

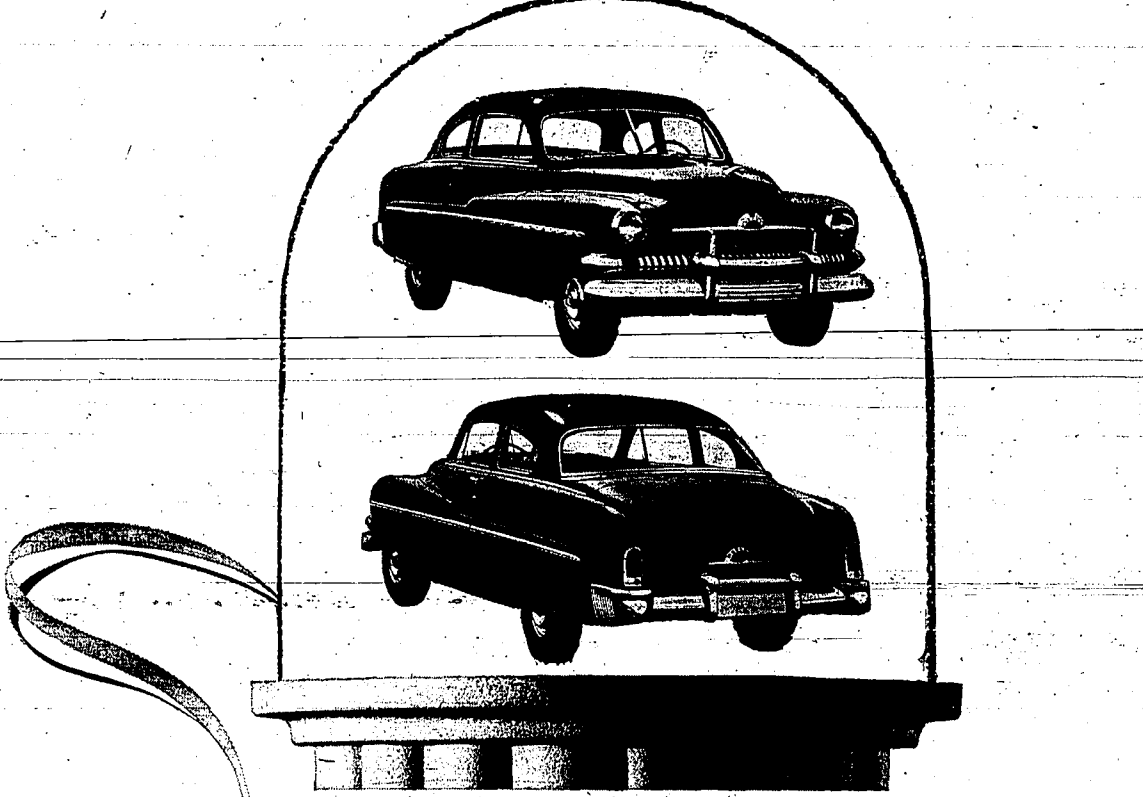

Tour of Road Board Shows Bridges Need

BOISE, Oct. 19 (AP)—Highway board members reported they were surprised to find a large number of bridges in Idaho that need attention as soon as steel can be obtained and time and money permit. Cost of replacing the bridges was estimated at \$10,000,000. The board reported a secondary 310-mile tour of Idaho highway work.

Many inadequate Chairman Ransom C. Rich, Burley, said, "We were generally not displeased, but many highways are inadequate for present and foreseeable travel due to lack of vision, width, right of way and proper base and alignment."

The board also reported that urban roads are badly in need of improving, especially in larger Idaho cities. The board said the urban highway program in critical in Boise, Pocatello, Idaho Falls, Nampa, Coeur d'Alene, Blackfoot, Arden, and other cities.

Rich said the board has begun a study of road approaches to various Idaho cities, but warned that it will not be able to improve many of the approaches.

Service stations, hotels and other businesses have been urged to give up rights of way and it will be necessary to acquire property and move those buildings, Rich said. However, he added that in many cases it may have to be done or find a new approach into urban areas.

Local Councils Rich said the board did not meet with local delegations on its trip other than attend a meeting of the North Idaho Chamber of Commerce in Orofino. He said the board will periodically trips throughout the state to give local groups an opportunity to present their views on local highway problems.

Cities and towns visited on the tour included Arden, Blackfoot, Boise, Burley, Twin Falls, Piler, Buhl, Jerome, Shoshone, Idaho, Ketchikan, Coalinga, Clatsop Ferry and Mountain Home.

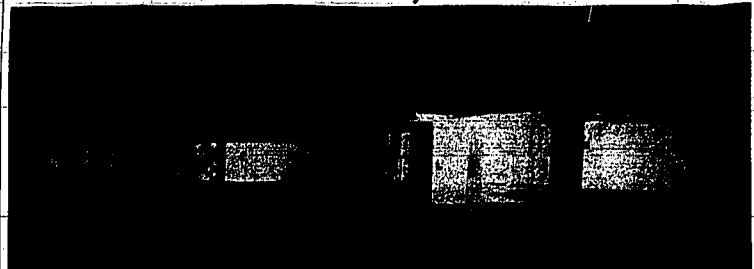
