WASHINGTON, Oct. 29 (AP)—The government today released a list of short metals, including copper, nickel, and zinc.

Addressing the opening session of the governor's safety conference—the first of its kind in Idaho—the governor sounded the keynote by saying, "Safety is everybody's business."

"Human lives are the most precious of our state," the governor told the crowded session in the Elks lodge ballroom. "We must consider means to prevent the indiscriminate waste of this great resource. As such a major prevention of the needless waste of accidents is not only a humanitarian duty, but an economic necessity. We must enlist the support of our labor organizations, our employer groups, our fire and casualty insurers, the schools, the churches, P.T.A.s, farm groups and every chamber of commerce and service club, our veterans organizations, our fraternal groups."

The governor asked special attention on highway safety. He commended the state highway department for its work in the past and asked for more cooperation from drivers by "giving up the right to speed."

More than 250 persons from all parts of the state had responded to the invitation to attend the conference. The governor and various state officials participated in the conference. This was the first time that the governor and various state officials participated in the conference.

After a morning of speeches from the governor and various state officials, the meeting broke up into four roundtable groups to deal with accident prevention in the highways, the farm, in industry and in the community. The four separate groups will discuss their recommendations for action.

Governor Jordan also commended the appeal for a concerted attack on the accident problem by saying that the state was not better than the national average and in some respects was worse.

"In Idaho we are the watchdog of every individual," he said. "We must be alert to any possible danger to our precious resource of our state."

The governor's opening remarks were followed by a series of remarks from the following representatives:

1. Grade—All potatoes shipped must be at least a U.S. No. 1 or U.S. No. 2 potato as defined by the federal grades and standards.

2. Size—All potatoes must be at least two inches minimum in size or four ounces minimum in weight.

3. Cleanliness—All potatoes shipped must be "generally fairly clean," that is, free of dirt, soil, stems, or other foreign matter.

4. Marketing—Up to Nov. 1, all rats must be moderately mature, which means not more than 10 per cent of the potatoes are to be more than one-half of the skin missing or feathered.
