



CAN U.N. BE UNIVERSAL?

Prime Minister Nehru of India believes the Inited Nations should be reorganized to give t "wider appeal and a firmer grasp of reality."

"It was meant to be a universal organiza-tion," he said. "It is something less now," Certainly as conceived at San Francisco the U. N. was intended to be universal. That it is ot now is due entirely to the refusal of th Soviet union to work honestly for the fulfill-ment of the U. N.'s objectives of peace and

justice.

Nehru is right when he declares the U.N. today less than universal. But he is wrong when he imagines anything can be done about it in a world that contains Russian

about it in a world that contains Russian communium.

No world organization that his or any other magination could invent would serve properly as a universal peace agency so long as Russia is irrevocably committed to the sabotage of genuine peace. The sincerity of all its members is an inecapable fundamental in any international organization. And the Kremiln is not sincere.

Without the honest devotion of all parties, how then could the U. N. be made to function better on a universal level? Nehru does not face that issue. He implies that the U. N. has become a sounding board for the west. It's obvious, too, he is thinking of its refusal to admit red China. But how could the U. N. behave otherwise—given the unchanging Soviet attitude?

To "widen the appeal" of the U. N. under existing conditions could only mean to make major concessions to the Russian viewpoint. But every more Moscow has made since the coll war began makes it evident that anche coll war began makes it evident that anche

But every move Moscow has made since the cold war began makes it evident that such concessions would not be taken as a prelude to a real understanding. They would be selzed upon for communism's advantage; and they would be followed by new demands for other

concessions.

Russia did not join the U. N. out of devotion to peace. It joined because it saw in such memberahip a capital opportunity to propagandise and to impede the free world's earnest endeavors toward a more orderly existence. To the Kremiin, the U. N. is merely one more front in a many-sided campaign against free men.

We have a great distance yet to go to realize that position. But we are sufficiently far along to give the Soviet union genuine pause, to take western defense out of the realm of fancy and into reality.




