices in the territories or possessions, and parcels containing baby chickens, live plants, trees, agricultural commodities and books that don't contain advertising.





### Japan's Iron Need Helping Nevada Boom

RENO, Oct. 18 (AP)—Nevada's bagging mining industry may be in for a shot-in-the-arm — thanks to Japan.

Nevada's long-dormant gold and silver mines probably won't boom — but the state's deposits of low-grade iron ore, worked only sporadically in the last 50 years, already are signs of increased activity.

At least two companies are shipping ore to Japan. A critical steel shortage there has created the need for some 5,000,000 tons of iron ore the coming year.

Biggest of these producers is the Modoc Iron of the Simpson Iron Mines, Inc. on the northern end of the Cortez range in Eureka county.

Some 1,200 tons of ore are moving daily from there to Oakland, Calif., where it's loaded aboard freighters.

Jack R. Simpson, a Caldwell, Idaho, businessman who made a fortune out of potatoes, is president of the company.

Another producer is Denton and associated. It is reported shipping approximately 1,000 tons daily from a mine near Lovelock in Pershing county.

Mine operators are receiving an estimated \$8 to \$9 a ton.

A. C. Schuster, U. S. bureau of mines chief here, said development of the Nevada properties possibly may result in their becoming available to producers for the Geneva steel plant in Utah and the Kaiser plant in Postland, Calif.

### Life Ends for Top Producer Of U. S. Cattle

COLUMBUS, O., Oct. 18 (AP)—"Old Ruby" the champion lifetime butterfat producer of all the nation's dairy cows, died this week.

"Old Ruby" was a 16-year-old cow owned by the estate of J. W. Copple, Perrisville, Calif. The American Jersey Cattle club announced her death, saying she milked her last well over 21 years of age—more than three times the average life of a dairy cow.

She had been a revered champion of the dairy world for many years.

Her production accumulated in 30 milking years stands at 196,457 pounds of milk and 10,923 pounds of butterfat—equivalent to 21,375 quarts of milk and 15,123 pounds of butter. This is enough milk to furnish the needs of a family of five for more than 60 years, says the Jersey club, and enough butterfat to meet all of its fat requirements for two to three years.

Recently she was honored at one of the leading dairy cattle shows in the nation by having her picture hung in the show barn with caption: "Old Jerseys never die, they just milk away."

### Ex-Aide Avers FDR 'Always' Was Politician

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—James H. Jones says the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt was "all things to all men—always a politician."

Mr. Roosevelt was such a "truth-teller" politician, Jones says in his memoirs published today, that he was eager to have the U. S. enter World War II—so it would secure his election for a third term.

Jones served Roosevelt for 12 years as head of the reconstruction finance corporation and later as his wartime secretary of commerce.

In 1945, he was let out, and Roosevelt named Harry A. Wallace to take his place.

This must have rankled all the more because of Jones' opinion of the man who succeeded him. He calls Wallace an incompetent mediator with "very small" ideas.

Now 77, and still busy as a Texas financier and publisher, Jones takes a long look back—and paints a bitter picture of the man who was his boss.

Here are a few of Jones' views on Roosevelt:

"Regardless of his oft-repeated statement, 'I hate war,' he was eager to get into the fighting since that would insure a third term."

"He had no intention of leaving the White House until voted out or carried out."

"In no sense did I feel his superiority over other men—except that he was President—and this greater prominence of his country—ever known, and ruthless when it suited his purpose."

Jones says the pressure was there when he headed the RFO, and Roosevelt applied the pressure. But Jones hurriedly points out there was "no feeding, no catering" and what he calls Roosevelt's attempt at influencing the RFO never succeeded.

"At an autumnal 77, Uncle Jones is still on the job at least six full days a week. He goes to work almost every night, ignores most national, state and local holidays, and sometimes devotes part of his Sundays to the workaday grind."

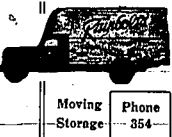

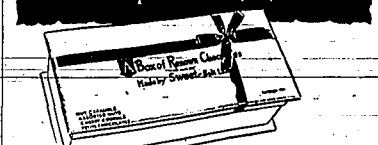

BONN, Germany, Oct. 18 (AP)—This is a reluctant capital. Its hands are tied into a knot by London, Paris, Rome, Bern, and the London clubs, flashy stores and restaurants.

And it doesn't want them. Most of the people who have come here to take up jobs in or connected with the West German government don't want to be here.

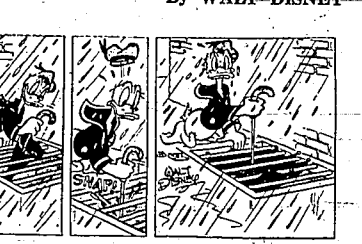

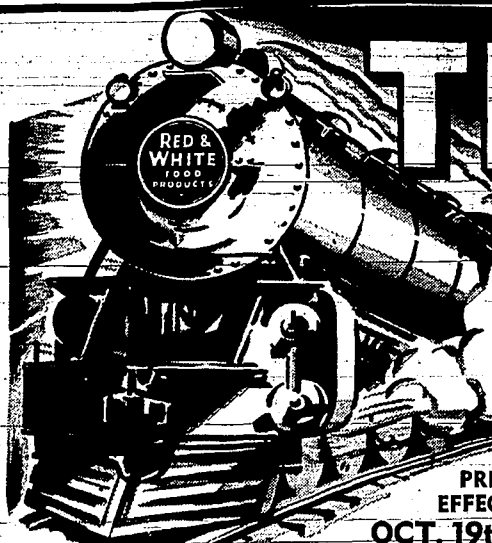
