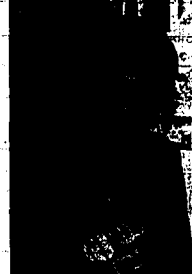

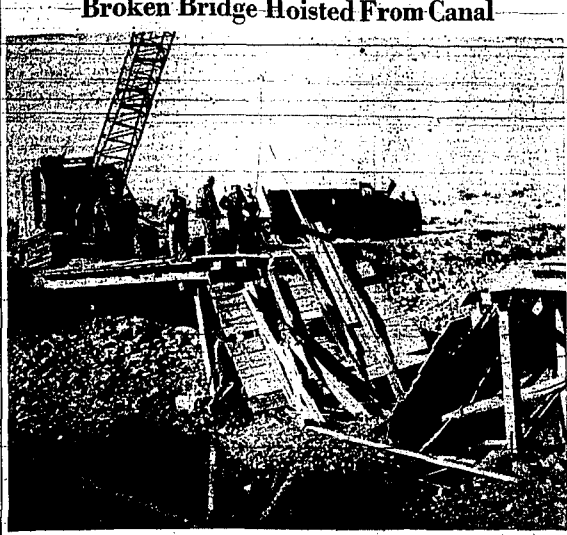

Bridge Collapses Under Beet Truck; Driver Is Not Injured

C. R. Wiseman, route 2, Kimberly, suddenly found himself looking skyward when the truck he was driving fell through a privately owned bridge across the lowline canal of the Twin Falls Canal company Wednesday afternoon.

The bridge, on a farm owned by George Ward, about two and one-half miles southwest of Twin Falls, gave way when Wiseman's truck was passing over it. Wiseman said his truck and its load of sugar beets weighed between 23,000 and 24,000 pounds.

Wiseman's truck stopped with its front end pointed nearly straight up. The mishap occurred shortly after noon and damaged the truck's side-boards, and gate and the back of its frame. Little water was in the canal—it had been turned off for annual canal cleaning.

Thursday afternoon, canal company workers found they had quite a bit to clean out of the canal. A crane first hoisted the truck from the canal, then pulled out the broken section of the bridge.

Youth Bound Over To District Court On Knifing Court

ROCKLAND, Nov. 8—James Chadbourne, the 14-year-old high school student charged with stabbing a schoolmate during a "chasing" has been bound over to district court by Probate Judge J. W. Collins.

Cattle Prices Drop Sharply On Area Mart

BURLEY, Nov. 8—Most plain cattle were off \$3 per 100 pounds here Thursday at the Burley livestock commission company sale. Officials blamed the decline on the higher prices of wheat and storm conditions in the Midwest.

Total sales were 973 cattle, 341 hogs and 291 sheep.

Best whiteface steers brought \$32.50 to \$34, best whiteface heifers \$28 to \$31, best whiteface cows \$25.50 to \$27.50, fat Holstein steers \$27 to \$27.50, heavy Holstein steers \$24 to \$25, light Holstein steers \$23 to \$25.50, heavy kind \$20 to \$24.

Price per head for 300 whiteface steer calves and a few heifers ranged from \$17.50 to \$18.00. Cold packages of smaller calves sold from \$10.00 to \$15. No good bulls were offered and those on hand brought \$24 to \$25.50. Fat dairy cows topped at \$24, canners and cutters \$14 to \$22.

Hogs ranged from \$10.25 to \$10 with the bulk bringing \$10.25. Weight was 109 to 124 pounds. Boys brought \$13.50 to \$16.50.

State Bureau Of Secondary Roads Asked

BOISE, Nov. 9 (AP)—The state highway board has been asked to set up a secondary road division to have nothing but secondary road program in Idaho.

The request was one of four recommendations made by the board yesterday by a delegation from the Idaho Association of County Clerks and Commissioners.

They also asked that:

1. Pressure groups not be recognized ahead of county commissioners on road matters. The commissioners said "we feel that county commissioners know their own county road problems much better than organized pressure groups."
2. County road matters be recognized by the state highway department as resident engineers and be allowed to design and supervise construction of secondary roads.

U. S. Aid Asked

3. Counties be allowed to build their own roads under the federal aid program, according to specifications either based on lowest bids or engineer's estimates and that federal aid of 50 per cent be paid on the estimated cost, or the lowest bid figure and the county to pay the rest of the cost.

The commissioners noted that the federal aid highway act stipulated that states desiring to avail themselves of federal funds for the secondary highway system should organize a second road division.

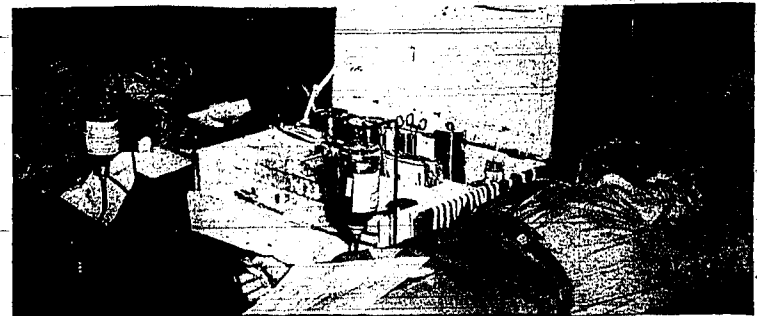
