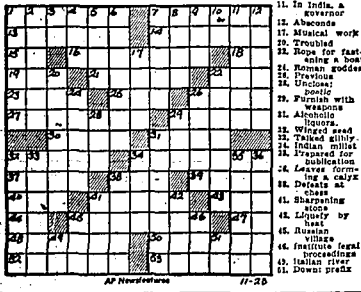

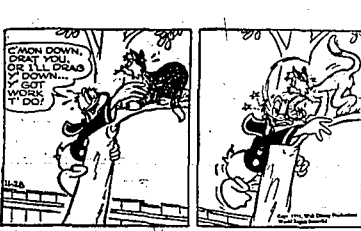

Ruling OK's Punchboard Levy Decree

BOISE, Nov. 23 (AP)—U. S. Commissioner of Internal Revenue J. B. Dumlup has ruled that each agent, clerk or other employe engaged in receiving punchboards is liable for the new federal occupation tax on wage-earning.

Internal Revenue Collector Calvin Wright received word of the ruling in a wire from Dumlup. Most operators believe this will force an end to punchboard operations in Idaho.

Dumlup said the agents or agents, as well as the owner or operator, must each purchase an annual stamp which costs \$2.24 for the period ending June 30, 1952. After that they must pay \$50 a year for the stamp.

Explanation Made For the purpose of determining liability for the occupational tax, it is considered immaterial that the receipt of a wage is merely incidental to the primary purpose for which the employe is hired, or that the employe's activities in this respect are only casual or sporadic.

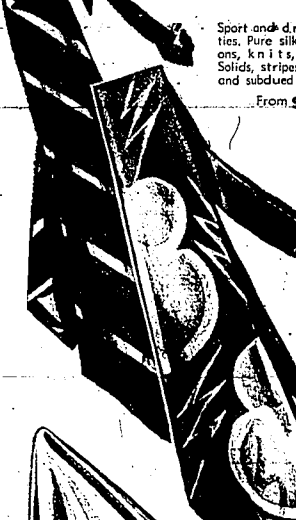

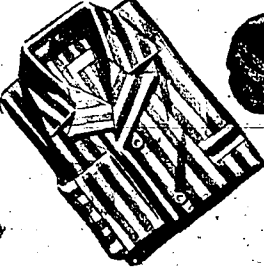

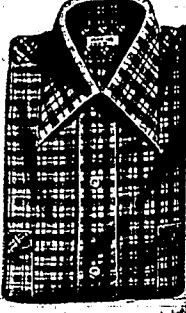
