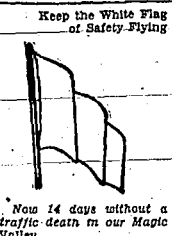

phosphate, potash, oil, gas and other lands were opened on the same reserved basis.

**Requirements Listed**

This potential mineral land must have been acquired by the entryman or his heirs prior to the mineral leasing act of Feb. 29, 1930. Purchasers from an original entryman have preference right only if they bought the land before Jan. 1, 1918.

The only protection for landowners is in the case of oil and gas where the owner has a preference right must notify the owner, who then has 30 days to file his own application.

name him or her. It's purpose, as spelled out by President Ned H. Dearborn, is to "dramatize the horror of such a huge traffic toll."

"Perhaps," he adds, "1,000,000 dead—almost twice the number of Americans who have died in combat in all our wars—will crack the spines of a nation which can see 35,000 persons killed by autos in a year—without much concern."

The annual toll of fatalities passed the 30,000 mark in 1950, pushed beyond the 30,000 level in 1951. It peaked at 35,000 in 1941, dropped during World War II, and then began a climb that reached a postwar high of 35,000 last year.

If "M day" arrives about mid-December, the killing of 1,000,000 Americans on streets and roads will have been accomplished in 51 years, four months and a few odd days.

If the slaughter continues at the present pace, says the council, "it will take only 39 years to kill the second million."

### National Safety Council Preparing for Flashing News of Millionth Car Death

CHICAGO, Nov. 5 (AP)—Some time next month Gene Miller, head of the National Safety Council's statistical department, expects to total up a column of figures. His quick fingers will punch the keys of an adding machine. But, in effect, he will be creating the signal button for "M day."

Long-legged Miller will take 87 strides down a corridor, dart into the public information office and drop a ribbon of paper on a desk. Paul Jones and Jack Horner, information chiefs, will glance at the figures. They will telephone Chicago newspapers. If the total is, say, 999,975, they will report.

"Get set. It will hit the 1,000,000 mark in about six hours."

If the hands on the clock of death keep moving at present speed, "M day" will have the most inconspicuous of all possible settings.

An air of safety will rule the main business streets of U. S. cities. Lamp posts will be decorated with festive holly wreaths. Store windows will sparkle with glistening new toys and glittering artificial snow and tinsel.

The bright eyes of youngsters, aglow with the joy of anticipation, will reflect the blue and red and

yellow of strings of lights. Millions of Christmas shoppers will swing along to the strains of an amplified musical message: "Tis the season to be merry."

And on the newstands they pass papers that will carry a black headline: "Nation records 1,000,000th traffic death."

The council expects the U. S. to reach this melancholy milestone during the third week of December. Up to the end of September, a total of 990,300 Americans had been injured fatally in accidents involving motor vehicles. During this date period of the year fatalities average 110 or so per day. From now on, it is simply a matter of waiting and adding until the inevitable day is at hand.

The council has a plan to quicken the counting of the dead. It normally issues reports on traffic deaths once a month. But, starting on Nov. 15, it will get weekly summaries from state accident record bureaus. It will turn out weekly bulletins for press and radio use. The council also plans to get daily reports of deaths from major press wire services.

Only two factors could delay "M day"—beyond—the pre-Christmas period. One would be bad weather that would keep most automobiles in garages. The other would be a sudden shift to cautious driving on the part of motorists.

Drivers could, the council says, start "driving scared." But they haven't thus far.

The council and other organizations began an all-stops-out campaign March 2 to delay "M day" as long as possible.

It was built around the slogan "don't YOU be one in a million." But since then, 21,400 men, women and children have joined the "one-in-a-million" club. Each received an all-expense-paid trip to a cemetery.

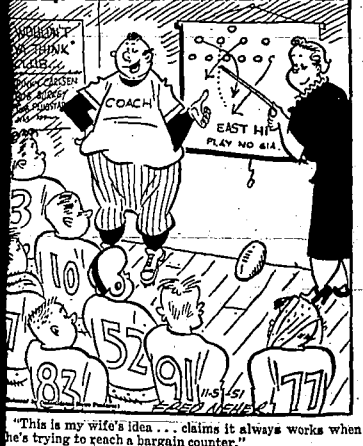

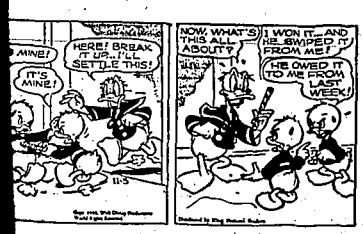

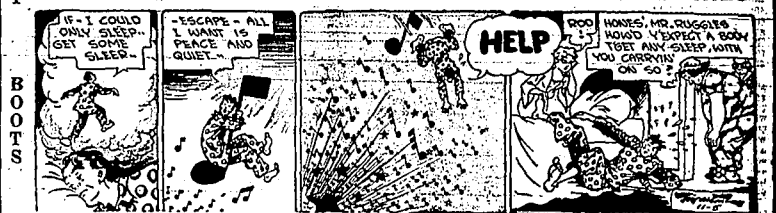

**New City Building Nears Completion; Arrangement of Structure Described**

Two operations designed to save money are quartered in the lower level or basement of the new city hall which is slated to open in mid-November. Also located in the basement is the boiler room.

The engineering department, previously limited in space to one small room, will have triple the space in its new quarters. It will have a laboratory where tests can be made on materials purchased by the city to be certain they meet specifications.

Director of Public Works Vincent T. Young explains that in the past gravel, oil and other material have been purchased according to the engineer's specifications. But the city has no facilities to test the quality of the material in other words, the city had to take the manufacturer's word that the goods met specifications. The public will now be certain it gets what it pays for.

Another advantage of the testing room will be more efficient preparation of oil in road mixes. In the past, preparation of this material has been largely guesswork. Proper mixing will be possible now. The room is on the south side of the building and will be equipped with screens, scales and similar items in time for next year's program.

Another money saver may be realized on the citizen's water bill when the meter man gets the necessary equipment for testing and repairing water meters. He'll have a new meter testing machine, pressure tanks and other equipment in a room at the southwest edge of the new building. His work has been done at the city garage in the past under what the engineer terms "adverse conditions."

The boiler room and coal bin are located in the northwest corner of the basement. A room 22x9 feet houses the Cliff station steel boiler and the hot water furnace, which is fed by a coal stoker. The stoker can handle 100 pounds of coal per hour. It is automatically controlled by a thermostat.

The coal bin, holding about 30 tons is located to the right of the boiler room. The boiler is of the low pressure variety. The heating system serves the lower level of basement and the ground floor by radiant heat from pipes containing hot water beneath the floors. Base-

board radiators from small radiator-type vents across the top floor.

In addition to the laboratory testing room, the engineering department will have an office for the city engineers. You'll also find his assistant, Joseph Keyser, and a drafting room. The drafting-room will have two space elevators increased four or five times insofar as filing and work room is concerned. The rooms are equipped with the necessary cabinets. Little new equipment, other than a "drafting table," will be required.

The entire building has been constructed with the future of a growing city in mind. The entire north side of the basement, except for the boiler room, is set aside for the three engineering department offices.

Space is being allocated for public restrooms for both men and women. These restrooms will be located on the south side of the basement.

Both the north and south sides of the building are almost entirely of glass, transparent except for the restrooms.
