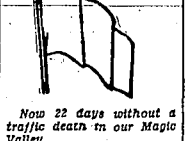

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13 (AP)—The federal civil service commission announced today that it will cut the number of appointments to the positions of junior scientist, physicist, chemist and metallurgist and engineer in various federal agencies in Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington. The positions pay \$3,410 to \$4,205 per year.

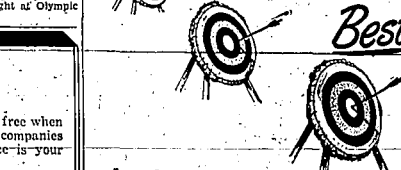

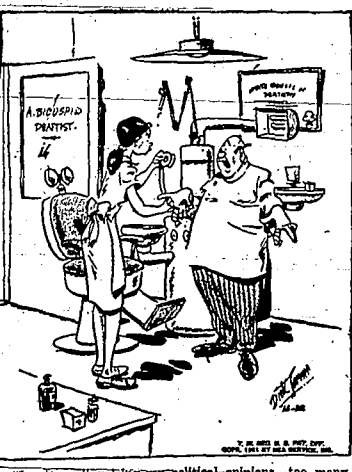

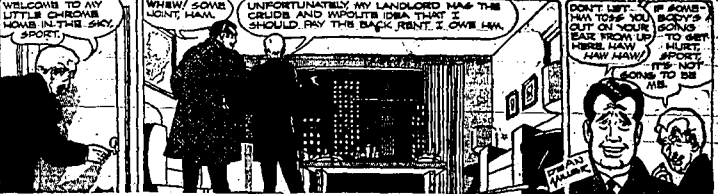

3. The bulk of the party officials remain uncommitted to any nomination candidate and still are undecided about Eisenhower's future political plans.
