Air Cruise Gives View of East Idaho Irrigation and Industry

Traveling far and fast like the legendary Paul Bunyan, Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce members got an air view Monday of irrigation projects stretching from Twin Falls to the site of the proposed Palisades dam, toured Idaho's immense phosphate deposits in southeastern Idaho and found out at close range how the phosphate shale and ore are processed.

To some of the 23 persons aboard the Empire Air Lines plane it was their first view of Idaho's panorama of valleys and mountains by air and an opportunity to see in a single flight the irrigation projects they previously visited on the ground. In addition, they heard running commentaries on the irrigation and phosphate industries which made the entire tour similar to a well produced movie.
