Atomic Bombs of Varying Sizes

It seemed to have all the attributes of previous major A-bombs, including a flash that lasted for 10 seconds. The fireball culminated in a tower of fire hundreds of feet high—something for which this reporter could find no precedent in previous atomic accounts.

The blast rocked the southern Nevada desert for many miles and was heard as far away as Richfield, 100 miles eastward. But the quirk of atmospherics the shock waves missed all populated communities.

Completion of the Magic Valley Memorial Hospital's physiotherapy ward by the first of the year appeared likely Monday night, when the board approved bids for eight contractors to complete the work.

At the same time, the board passed a resolution to make every effort to obtain recognition of the ward by the family of the patient who was killed in the area by the treatment.

Largest contracts for the ward were made to the Bradley Heating and Air Conditioning Co. of Twin Falls, for plumbing, heating and electrical work and fixtures. Their contracts total \$6,950. Smaller contracts were awarded five other bidders.

Trip to England "Disappointing"

J. C. McGilvray, Magic Valley Memorial hospital administrator, said Tuesday he found his three-week trip to his native England disappointing in many respects. He and Dr. Glenn Moss, Kimberley, returned here late Sunday night.

Relocating over Churchill's return to power is tempered by the stalemate resulting between the narrow margin the conservatives gained over labor, McGilvray found. McGilvray said while he found more and more feeling that war is inevitable as the only solution, order and discipline in finding such a prevalent attitude of complacency on the part of the English people an attitude of "What can we do?"

He said the English had become so used to rationing, shortages and export of the best wares that many persons have forgotten what good times are like. He cited an instance of a man being told he now could get delivery of a car ordered three and one-half years ago but being unable to take delivery because a 30 per cent price increase during that period priced it beyond his reach.

Raging Snowstorm Disrupts Midwest; Death Toll Mounts

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 6 (AP)—A raging snowstorm swept northeastward from Texas today, dumped a paralyzing blanket of snow over a wide section of the midwest and smothered St. Louis under a record fall.

Public transportation was disrupted. Many schools and factories were forced to close in a belt from Kansas and Oklahoma into Illinois and Indiana. St. Louis was buried under 11 inches of snow, the deepest for Nov. 6 in the city's history. It still was snowing late in the morning.
