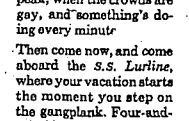
Shoshone C. of C. Changes Location For Annual Party

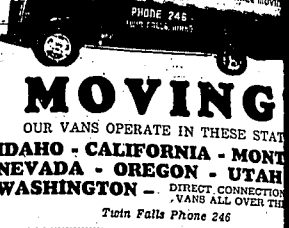

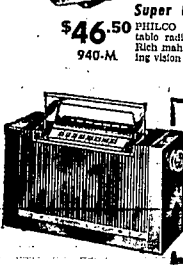

Life in MAGIC VALLEY

The great, gray timber wolf has vanished from the mountains of southern Idaho but whenever its infrequent howls were heard by ancient and wrinkled Indians, those Indians would smile and nod their heads.

Shaunty-Muck is not an Indian name for the great, gray wolf. It is the name of a legendary Bannock warrior. But the legend proves that Indians, like the white people, believed in the force of magic.

Long before the coming of white men, so the story goes, a little Indian boy by the name of Shaunty-Muck was orphaned. A minor Bannock chief, because he had no son of his own, adopted Shaunty-Muck. But the Indian boy, because he was an orphan, never could hope to rise to wealth and power in his tribe.

That didn't bother Shaunty-Muck as a boy. He spent his days playing with his foster sister, Toktee, and was happy.

The young Indian did as he was told and, in due course, a gray wolf crossed his path. Knowing it was a sign from the Great Spirit, Shaunty-Muck killed the wolf and ate his heart.

Renewed, refreshed and strengthened, he returned to his tribe and set to work amassing a fortune. He was doing pretty good at it, too, until an Indian with a glib tongue came along and "purchased" Toktee from her father. So disgusted was Shaunty-Muck he gave all his wealth away and headed back into the mountains.

But Toktee wasn't going to be sold like a horse, so the story goes. She had her husband, Toktee, at all times, and she always would be an old hag in his sight. And to prove her point her face became wrinkled before her husband's eyes, her teeth fell out and her musical voice became a cackle. Then she ran away hoping to find Shaunty-Muck.

As in modern love stories, Shaunty-Muck just happened to be in the vicinity at the right time and their paths crossed. Of course, Indians said it was the wolf who guided their footsteps.

Without benefit of divorce, Indian or otherwise, Shaunty-Muck and Toktee set up housekeeping in the Snake river canyon near what now is called Blue Lake. Toktee's beauty returned and, for a time, they were happy.

One day, though, while Shaunty-Muck was out hunting and Toktee was taking a shower beneath a waterfall, she was seen by a roving Blackfoot Indian. At first he thought she was a goddess and tried to remain silent. But Toktee saw him and, when Shaunty-Muck returned, she told her husband of the Blackfoot spy.

"It is a message from the Great Spirit," Shaunty-Muck said. "We must flee."

"Where?" asked Toktee.

"Where?" her husband replied, mentioning the mountains to the north.

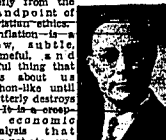

AS YOUR MINISTER SEES IT

BY ALBERT D. PARRETT
(Pastor, Methodist Church)

"I hear a lot of groans and grumblings these days about inflation. At the risk of being called a trespasser, let me tell you what I think about it. Let me tell you briefly from the standpoint of a Christian minister—



"Inflation" is a slow, subtle, shameful, and almost invisible thing that coils about us python-like until it is utterly deadly. It is a creeping economic parasite that does not stop until its victim is dead. In plain language inflation means increased cost of living. No one would mind paying more money to meet rising living costs if one's income enlarged to meet these costs. But the immorality of it, yet, the sin of it, comes at the point where one begins to climb faster than income. There would be no advantage to inflation for anyone if wages and salaries kept pace with the mounting cost of living.

Two years ago and he has to do it with the same amount that he received two years ago. If we are going to show the Russian people the best of the world the meaning of freedom and Christian democracy, we had better try to do it in some better way than via inflation.

We say that we don't like Russian economy—and government—in one breath—and in the next we argue for a system of economics and government that brings us gradually closer to the embrace of the Russian bear. And what is happening, is just what Russia wants; namely, great poverty, greater confusion and great inequality among our people.

There is no nation on earth in a better position than our nation to demonstrate to the world the successes of Christian democracy, yet we are not doing it. Instead we are subjecting our people to the debauchery of inflation.

Our national debt increases with every passing moment. No attempt is being made to retire a dollar of it. The inflated dollar that is being paid in ever-increasing taxes, instead of being used to pay our honest bills, disappears in the face of ever-increasing military demands, government operation costs, subsidies and waste. We are practicing an economy in Washington that would be labeled unsound, if not insane, were individual citizens to practice it in their business affairs.

A federal reserve report tells us that "for every two Americans who saved money last year, one spent more than he earned. Only seven per cent of the nation's wage and salary earners just what they earned, 10 per cent of the buying public, 25 per cent more than they earned; 13 per cent plumped up to 10 per cent in the red." If the report is right, one can't really be white we are headed during the next few years. Millions of our people will be squeezed to the side, criminally and poverty if the Maxwell Droke speaks prophetically when he declares, "If a genuine armistice emerges from the cease-fire now pending in Korea, it will, regardless of what you read, have an appreciable effect on our economy." Let me add to this quote from Sen. George D. Aiken, Vermont, who says, "If it weren't for the Korean war, we'd have been in a pretty good-sized depression just fall." Are these men trying to say in a nice way that we can't stop depression and unemployment by going to war? Thomas Dewey of New York intimated as much when in a nomination speech almost four years ago he asked in one of his rousing discourses, "Do we have to go to war to give men jobs?"

Why is it that in times of comparative peace among the nations we go into deprecations and orgies of unemployment? And then in time of international conflict we enjoy the flush of economic prosperity? One would think that a sound economy would turn the whole matter around, giving prosperity in peacetime and adversity and poverty at a time when people were being killed, and property destroyed. The challenge is to you and to me to do our part to Christianize our economy—to check inflation—to live in-

dividually and collectively according to the golden rule.

This insidious thing we call inflation is not only an economic problem; it is also a moral and religious problem which Christians should tackle realistically. It is something we need to take to God in prayer. If God could teach George Washington-Carver the worth and wonder of a peanut don't you suppose He could teach us some valuable fruits about our present dilemma?

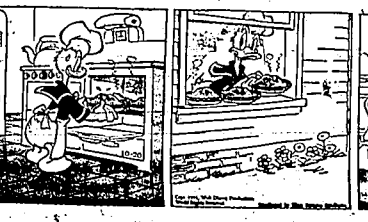
