



SECOND SAFETY CONFERENCE

Representatives from all parts of south central Idaho, as well as several state of-ficials, will gather in Twin Falls this coming Wednesday for the second annual Magic Vailey safety conference.

Because of the increasing amount of slaughter and destruction on our highways in spite of all our past efforts, this conference is faced, with a crow resonability.

To say that the highway death toll in Magic Valley is becoming our greatest problem in our armount of the word. It has become so scrious, in fact, that, many people hesitate to venture forth upon our highways unless it is absolutely necessary. We know of one man in Twin Falls who has given up driving allogother!

We do not presume to have the absolute solution to all this carnage resulting from reckless driving, carelessness, and outright defiance of our traffic laws. There are differences of opinion as to how the solution finally will be brought about.

But one thing we do know, and that is until all of our law enforcement authorities, prosecuting attorneys, judges, juries and any others playing any part in the prosecution of these potential killers, coopperate fullywith this valley-wide safety campaign, it will be more or less ineffective.

Lenience, talk about educating the public and penny-ante fines have no deterring effect whatsoever on those persistent maniacs who continue to imperil the lives of others.

There is only one thing that will stop tose steering wheel hoodiums—and that is fear

There is only one thing that will stop those steering wheel hoodlums—and that is fear of what will happen to them personally if they continue to diergard the traffic laws. Once they realize that conviction on traffic law violation will mean serious consequences—fines that really hurt, jail sontences and having their drivers' licenses revoked—there is a chance they might come to their senses.

During the year that has clapsed since our first valley-wide sately conference, much has been accomplished by all those who volunteered their support conscientiously.

EISENHOWER'S VISIT

General Eisenhower's return to the United States is his first since he formally took command of the North Atlantic pact army. It might easily pass as a very ordinary affair were it not for the fact that he is the key enigma in the 1982 presidential race.

Because he is, the political goothsayers are naving a field day. Some see it as the appointed hour for the general to make known his intentions. Some think this is a chance for him to bow out of his defense job to clear the road for 1982, Others believe President Truman himself is either curious about "Ike's" plans, or wants to assure him he is free to do as he chooses.

No one is likely to discover what Mr. Truman may say or not say on this score. But it is a pretty safe but the Elenhower has not selected this moment to retire from the NATO command nor to declare his presidential intentions.




