Triple Penalty Established on Home Help

Use of a new law allowing sanctions against those who overcharge or connive in getting a veteran for a home care or VA loan, the veterans union repeats its warning that double penalties are being demanded "wide open" for participating in overcharges in connection with such loans.

The triple penalty is the first time, under new legislation, courts are authorized by assessing the veterans the amount of the overcharge, plus costs and attorney's fees, who discover they have been overcharged, may bring suit against the veteran, and sue for damages. 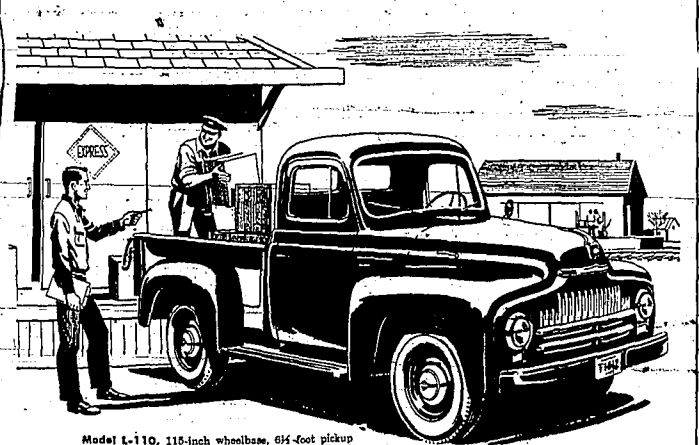

ORC Officers Seeking Duty May Transfer

Capt. Thomas W. Alton, ORC unit instructor here, has received word from Col. G. H. Bragg, chief of the Idaho military district, that certain categories of ORC officers may voluntarily transfer to the infantry, armor or artillery branches with concurrent recall to active military service. While no requirements are set for field grade armor or artillery officers, field grade infantry officers are subject to a quota announced by the department of the army. Officers eligible are limited to lieutenants with or without prior combat armor experience since Dec. 7, 1941, in the arm to which transfer is requested, and majors and lieutenant colonels with prior combat experience as officers since Dec. 7, 1941, who request transfer to the infantry.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10 (AP)—A 17,000,000 bushel drop in current crop forecasts, aided by a seven per cent decline in cotton prospects, has pushed expected all-crop farm volume this year down from the second largest on record to third place. Until the agriculture department's November crop report, experts had hoped for farm output topped only by the record-breaking production year of 1949.

While it would seem that the third largest all-crop production in history would be cause for great satisfaction, farm experts explain that demand for food and feed grains has kept close on the heels of farmers' big new production records. In some cases, demand will exceed production this year, and reserve supplies may be reduced to levels dangerously low in a period of national emergency.

The new crop figure—3,088,000,000 bushels—emphasizes this situation. Corn is a key annual feed crop and plays an important role in producing the nation's meat supply. Increased supplies of feed grains were needed this year to fill needs of record numbers of livestock on farms and ranches.

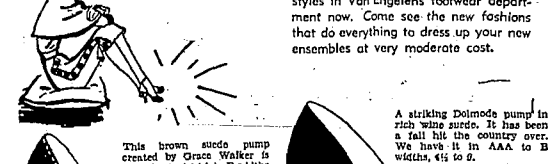

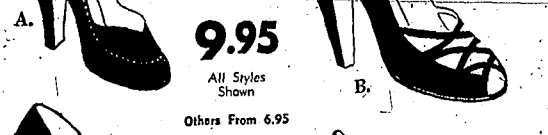

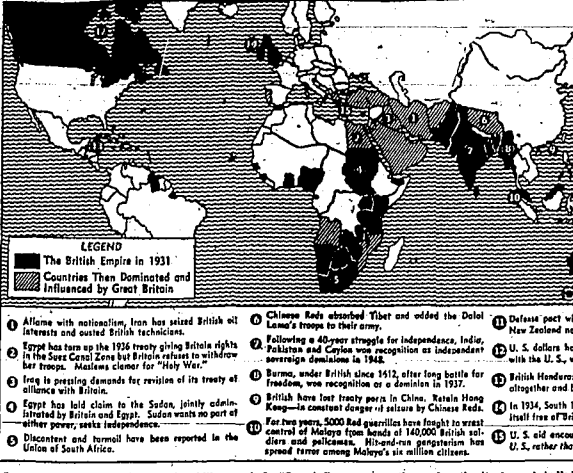
